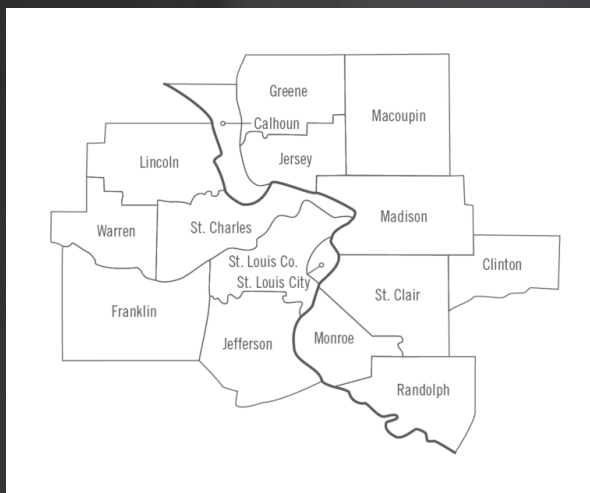

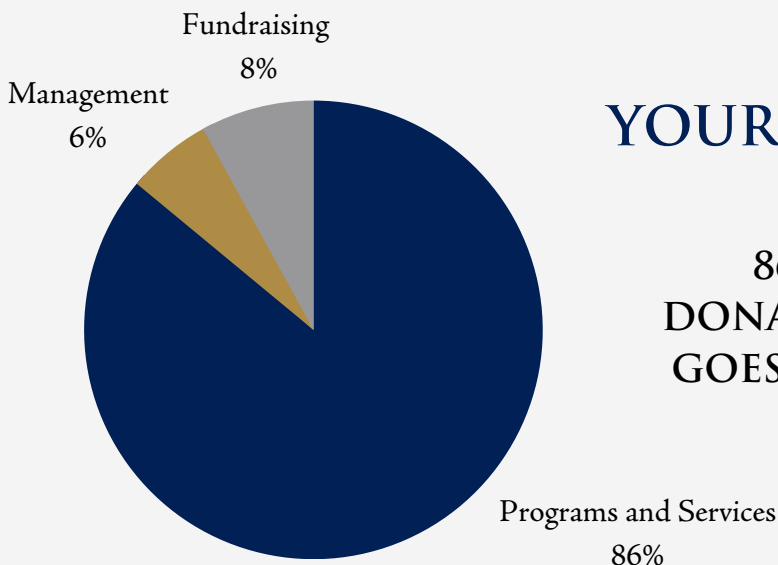

24,200 INDIVIDUALS SERVED BY EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES



Out of 3,695 individuals who had been impacted by a local disaster (flooding, government shutdown, etc.) and needed immediate or long-term recovery services, 3,695 were assisted. This is 100% of the target goal.

Of 24,200 individuals needing increased resources for coordinating humanitarian aid resulting from hazards and natural disasters, 24,200 received this. This is 100% of the target goal.

MEREDITH'S STORY

Due to domestic violence, Meredith and her young child were forced onto the streets. Having to leave home in a rush, they left their possessions behind and found themselves homeless. Meredith contacted The Salvation Army and explained the situation that she was in. She was running out of money and running out of hope. Within 24 hours, The Salvation Army provided emergency shelter accommodation at Family Haven.

In FY2022, The Salvation Army provided 9,457 nights of accommodation at Family Haven.

Over 22,00 nights of emergency shelter accommodation was provided in the Greater St. Louis Area.

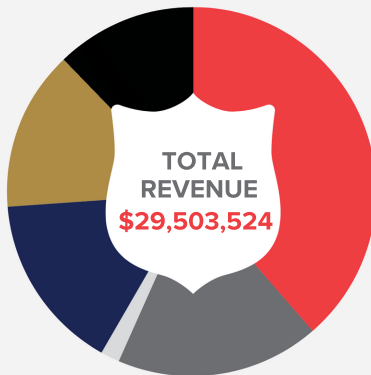

REVENUE & EXPENSES



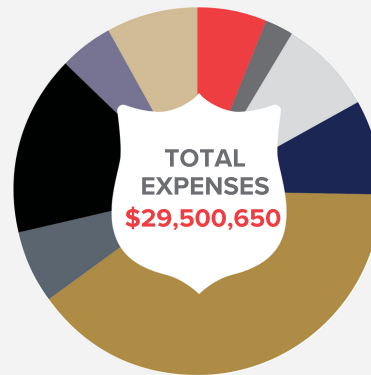
