

ABOUT THE SALVATION ARMY

The Salvation Army operates 7.311 centers in communities across the United States. These include food distribution, disaster relief, rehabilitation centers, antihuman trafficking efforts, and a wealth of children's programs. Our work is funded through kettle donations, corporate contributions, and the sale of goods donated to our Salvation Army Family Stores. Eighty-two cents of every dollar we spend supports our various missions across the country. We are tax-exempt 501(c)(3)organization, and contributions are deductible for federal income tax purposes to the extent permitted under Section 170(b)(2) for corporations.





A CALL TO ARMS RELENTLESS COMPASSION

Throughout the year, The Salvation Army of the Virginia Peninsula works to address hunger, homelessness, and financial insecurity with the goal of creating a community that fosters wellbeing among its residents. Many families' needs change and increase from one season to the next, and The Salvation Army is there to walk hand-inhand with our clients through these storms.

Beyond Social Services programs, The Salvation Army prioritizes youth and family wellness. Seasonal programs provide assistance that is specific to the current need for local residents to include Easter programming, Summer Camp, Back-to-School, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Community Center and Ministry programs are held throughout the year and provide youth with character & skill building programs, music lessons, and physical activity and sports participation opportunities. Each program is intended to enhance the lives of our community members and spread hope and comfort.

At Easter, we serve low-income seniors and veterans with Easter baskets of household goods, hygiene products, and comfort items. The Salvation Army hosts children at Camp Rappahannock each summer to engage in fun activities and spiritual growth. In FY23, The Virginia Peninsula Corps provided 48 total days of camp to local children. The Back-to-School program provided 862 Peninsula children with back packs, school supplies, and hair cuts. At Christmas, The Salvation Army of the Virginia Peninsula's Angel Tree program served 2,843 people, providing toys, clothes, jackets, and other gifts.

We are calling on you to partner with us to ensure that Peninsula families have the things they need to build and maintain a healthy, happy, stable and sustainable life.

A CALL TO ARMS DISASTER RELIEF

When disaster strikes, The Salvation Army responds. Through hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding, and man-made disasters, The Salvation Army comes out to the aftermath to serve human needs. From the canteen, we come to distribute clean water, hot coffee, and food, offer comfort and compassion, and spread hope to those facing devastation and loss.

For nearly 20 years, The Salvation Army of the Virginia Peninsula's canteen has traveled far and wide responding to disasters in Texas, Florida, West Virginia and North Carolina, as well as tending to the needs of those closer to home when tragedy strikes.

Between disasters, the canteen is used locally to bring hot and prepared meals, hygiene products, and other necessities to homeless centers, shelters, and families in emergency lodging who have no access to food storage and preparation appliances.

In 2023, the mobile canteen served 10,103 people throughout the Virginia Peninsula. The canteen continues to be a crucial part of our efforts to fulfill the mission of The Salvation Army and Do the Most Good. After decades in service, we need your help to keep it on the road and continue spreading hope in the face of disaster.

How you can help:

<u>Make a donation</u>-- food donations are critical to local canteen operations. You can donate prepared meals once or on a recurring schedule to be distributed, or unprepared food donations can be used to prepare meals for distribution, and monetary donations are applied toward the purchase of food and water, and programs costs.

<u>Volunteer</u>-- Canteen volunteers maintain various roles. Some volunteers are on-call to respond to disasters, while others drive the canteen, serve meals from the canteen, or prepare food for distribution.
