#### Wellcare Helps The Salvation Army Roll Out New Donation Truck

The Salvation Army, in partnership with Wellcare, the Medicare brand of Centene Corporation (NYSE: CNC), is excited to announce the addition of a new donation truck to its fleet, serving The Salvation Army Family Thrift Store, supported by a \$25,000 contribution from Wellcare.

"Having a reliable truck is crucial to ensuring those donations reach us," said Myriam Guerrero, advisory board chair. "We are very grateful to Wellcare for making this possible."

The new truck will cover an average of 240 miles weekly, collecting and delivering donated goods across the Sun City. These donated items are sold at the Family Thrift Store.

Proceeds from the sale of these donated items will directly fund life-changing programs of The Salvation Army. Just 17% of the revenue is needed to cover overhead, which means 83 cents of every dollar spent at the store helps El Pasoans in need.

The Salvation Army Family Store accepts a variety of donations, but we do ask that donations be in good condition, functional, and able to pass state health inspection.

Donations may be dropped off at The Family Store, located at 3920 Morehead. The Salvation Army Family Store will pick up furniture and other large donations free of charge.
