

The ARPA & NAGPRA Assistance Program: A Campaign to End Cultural Heritage Crime

The ARPA & NAGPRA Assistance Program is a collective of archaeologists and law enforcement allied with Tribes to protect cultural heritage. This program unites the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Cultural Resources Unit, the BIA Division of Environmental Services and Cultural Resources Management, and Archaeology Southwest, a nonprofit based in Arizona. Our team assists in investigating illegal excavation and vandalism of archaeological sites across Indian Country. We also combat the illegal trafficking of sacred cultural items and facilitate repatriations both domestically and internationally. We create educational materials for professionals and the public, offer specialized ARPA & NAGPRA trainings, and help protect cultural sites through restoration and monitoring. We work closely with Tribal leaders, Tribal Historical Preservation Offices (THPOs), State Historical Preservation Offices (SHPOs), and several law enforcement agencies. Our website, SaveHistory.org, provides educational content on Tribal heritage values and lets people report cultural crimes confidentially through a web form or tipline (1-833-ENDLOOT). In this presentation, we will share information about our work and the resources we can offer to Tribes interested in ending looting and vandalism.
