"The Capital of Dreams." Montgomery is Alabama's capital and birthplace of the modern Civil Rights Movement, including the 1955–56 Bus Boycott and 1965 Selma-to-Montgomery marches. Today, the revitalized downtown blends historic sites with contemporary attractions and cultural institutions.
