The Salvation Army in Corpus Christi will provide bottled water to residents of the Center of Hope shelter. Families and individuals will receive bottled water during their meals and will be encouraged to take water with them so that they can have it during the day. Drinking water is crucial during hot weather to prevent dehydration, which can lead to various health issues.

Bottled water will also be available for individuals that come to The Salvation Army Center of Hope to receive food boxes and other services.

We will be purchasing 2-3 pallets of water each month. You are welcome to donate to our water fund to provide this water for people in need.



Society...
A Circle of Leaders

The Salvation Army of the Coastal Bend is celebrating a donor giving organization called The William Booth Society on May 22, at The Salvation Army Community Center of Corpus Christi.

William Booth, the founder of The Salvation Army, opened the first center in the slums of London in 1865. It is now all over the world and millions of lives have been changed, but only because of people who support the work in their local community.

Membership in the William Booth Society is based on annual giving of a minimum of \$5,000 for a non-capital campaign gift. Based on our records of the calendar years of 2023-2024, 27 members qualified to be part of this inaugural group!

MEMBER OF THE WILLIAM BOOTH SOCIETY \$5,000

THE GEORGE SCOTT RAILTON CIRCLE \$10,000-\$24,999

Commissioner George Scott Railton and seven Lassies "invaded" New York in 1880 to launch the first work of The Salvation Army in the United States.

THE EVANGELINE BOOTH CIRCLE \$25,000-\$49,999

Evangeline Booth, dynamic daughter of William and Catherine, served as Commander of The Salvation Army in the United States, 1904–33, and was elected first woman General in 1934.

THE CATHERINE MUMFORD BOOTH CIRCLE \$50,000-\$99,000

Co-founder of The Salvation Army, fighter for women's rights, and moral crusader, the wife of William Booth became one of the most influential women in modern religious history.

THE FOUNDER'S CIRCLE \$100,000 AND MORE

William Booth, founder of The Salvation Army, turned the world's attention to the plight of the poor and changed the direction of Christianity.

COUNCILS

SUCCESS STORIES



Isabella found herself homeless on the streets of Corpus Christi. She experienced all kind of difficulties.

She found a safe place to stay at the Center of Hope Shelter. After two months at the shelter she has found employment, and sees life with hope of better days ahead. She has been able to save money to prepare herself to qualify for the Rapid Rehousing program.



Katie moved to her hometown in Corpus Christi with her 3 sons. Not having a place to stay she came to The Salvation Army for help.

The Salvation Army provided a family room, meals and case management. She was able to obtain ID's and employment allowing her to be selected for housing. She is excited about moving to her own home.



Jesse was released from the hospital with no place to go. He came to The Salvation Army seeking shelter.

He was accepted the same day he came to the single men's program. Today he has a safe place to sleep and has found employment allowing him to save enough money to qualify for a housing program. Jesse sees his future with hope to gain self-sufficiency.



Elizabeth lost her husband and her employment. She found herself living in her vehicle when she came to The Salvation Army.

The Center of Hope has been a good start for her providing a safe place and support. Today, she has a job allowing her to save money. She has qualified for the Rapid Rehousing program where eventually she will move into her own apartment.
