Presentation purpose:

Training to other groups of healthcare professionals.

skills to teach short, practical tools that can be used
at the bedside or in the boardroom to manage stress.

Learning objectives:

- 1 Demonstrate how short resiliency tools can be used on the job to mitigate stress and burnout.
- 2 Facilitate group discussions on job stress and resiliency skills.
- 3 Explain key resiliency concepts: plimsoll line, awareness, self-compassion, how values safeguard resilience, empathy vs. compassion, and how to cultivate positive emotions.
