Residents impacted by the Prospect Heights fire can visit this one-stop resource center in Northbrook.

CHICAGO – The Salvation Army, one of the largest direct providers of social services across Illinois, is partnering with other disaster response agencies, including The American Red Cross to set up a one-stop resource center for those impacted by the recent fire. This "one-stop shop" maximizes the use of joint resources and expedites the ability of organizations to provide services by eliminating the need for the participating organizations to set up separate assistance centers, and enabling coordination and information sharing between participating organizations. Residents will be able to meet with trained counselors for resources, obtain housing and insurance information, emotional and spiritual care, as well as other health and mental health services and other assistance from team representatives.
