



# Camp Rudolph Info Sheet

Important information for campers.

## Camp Code of Conduct

It should be understood that at a Christian Camp, Christian conduct shall govern all activities. The following are expectations of every camper. Failure to comply may result in dismissal from camp without refund. Parents are responsible for making their camper aware of the following:

1. Guys stay with guys, and girls stay with girls. Our facility use is based on God given gender.
2. Do not bring your cell phones - don't miss God's call because it won't be on your phone
3. Dress appropriately and not immodestly. Please see "Packing Together" in the "Be a prepared Camp Rudolph parent" document.
4. Respect and obey your leaders. They say good things that will help you stay safe and have a great time at camp. If something is wrong, please tell them.
5. Be sure to follow the Camp schedule and stay with your group. Wandering the grounds is not a good idea.
6. Substances and weapons (including pocket knives) are not allowed at all.
7. Don't be alone with anyone. Make sure you have a small group, as well as, an adult.
8. Bullying (repeated physical, emotional, or mental harassment) is not allowed. Touching others inappropriately is not allowed EVER.
9. Don't write on, take or break stuff! Respect each other's and Camp Rudolph's property!
10. Be sure to keep your mouth clean with good words and speak to others how you would want them to speak to you.

## Camp Rudolph is a Peanut & Tree-nut Free Facility

Please do not bring or send any candy, or food with nuts or processed in a facility that uses nuts for your camper.

## Canteen & Missions

Canteen (camp store) is where campers may purchase snacks, drinks and camp merchandise during their session. They are limited to 1 snack and 1 drink each time the canteen is open, so \$10 for 4 day sessions and \$20 for 6 day sessions will cover that. Any money over and above may be used to buy camp items or donate to the summer mission. Parents may add Store credit, give to missions or purchase camp items online for their camper at any time during the session in their online account.

## Basic Packing List

- ☐ Bible, notebook, stationery and pen
- ☐ Bedding ~ Twin size sheet set with blanket or sleeping bag & pillow
- ☐ Towels ~ for bathing & swimming
- ☐ Toiletry items
- ☐ Closed toe shoes, safest option for most activities, flip flops for the pool
- ☐ Casual clothes that can get dirty
- ☐ Modest swimwear
- ☐ Umbrella or poncho
- ☐ Sunscreen & insect repellent
- ☐ Flashlight
- ☐ Disposable or inexpensive camera
- ☐ Reusable water bottle

## The following are not permitted:

Cell phones or smart watches  
Electronic devices such as but not limited to ipods, ipads, mp3 players, hand held video games  
Drugs, alcohol, weapons or fireworks  
Immodest or inappropriate clothing

## Lost & Found

Please label your camper's belongings. Camp Rudolph is not responsible for lost or stolen items. The camp staff will hold lost and found items for 30 days after the session it is found. If unclaimed, it is donated or disposed of. If your camper loses an item please email or call the camp office with a description of the item and a plan for recovering it. If shipping is requested, parents are asked to cover the cost.

## Check-In Day

To allow the camp staff and volunteers uninterrupted preparation time, please **do not** arrive more than 30 minutes before the listed check-in time. We want everything to be ready for your camper!!

You will receive an email the week before camp with details about the process.

What to expect during check-in:

- ~ Any balance owed is due
- ~ Canteen (store credit) can be added
- ~ A copy of your camper's insurance card will be requested, if it is not already uploaded to the online system..
- ~ Camper cell phones **MUST** be turned in at the check in point to be kept in the office, or picked up by the parent or guardian on the way out.
- ~ A completed Camper Health Check form will be required. **(THIS IS A PRINTED FORM, NOT ONLINE)**
- ~ All medications, supplements, including essential oils will need to be turned in. All medications must be packaged in their original containers with the camper's name and instructions. Pill boxes or bags with pills **CANNOT** be accepted. Most of the above can be addressed in your online account to help check-in go more quickly. Once your child has checked in you may assist him or her to take their belongings inside the dorm and choose a bunk. You are invited to visit the Camp Merchandise table and Note writing station at the Cavalier Building.

## Camp Related Communication

Most communication that comes from camp will come via e-mail or text message. **PLEASE** be sure a parent's email and phone are listed as the primary on the camper's online account.

## End of Summer BASH

EVERYONE is invited to our annual End of Summer BASH!! This year it is August 2nd beginning at 10 am. This day is for every 2025 camper and family to come back to camp for one last day of camp fun this summer. We begin with a worship service led by the Expressions of Worship campers, a presentation of the missions project, a short service opportunity, followed by some good camp fun (possible water fun, inflatables, four square) and delicious food. It is FREE!

## Check-Out Day

For the safety of our campers, we require authorized persons to sign a check-out form before departure. IDs will be required of every individual who comes to pick up a camper, to ensure unauthorized persons are not picking up campers. Please list persons you authorize to pick-up your camper if you are unable, on the registration form or email the office.

Please wait until the check-out time to pick-up your camper, if at all possible. That way they don't miss anything. If you must pick-up your camper early, please notify the camp office so we can let the leaders know.

What to expect at check-out:

- ~ A parent or other authorized persons will present their ID and sign the check-out form
  - ~ You will receive a bag with a session recap letter from the dean, a camp group photo and other fun camp stuff
  - ~ Retrieve your camper's medications and phone
  - ~ Check the lost and found areas for any missing items.
- Once complete you may proceed to the dorm to find your camper and their belongings.

## Letters, Emails & Care packages

Every camper looks forward to receiving mail and packages from family and friends. When addressing mail, please include your camper's name and the session of camp they are attending. Send mail to: **Camp Rudolph 19320 Darling Drive Yale, VA 23897** You may send mail early to guarantee the camper will receive it. It will be held in the office until their session. You may also drop off mail at the Note Writing Station at the Cavalier building.

Free one way e-mails may be sent via your online registration account. Simply log in to your online account during your child's stay and check the dashboard for the One Way communication box. You may invite others to send e-mails also, by following the instructions on the site.

Camp Rudolph offers Care Package options for most 4 day and 6 day sessions. They are available for purchase as a subprogram in the online system. Each day your camper will receive a package of camp goodies and card personalized by you delivered during mail call. You may also send or bring packages the same as letters, please limit the amount of snacks or candies. They cannot be stored in camper luggage and may be collected to be stored in a safe location.
