A HELPING HAND IN THE MIDST OF DISASTER

Over the July Fourth weekend, severe flooding swept through Kerr County, leaving devastation in its wake. Families lost homes, memories, and a sense of safety. Within hours of the disaster, The Salvation Army was there.

Trained disaster workers, dedicated volunteers, and mobile feeding units were immediately dispatched to the heart of the crisis. In Kerrville, The Salvation Army's local center quickly transformed into a lifeline, becoming the central site for relief supplies, volunteer coordination, and community donations. At the request of city and county officials, we stepped in to lead both volunteer operations and donation management during those crucial first days.

It was more than logistics — it was about restoring dignity and offering comfort in the face of overwhelming loss and this immense tragedy.

Our priority was immediate emergency assistance to those affected: food, shelter, hydration, and emotional support. Our mobile kitchen served 24 hours a day, directly supporting flood survivors and first responders. Officers were deployed from across the state, including North Texas, to help bring hope to those most affected.

Every disaster brings more than physical destruction. There's an emotional toll of grief, fear, and uncertainty. That's why The Salvation Army's trained staff and volunteers in emotional & spiritual care were present from the start, listening, comforting, and praying with survivors who had lost so much.

We haven't stopped working to facilitate help to those impacted. Today, our focus has shifted from immediate response to long-term recovery. We're still walking alongside those whose lives were upended, helping them rebuild and offering a ministry of presence.

The road ahead will be long, but The Salvation Army will be there every step of the way.

PROVIDING RELIEF DURING EXTREME HEAT

This past summer, as rising temperatures again scorched North Texas, The Salvation Army stood as a refuge for those with nowhere else to turn. When the heat became dangerous — even deadly — our doors opened wide.

Across Dallas, Collin, Tarrant, and Ellis counties, our Corps Community Centers and Social Service Centers became lifesaving sanctuaries, offering cool air, cold water, and a moment of peace. For seniors on fixed incomes, parents with young children, and individuals experiencing poverty and homelessness, these spaces were more than a break from the sun.

They were a reminder that hope can always be found at The Salvation Army.

Beyond our shelters, mobile feeding units brought hydration and meals directly into the hottest parts of our communities, reaching those unable to come to us. At 13 locations, we gave out fans to

anyone in need. We also stepped in to help those struggling financially, offering utility assistance to families burdened by rising costs and lost wages. We helped keep the lights on and the AC running in homes that would've otherwise gone without.

The heat doesn't just make people uncomfortable. It puts lives at risk. That's why The Salvation Army responds, not only with shelter and water but also with compassion, dignity, and an open door.

In every season, our mission remains the same: to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.
