



Youth Retreat - an encounter with God

During this Fall Youth Retreat the Dining Hall becomes an 'all-purpose' room. For meals it is our dining and fellowship area. There may be some activities held in there depending on the weather.

It also becomes our sanctuary during our four Chapel Services and other group gatherings. It becomes our place to worship through great music, hear God's Word, and respond from our hearts.

Chairs upon which we sit for lunch become an altar where we receive spiritual nourishment from God.

Let us honor this transition of space. Meals are normal meal time. When we meet for our chapel times let us consider this space sacred. Don't bring snacks and drinks at these times. Keep the chairs as quiet as possible. Let us make in this place an atmosphere of worship and reverence as we come before Almighty God.

What Should I Bring To Youth Retreat?

- *Excellent Attitude
- *If you have not preregistered, bring your money and all forms signed by your parents
- *Bedding: (sheets, blankets, sleeping bag, pillow)
- *Personal Items: (toothbrush, soap, shampoo, etc.)
- *Towel and wash cloth
- *Bible, Notebooks, Pens, Pencils
- *Required Medications: (Must be given to & kept with the nurse.)
- *Appropriate clothing and jacket (it might be cool or rainy)
- *Clothes for games
- *Money to spend at the SNACK SHACK!
- *Sports equipment, such as softball gloves, bats, football, Frisbee, etc. (and skateboard)

What Should I NOT Bring?

- *anything of great value as there is no place to lock things up (such as electronic equipment, jewelry, more money than needed for the Snack Shack, etc.)
- *any sort of weapons including guns, large knives, etc.
- *any sort of explosives or fireworks
- *any sort of tobacco, ecigarettes, alcoholic beverages, illicit drugs, contraband, etc.

CELL PHONE POLICY – We encourage cell phones to be left at home. If they are brought, the camp is not responsible for loss or damage. All cell phones are to be **TURNED OFF** during services, activities and at lights out time until morning.

We encourage you to bring your needs and concerns, come as you are spiritually and emotionally, as this is a place where God and God's people meet needs in our lives.
