Festival Set Up/Clean Up Job Overview

Thank you for volunteering to be an Ogden Music Festival Volunteer! This guide will provide a simple outline of your role, responsibilities, and resources.

You will be expected to have the following items:

- Water Bottle
- Sturdy closed-toe shoes
- Pair of lightweight work gloves
- Appropriate attire for working outdoors in varying weather conditions
- Sunscreen and/or insect repellent
- Multi-purpose tool (aka Leatherman)
- Side cut pliers or anything that will cut zip ties
- Small pocket knife
- Small flashlight or headlamp

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Check in with the team lead (meet in the Main Stage seating area)
 - You will be teamed up with other volunteers to complete projects. Each team will have a lead person.
- There will be a team that will work with the Material Transportation Lead to shuttle festival supplies and equipment to/from the storage unit. Be prepared to go off-site if needed.
 - Storage Master 1780 W 1950 S, West Haven, UT 84401, Unit #6 in the north building.
- There will be multiple teams working to set up/tear down tents, tables, and chairs in various locations throughout the Fort.
- Assist team leads in placement and set up/tear down of generators and light towers.
- Will work with the sign crew to distribute/collect signs and sign frames throughout the Fort.
- Setting up/tearing down barricades, fencing, and traffic control devices.
- You may be asked to drive a golf cart or utility vehicle.
 - Drivers must complete a quick orientation before carts are to be driven on the Fort.
- You may be asked to use a 2-way radio; we ask that you use proper etiquette.
