

Print Entire Search Results as Desired by Admin.

Wish List Item: I want the ability for Admin to print the results of a contact or member search directly, just like the display on the screen, all of the results not limited to 50.

Example: This search yields 306 records. Currently Admin can only print 50 records directly using the internal print function (A).
