RECOMMENDED OPTIONS

Meco Hotel

BEST USE: Best overall student-group possibility.

ESTIMATED COST: \$65-\$105 per person for one night; \$130-\$210 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Near North Station; about a 15-minute walk.

Modern capsule-style lodging with privacy shades, storage, fans, and outlets. Private pod rooms may help keep conference groups together and separated by gender.

HI Boston Hostel

BEST USE: Best-established downtown hostel.

ESTIMATED COST: \$70-\$110 per person for one night; \$140-\$220 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Near Boston Common; about a 15-minute walk.

A strong all-around option for college students. Dorm beds include privacy curtains and individual power outlets. Groups of eight or more generally need to work through group sales.

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Hotel Ivy Boston Common

BEST USE: Good hostel/hotel compromise.

ESTIMATED COST: \$70-\$110 per person for one night; \$140-\$220 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Near Boston Common; about a 15-minute walk.

Offers both private hotel rooms and a hostel-style option called The Quad. This may work well for students who want a central location without a traditional large dorm room.

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The Revolution Hotel

therevolutionhotel.com

BEST USE: Best per-person conventional hotel value.

ESTIMATED COST: \$60-\$90 per person for one night; \$120-\$180 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: South End; about 20-25 minutes walking or a short T/rideshare trip.

Dedicated triple and quad rooms can make the per-person price competitive with hostels. Some rooms use fully private, lockable bathrooms located in the hallway.



ADDITIONAL OPTIONS

Backpackers Hostel & Pub

backpackersboston.com

BEST USE: Cheaper overflow option.

ESTIMATED COST: \$50-\$80 per person for one night; \$100-\$160 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Everett; Orange Line from Wellington into downtown.

A credible lower-cost choice when downtown hostels are unavailable. Allow roughly 30-40 minutes door to door using the Orange Line and local connections.

Boston Homestel

hostelworld.com - search Boston Homestel

BEST USE: Lowest-cost basic fallback.

ESTIMATED COST: \$45-\$75 per person for one night; \$90-\$150 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Dorchester; Red Line into downtown.

Less polished and less convenient than the central options, but potentially the lowest nightly cost. Best treated as a backup when price is the primary concern.

Holiday Inn Express Boston-Cambridge

ihg.com - search Boston-Cambridge

BEST USE: Good conventional hotel for groups of four.

ESTIMATED COST: \$60-\$90 per person for one night; \$120-\$180 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Near Lechmere; Green Line toward downtown.

Useful for churches or campus groups that prefer a standard hotel. The cost estimate assumes four people sharing a two-queen room. Breakfast may reduce overall trip expenses.

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Club Quarters Hotel Faneuil Hall

clubquartershotels.com

BEST USE: Best close option for staff or speakers.

ESTIMATED COST: \$120-\$170 per person for one night; \$240-\$340 for two nights, before tax.

LOCATION: Approximately a 6-8-minute walk.

Not a student-budget option, but very convenient for staff, speakers, or older leaders who want a private room and an easy walk to Tremont Temple.

QUESTIONS TO ASK WHEN REQUESTING GROUP QUOTES

- What is the all-in rate, including taxes and required fees?
- Can rooms or dorms be separated by gender?
- What deposit is required, and when is final payment due?
- What are the cancellation and attrition terms?
- When will unused rooms be released back to the property?
- Is a complimentary leader room available after a certain number of paid beds or rooms?
- Is breakfast included, and are linens and towels provided?
- Can the property hold a block for Friday night only, with a smaller number staying Saturday night?

SUGGESTED NEXT STEP

Contact the top four options for a group quote covering Friday, October 2, with a smaller optional block for Saturday, October 3. Ask each property to hold the quote long enough for churches and campus groups to estimate their attendance.
