Report Subjects Include:

- **Child Recruitment** - Identify which recruitment efforts are producing results; refine tracking; quantify ROI; analyze staff productivity.
- **Attendance** - Understand reasons for absence; patterns across classrooms and centers; query casenotes; review progress on attendance plans.
- **OUCH Reports** - Track time patterns; sort types of incidents; map locations. If paper based, can scan and digitize.
- **Casenotes to Action** - Analyze casenotes and qualitative data across family services, health, attendance, etc. Assess quality of notetaking and follow-up.
- **Staff Stability & Wellness** - Understand staff absence, turnover, injuries, and well-being. Incorporate child behavioral incidents. Incorporate survey data.
- **Self-Assessment** - Data can include enrollment, waitlists, child outcomes, CLASS, family needs, health and safety, staff stability and wellness, fiscal, and monitoring.
