



In addition to band and choir programs, some of The Salvation Army's music programs include:

Academy of Performance Arts (APA):

Sterling Middle School in Peoria, Illinois serves an area where one in three children live in poverty. Realizing the positive outcomes music instruction provides these students, the school collaborated with The Salvation Army to provide a supplemental, free afterschool music program for any student wanting to learn an instrument.

Operation Piano Player:

The Salvation Army provides affordable, quality piano lessons at local corps community centers, such as The Peoria Citadel, through Operation Piano Player. Students must be at least eight years old and have regular access to a piano for practice (which can be the corps piano).



A Life Changed for Good:
