Provides weekly worship services, youth, archery, adult, and senior programs. Provides emergency assistance (utilities, rent) for Grant County families and households facing economic challenges. Christmas Angel Tree provides toys, clothing, and food for over 600 children annually.

BEN MEDOWS MEMORIAL FOOD PANTRY

Provides food insecure families and households in Grant County with access to fresh, frozen, and shelf-stable food. Families are empowered with the opportunity of selection by selecting food that best suits their family eating habits. Partners with local groups and individuals to provide fresh food and healthy options for families.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources, referrals, and transportation for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center (Indianapolis) is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other treatment programs include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

Breaking the Cycle of Poverty

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.


YOUTH IMPACT

Community youth benefit from year-round program offerings. Character-building programs provide a positive, stimulating learning environment and a wide range of educational opportunities for children of all ages. The Archery Club/Team works with children and adults of all ages to promote mental focus, teamwork, and determination. In the summer, over 600 kids and senior adults from across Indiana travel to Hidden Falls Camp in Bedford, IN to participate in weekly themed programs, focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders on a local, regional, and national level. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments.
