CELEBRATING IN HARMONY AT THE CITADEL PERFORMANCE & GRADUATION FOR THE SUMMER MUSIC CAMP

The theme for the 4th Annual Summer Music Camp was "Harmony." "It is a musical theme, but it's also about collaboration," says Corps Sergeant Major Aurora Apuan. "Campers learn music theory and performance, but they also learn how to work together in musical ensembles."

After four weeks of intense music study, all eyes were on the graduating students. This was the goal they've been working towards: performing at the Music Celebration at the Citadel Corps. On July 10, 2022, the students performed seven special selections as a choir, brass band, and handbell ensemble.

Majors Floiran and Eloisa Estrada presided over the graduation ceremony. All music campers were presented with their graduation certificates and medals. The top student in each of the four disciplines (music theory, brass band, choir, and handbells) was awarded a trophy for outstanding performance. Jazmyn Zuniga, Ahtziri Rivera, Julian Gonzalez, and Zeanney Zuniga were the trophy winners this summer.

This Music Celebration wasn't all about the campers, however; other musicians also had their chance to shine. Music teachers Hugo Hernandez, Brisa Serrano, and Jessica Porter performed inspiring solos, and assistant teacher Christopher Martinez also played a trumpet solo. Everyone was invited to celebrate together with the Praise & Worship team with "Asi Como David Danzaba" and "Sing, Sing, Sing" – perfect choices for the occasion. Besides accompanying Sunday worship, Citadel Brass also performed special selection "Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee."

for Agustin Sandoval in the first ever mariachi trumpet masterclass given at the International Trumpet Guild in 2022. He plays principal trumpet for the UTEP Symphony Band and 3rd trumpet for Jazz Ensemble II. He recently had the opportunity to perform with the El Paso Symphony.

He is grateful to The Salvation Army for the opportunity to teach brass band for the second year in a row and looks forward to returning to teach in the future.

Marching Along: The Salvation Army Citadel Brass Continues Army Tradition

The Citadel Brass band rehearses every week in preparation for the Sunday worship service. Every Sunday, Citadel Brass plays preliminary music, accompanies congregational singing, and performs a different selection for the offering.

Their favorite song to perform is the upbeat march "I'll Go in the Strength of the Lord," which they traditionally play at the end of the service.

The brass band is a staple of The Salvation Army Citadel Corps. This six-member ensemble can be seen every Christmas season playing carols at the Red Kettle at Sam's Club. All members are active soldiers who volunteer to support the work of the Army throughout the year.

Citadel Brass is the advanced band at the Corps, but there is also a beginner band that rehearses every week under the instruction of Bandmaster Hector Martinez. They are the next generation of Salvation Army musicians in the borderland.
