## Dear Friends,

Two years ago I build the Red Kettle Boxes that I am sharing with you. These boxes have saved time, money and stress with the LAC kettle program. The box has two compartments to hold two kettles, bells and aprons. One side holds a volunteer kettle with a combo lock on it. The other is for paid bell ringer with a key lock.

We used it in 84 locations last year and only one store ask us to keep it in the back room.

I bought the material and had a carpenter build them for 15.00 a box. I will send this to trade to see if the company that makes our kettles can manufacture these for us out of plastic.

## Advantage of kettle box.

- 1. Box is kept in the foyer of the store against the wall and it holds the kettle stand and sign.
- 2. Gives the paid ringer a place to lock up the kettle while at lunch and breaks and personal items as they ring.
- 3. Paid ringer does not waste time waiting on store to retrieve kettle from service desk.
- 4. Volunteer bell ringers do not need to be meet at the kettle as everything is in the box. Kettle, Bells and apron. Just give them the combo to the lock. Once they are done if the next shift is not on time all they have to do is lock up the kettle and supplies and leave.
