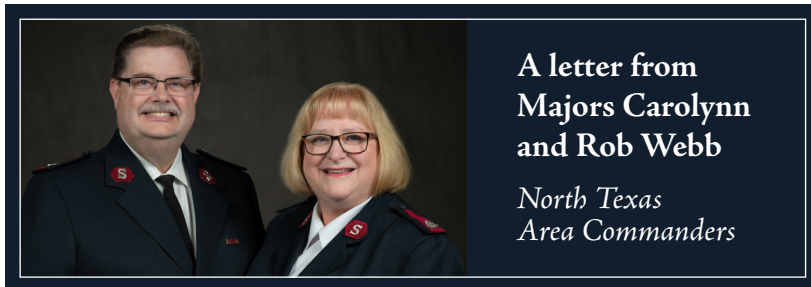

FINDING A WAY FORWARD: DORRIAN'S STORY

DORRIAN, A VETERAN AND SINGLE MOTHER OF THREE, was doing everything she could to keep her family afloat on her own when life took an unexpected turn.

When her elderly mother became seriously ill, Dorrian had to sell their family home to cover the cost of transitioning her into a long-term medical care facility. Around the same time, school closures and a family crisis caused Dorrian to lose her income.

With nowhere else to go, she and her children found themselves living in their car, facing each day with uncertainty and fear.

Still, Dorrian was determined to find a way forward. While researching resources in North Texas that assisted families

paycheck, and address the challenges that had led to her homelessness. As she took steps toward stability, our team connected her to The Salvation Army's Rapid Rehousing program, designed to help families and individuals transition from shelter into permanent housing.

Through the program, Dorrian and her children soon moved into a home they could call their own.

With continued case management and determination, Dorrian progressed quickly through the program, maintaining her housing and building a strong foundation for her family's future. Today, she is proud to share that she is fully self-sufficient: She is steadily employed, paying her rent on time, and no longer relying on food

experiencing homelessness, she came across The Salvation Army's Family Life Center in Arlington. Upon reaching out, she was immediately accepted into the program, and with the staff quickly moving, she and her children moved out of their car and into a private room — a moment that brought both relief and the chance to start again.


With the support of her dedicated case manager, Dorrian began rebuilding step by step. Support services provided by The Salvation Army helped her secure a new job, set aside savings from each


assistance. She now works for a local organization supporting women and donates items back to the Family Life Center for mothers facing a similar crisis to her own.


Dorrian's story mirrors so many families who enter our doors at The Salvation Army, seeking a pathway to reclaim their lives and rebuild their futures. We are dedicated to meeting human needs in His name without discrimination, no matter the circumstances, to break the cycles of poverty and homelessness across North Texas.

Thank you for your ongoing support as we continue to provide transformational services to North Texans who need to secure food, reestablish homes, and stabilize following the impacts of inflation, rising costs, and the pandemic.

With your help, The Salvation Army is providing aid at a time when North Texans are facing continued hardship:

 Our six shelters and senior living centers are housing **1,300 people** per night, operating at and well above capacity.

 Our 12 food pantries are feeding **10,000 people** per week.

 Our three recovery programs are treating **500 people** per week.

OVERNIGHT WARMING SHELTERS WINTER STORM RECAP

When winter temperatures drop across North Texas, the risk for families and individuals without shelter becomes immediate and dangerous. On the coldest nights of the season, The Salvation Army of North Texas activates emergency warming centers to provide a safe place to stay and protection from the elements.

During this year's winter storm, we activated warming shelters across Collin, Dallas, Denton, and Tarrant counties, serving nearly 1,700 individuals seeking refuge from the cold. As the largest provider of social services in North Texas, The Salvation Army is uniquely positioned to serve regardless of the weather, prepared to serve with warm food and drinks, blankets, cots, and emotional and spiritual care both during the day and overnight.

To open and operate a warming shelter for a single day costs The Salvation Army an additional \$7,000 per location on top of what it already takes to keep these locations operating year-round.

During major winter storms, the need grows quickly. In January, The Salvation Army served 20% more people than on an average day, increasing the demand for food, utilities, staffing, and emergency support.

Moments like these are a reminder that for many of our neighbors, winter is not just a season — it's a time of heightened uncertainty. With community support, The Salvation Army can continue to meet human needs across North Texas, ensuring families and individuals have a warm, safe place to go when temperatures fall and the need is greatest.

In February, we teamed up with our longtime corporate partner Energy Transfer to host a volunteer day at the Carr P. Collins Social Service Center food pantry, raising awareness of food insecurity and the ways in which we can combat hunger in North Texas. Since 2012, Energy Transfer has donated more than \$2 million to The Salvation Army of North Texas, and its most recent donation will fund fuel for six box trucks that allow us to operate 12 food pantries and other crucial initiatives.

North Texas has the third-highest number of people facing food insecurity in the nation at 15.7%. To commemorate Energy Transfer's generous donation and partnership, Energy Transfer employees participated in a volunteer day at Carr P. Collins, which recently switched to a choice food pantry model. As we continue the fight to alleviate hunger in North Texas, we are thankful for partners such as Energy Transfer that make it that much easier.
