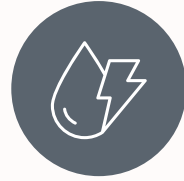

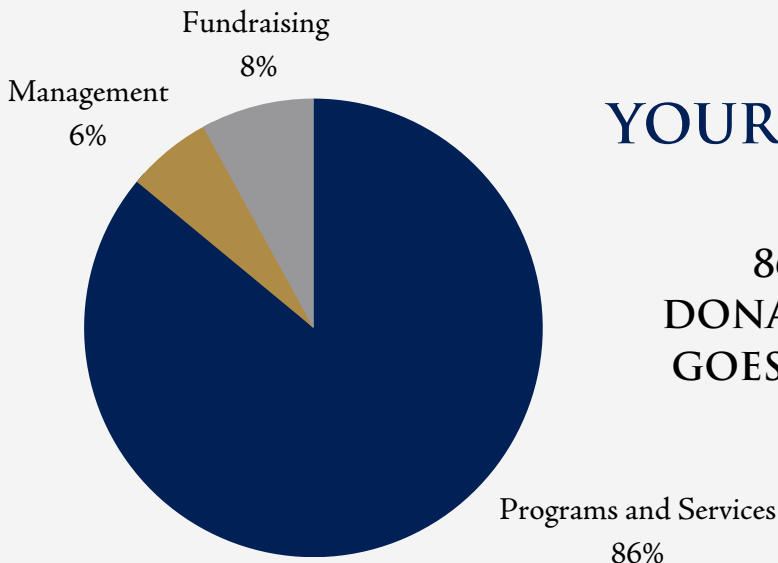

## 24,200 INDIVIDUALS SERVED BY EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES



Out of 3,695 individuals who had been impacted by a local disaster (flooding, government shutdown, etc.) and needed immediate or long-term recovery services, 3,695 were assisted. This is 100% of the target goal.

Of 24,200 individuals needing increased resources for coordinating humanitarian aid resulting from hazards and natural disasters, 24,200 received this. This is 100% of the target goal.

## MEREDITH'S STORY

Due to domestic violence, Meredith and her young child were forced onto the streets. Having to leave home in a rush, they left their possessions behind and found themselves homeless. Meredith contacted The Salvation Army and explained the situation that she was in. She was running out of money and running out of hope. Within 24 hours, The Salvation Army provided emergency shelter accommodation at Family Haven.

In FY2022, The Salvation Army provided 9,457 nights of accommodation at Family Haven.

Over 22,000 nights of emergency shelter accommodation was provided in the Greater St. Louis Area.

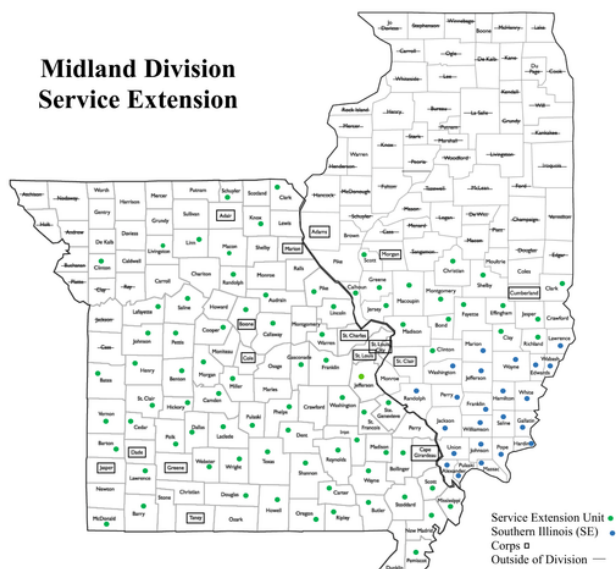
## GIVING SOCIETIES

# THE SALVATION ARMY SERVICE EXTENSION PROGRAM

## Midland Division Service Extension



The Service Extension program is a network of local volunteers who believe in the mission and the message of the Salvation Army and agree to represent the Army in their community. Through these volunteers, the Salvation Army’s mission is carried out every day all across the Midwest. Service Extension provides for emergency needs, such as food, clothing, emergency lodging, rent or utility assistance and other critical needs.

Midland Division has 159 Service extension units in 135 counties. Volunteers are dedicated to Doing the Most Good at Service Extension Units each day.

## A FOCUS ON JEFFERSON COUNTY SERVICE CENTER – ARNOLD, MISSOURI

The Jefferson County Service Center has served the local community since the mid 1980s. Formerly the Arnold Corps, the Jefferson County Service Center provides a wide range of services and support for the entire county.

The Service Center served 4,861 individuals in 2022, providing accommodation vouchers for 5,500 nights of shelter, 1,468 orders of groceries and essential household supplies and providing toys to 568 toys to children and their families.

## STORY FOCUS – DOING THE MOST GOOD

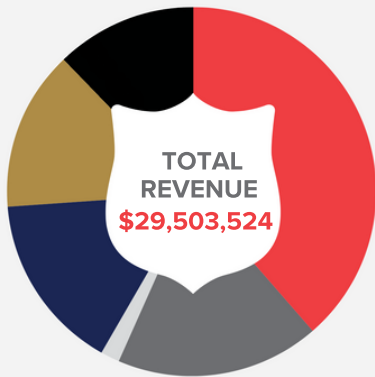
Linda and her family were facing a bleak and uncertain future after she lost her job unexpectedly. The sudden loss of income left them struggling to make ends meet, and their financial hardship began to take a toll on their well-being. It was during this challenging time that they turned to the Salvation Army Jefferson County Service Center for assistance.

The Salvation Army immediately embraced Linda and her family with open arms. They provided them with much-needed clothing to help them stay warm and presentable during interviews and job searches. Linda’s children, who had been worried about their next meal, were relieved when the Salvation Army offered them nutritious meals, ensuring they didn't go to bed hungry.

But the support didn't stop there. The Salvation Army also stepped in to assist with energy bills, alleviating some of the financial burden that had been causing stress and sleepless nights for Linda and her family. With their services, Linda was able to focus on her job search and regain a sense of hope.

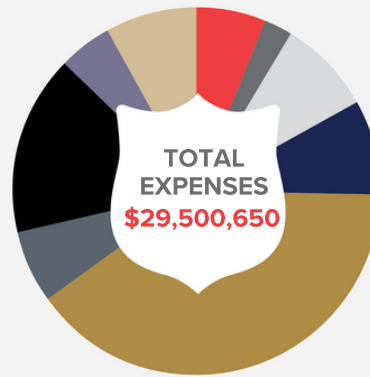
