Impact

The Salvation Army's Bed & Bread program provides food and shelter to Metro Detroiters every single day and night of the year, providing:

- Nearly 52,000 nights of shelter annually (51,599)
 - That's more than 140 nights of shelter each night.
- Nearly 1.7 million meals annually (1,681,019)
 - More than 4,600 meals each day (4,605)

Event Details

- The Salvation Army's 37th annual Bed & Bread Club Radiothon, hosted by 760 WJR, is an on-air 27-hour event to fight hunger and homelessness in metro Detroit. The goal is \$1.825 million.
- The event begins on Thursday, Feb. 22 at 4 p.m., shifting to a live broadcast at 5 a.m. on Friday, Feb. 23 from The Salvation Army Great Lakes Division Headquarters, located at 16130 Northland Dr. in Southfield. The live event concludes at 7 p.m. It will be livestreamed on Sametrodetroit.org, WJR.org and on our Facebook page @salmich.org.

Background

- Hunger and homelessness do not take a day off. The Bed & Bread trucks serve meals seven days a week, 365 days a year, alternating between sandwiches, stews and soups, and other hot meals. Salvation Army Bed & Bread meals are often the only nutrition some people receive each day.
- The Bed & Bread program meals are made at the Detroit Harbor Light kitchen and can accommodate up to 30 volunteers to assist in the food preparation process.

History

In January of 1988, The Salvation Army loaded an Emergency Disaster Services truck with 75 sandwiches, a pot of soup, and enough hot chocolate to warm the spirits of any friends in need they might encounter. The truck parked in an alley on the corner of Kercheval and St. Jean, and the Bed & Bread program was born. Just one month after the program's founding, Radio Hall of Famer Dick Purtan teamed up with his longtime producer Gene Taylor to begin the Radiothon to support the Bed & Bread program. Since then, because of donors like you, we've had a measurable impact in our community.
