- Establish a program for prescribing naloxone to patients with SUD. Challenges and opportunities.
- Use the funding for the training of health care providers and pharmacists on the prescribing of naloxone.
- Use the funding for the purchase of naloxone for treatment or to be prescribed to patients.
- Use the funding to offset the co-payments and other cost sharing associated with naloxone.
- Establish protocols to connect patients who have experienced a drug overdose with outside entities providing MAT and counseling and behavioral therapies.

- Risk-reduction & De-escalation Training | Key elements and training agencies that specialize in preparing front-line staff to respond appropriately to high-risk situations, crisis, mental and SUD emergencies
- How can telehealth provide greater reach in rural communities for outreach and service delivery? What are the barriers and opportunities?

Tips & Tricks for Increased Funding & Leveraging Community Based Partnerships:

Limited capacity for expanding service delivery? Consider "bundling"; joint applications for federal funds that utilize the networks, resources, and outreach/service delivery of community-based non-profit organizations in partnership. This portion will cover how to partner with community-based non-profits to expand your outreach and service goals. How to write grants as a "pass through" for sub-awards. Monitoring, reporting, and tracking finance and project/program deliverables.
