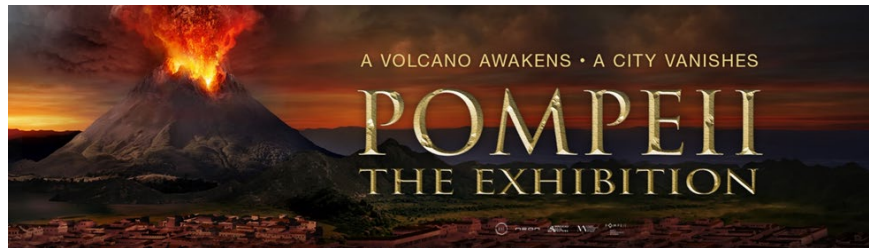


VISIT NORTHERN KENTUCKY/CINCINNATI

In the meantime, as you are making your plans to attend the meeting, you may want to consider coming early or stay a few days after to check out some of the sites and events in the area. Northern Kentucky and Cincinnati have so much to offer. You might want to visit some of the below attractions.

The Cincinnati Museum Center is a one-of-a-kind, multi-museum complex housed in Union Terminal, a historic Art Deco train station



and National Historic Landmark. The Museum Center's major offerings at Union Terminal include the Cincinnati History Museum, the Cincinnati History Library and Archives, The Children's Museum, the Museum of Natural History & Science and the Robert D. Lindner Family OMNIMAX® Theater. The Museum Center is the largest cultural institution in the city of Cincinnati. The Center's collection encompass more than 1.8 million artifacts, art works and archives and is incorporated into our exhibition, research and education programs.



Since its opening in 2004, the Freedom Center has shared stories of freedom's heroes from the era of the Underground Railroad to modern day. It is symbolically located on the banks of the Ohio River, where many enslaved people took their first steps on free soil after self-liberating through the Underground Railroad in the mid-1800s. The Freedom Center honors that legacy through immersive, thought-

provoking exhibits, programming and films to be a convener of dialogue around issues of freedom, the denial of freedom, systemic racism, implicit bias and modern-day enslavement. Guests are introduced to freedom conductors including Harriet Tubman, Frederick Douglass, Sojourner Truth, John Rankin, Abraham Lincoln, Henry Box Brown, Margaret Garner and the millions whose names have long been forgotten.



Experience the **Ark Encounter** that features a full-size Noah's Ark, built according to the dimensions given in the Bible. Spanning 510 feet long, 85 feet wide, and 51 feet high, this modern engineering marvel amazes visitors young and old. Ark Encounter is situated in beautiful Grant County in Williamstown, Kentucky, a short

30-to-45-minute drive right down I-75.

Or something close to Radisson meeting site, Just 15 minutes west of Cincinnati\Covington Airport is **The Creation Museum**.

This state-of-the-art Creation Museum allows you to venture through biblical history, stunning exhibits, botanical gardens, planetarium, zoo, zip line adventure course, and much more. This 75,000-square-foot facility has welcomed millions of guests since opening in Petersburg, Kentucky.
