Admission Agreement

The Salvation Army welcomes you to the Medical Respite program. Our goal is to ensure a safe and dignified environment as you recover. We appreciate your awareness and cooperation with the following guidelines, allowing us to provide a positive recuperative experience.

Please note all residents have the right to be treated with respect and dignity by staff and other residents. If you have special needs or request, please ask your Case Manager who will coordinate your care during your stay.

- **Residency:** In order to coordinate care with the medical team, case manager, and health care providers, scheduled medications and supportive medical care, you are required to remain on campus as you recuperate. Appointments with primary care physicians, behavioral health, physical therapy, other health care providers or supportive services will be coordinated and scheduled with your case manager.
- **Admission:** Upon admission, you will be required to take a shower (if capable) and will be provided with clean scrubs to wear, while your clothes are being laundered. You will be asked to submit to a drug screen and participate in the admission process. Your belongings will be searched at time of admission.
- **Attire:** Please dress appropriately when in the common areas of the unit. Sleepwear is not allowed outside your room. Proper undergarments are required.
- **Alcohol and Drugs:** The use of alcohol and/or illegal drugs is prohibited. It affects the safety of other residents, staff and yourself. If it is suspected that you are using alcohol or non-prescribed drugs, you will be asked to breathalyze and take a drug screen. Positive results may require transfer to substance abuse treatment or discharge from the program.
- **Violence:** To provide a safe and secure environment, any violence, threats of violence, inciting others, racial, ethnic or sexual harassment of others and vulgar language will not be tolerated. Weapons or sharp objects are not allowed in the building. You may be required to be searched.
- **Smoking:** For the health, safety and comfort of residents and staff, smoking is not allowed anywhere in the building. There may be residents using oxygen in the unit and bedrooms. Smoking is only allowed in designated smoking areas. Lighters and matches will be held by the support specialist and will be provided upon request.
