Preparing for a new school year can be overwhelming for families already struggling to make ends meet. This summer, The Salvation Army stepped in to ease that burden by providing more than 130 students with brand-new backpacks filled with essential supplies, along with warm coats for the months ahead.

The inaugural Back-to-School Backpack Drive, held July 22 at The Salvation Army Chapel at Worthington Woods and hosted in partnership with the Central Ohio Echelon chapter, was more than a supply giveaway. Families enjoyed a festive afternoon with hot dogs, games, inflatables, and frozen custard courtesy of Whit's

"We know preparing students for the upcoming school year can be stressful for some families so we wanted to make it a fun event that everyone could enjoy," said Jacob Burke, the Central Ohio Echelon Chapter President. "Partnering ensured that the event would be a success."

For many children, the gift of a new backpack and supplies represents more than preparedness—it builds confidence, sets the tone for the year ahead, and reminds them they are supported by their community.

"Ensuring all students have the necessary tools helps level the playing field and create a more equitable learning environment," Burke said. "We hope these students feel more prepared and confident, which could positively impact their academic performance and self-esteem."

Behind the Red Shield, moments like these are made possible by volunteers and donors who show up with compassion and generosity. Echelon members exemplify this spirit by serving, fundraising, and building connections that strengthen Salvation Army services in Central Ohio.

Behind the Red Shield, volunteers are the hands and hearts that carry hope forward. And for more than two decades, the Overstreet Family has shown what it means to serve with dedication, joy, and love.

Each Christmas season, generous companies, churches, and community groups across Central Ohio hold toy drives for The Salvation Army's Angel Tree program. But before those toys can reach families, they must be collected, transported, and delivered to a central site for distribution. That's where the Overstreets step in.

What began years ago with toys piled into the family car has grown into a full operation. As donations increased, the Overstreets upgraded to a van, and today they load up a 20-foot U-Haul truck, often making multiple trips. In just one Christmas season, they drove more than 700 miles gathering toys for children in need.

Along the way, the Overstreets have built lasting relationships with donors and community partners. "People are happy to see us and will comment on how much the girls have grown since last year," shared Claudia Overstreet. "When my oldest daughter started helping she was 11-years-old and now she's a college graduate."
