Michael Acaldo began his role October 1, 2024, as National Chief Executive Officer of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul USA. He supports more than 90,000 Vincentian members in 4,000+ parish-based Conferences across the country, helping them to grow spiritually, serve the poor, and help people out of poverty.

A native of Baton Rouge, Michael received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management and his Master of Business Administration from

Louisiana State University.

He has been a member of the Vincentian Family since 1990 when he began serving as the CEO of the SVdP Diocesan Council of Baton Rouge. In his tenure in Baton Rouge, Michael led the St. Vincent de Paul Council to incredible growth. In 1991, he oversaw the founding of the Bishop Ott Shelter Program, which has since grown to five emergency shelters serving men, women, children, and families, and which provided more than 31,000 guest nights of shelter in 2023. In 1995, he helped establish the St. Vincent de Paul Community Pharmacy, the first SVdP Charitable Pharmacy in the nation. The Baton Rouge St. Vincent de Paul Dining Room served over 300,000 meals to neighbors in need in 2023. And if that weren't enough, he's also the creator, host, and executive producer of the SVdP Beacons of Light television show, which has been on the air since 2006.

Michael and Paula, his wife of 32 years, are the proud parents of adult twin daughters, and grandparents to their first granddaughter.

Steve Havemann is the Executive Director of St. Vincent de Paul of Des Moines, and President of Ask, Listen, Hear training and development. Through this work, Steve aims to help others think, and act, more positively and productively. This work resulted in the publication of his first book, "The Excellent Persuader," and has been instrumental in the growth of St. Vincent de Paul in Des Moines. Steve has served as an officer for the Beaverdale

Neighborhood Association, the Young Non-Profit Network, the Harvest Academy, and is a graduate of Leadership Iowa.

With a background that includes working with individuals with barriers to success, Steve has worked to grow St. Vincent de Paul by over 600% in his first five years, raising over \$3,500,000 for the charity, while expanding their reach to a second human services campus. Additionally, SVdP Des Moines now serves more than 33,000 individuals and has locally developed the Immersion Prisoner-Reentry Program, and the Back2Work Workforce Development program, the first two nationally replicated programs for St. Vincent de Paul. Steve serves as co-chair of each of these programs on a national level and is integral in their growth and expansion.

A native of Des Moines, he graduated from Central College with a degree in Communications and Political Science and earned his MSEd at Drake University. He loves spending time with his daughter, taking his daughter on adventures, golfing, tennis, writing, and landscaping. Steve believes that "Progress is not the advancement of technology, but rather the development and evolution of people."



BARB HOOPER
DISASTER SERVICES &
YOUTH, YOUNG ADULTS & EMERGING LEADERS

Barbara Hooper is from McEwen, Tennessee where she has been involved with the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Patrick Church in McEwen since 2006, first taking over as president from 2014 and again from 2022 to present.

She has built up a legacy of service in that time, becoming founder and director of the St. Vincent de Paul Youth Society, the first of its kind in the Diocese of Nashville, in 2015. In the last 10 years, she's continuously engaged middle school students of the parish and its sister St. Patrick School in projects that promote the Vincentian qualities of service,

spirituality, and friendship. These have included regular trips to the Humphreys County Nursing Home in Waverly to visit the sick, annual Trunk or Treats events in October to bring the community together, and even a recent "One Night Without a Home" in an effort to learn what it feels like to be homeless. They have also learned what it means to serve leaders of the community, including Bishop J. Mark Spalding of Nashville, at multiple dinners where they prepared and served the meal.

Along with the youth society, Hooper was paramount in providing relief efforts to the Waverly community when devastating floods hit in August 2021, which displaced hundreds of families and killed 20. This included providing emergency assistance and helping more than 100 families get back into their homes through the House in a Box program, buying various supplies for construction work, or providing general support.

As a result, she, along with the late Eddie Bozman, were recognized with the Society of St. Vincent de Paul's 2022 Disaster Services Corporation Emerging Leaders Award.

Hooper and her husband, Tommy, have been married for 53 years. Together, they share two sons, five grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

BISHOP J. MARK SPALDING, J.C.L. BISHOP, DIOCESE OF NASHVILLE

Bishop J. Mark Spalding, the oldest of three children, was born on January 13, 1965, in Lebanon, Kentucky, and was baptized at Holy Trinity Church in Fredericktown, Kentucky. His mother Mary Aileen Thompson grew up on a farm in Marion County and his father Joseph Lawrence Spalding was raised on a farm in Washington County. After their marriage, the Spalding's raised their children on a family farm in Washington County. Father Spalding

attended Fredericktown Elementary School and Bethlehem High School in Bardstown.

After graduating in 1983 from Bethlehem High School, Bishop Spalding attended college at Saint Meinrad Seminary, graduating with a bachelor's degree in history in 1987. He attended major seminary at the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium where he earned an M.A. and an S.T.B. in Religious Studies in 1990.

Bishop Spalding was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Louisville on August 3, 1991, by Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly, O.P. After ordination, he continued graduate studies at Louvain, earning his Licentiate in Canon Law in 1992. He returned to the Archdiocese in 1992 and served as associate pastor of the Basilica of St. Joseph Proto-Cathedral from 1992 to 1996. He was appointed part-time judge for the Metropolitan Tribunal in 1993, Adjutant Judicial Vicar in 1995, and Judicial Vicar and Director of the Metropolitan Tribunal from 1998 to 2011.

He was appointed the 12th Bishop of Nashville by Pope Francis on November 21, 2017. His episcopal ordination and installation as the Bishop of Nashville was on February 2, 2018.
