

## **Recipe Corner**

#### **Donut Bundt Cake**

#### INGREDIENTS For the Cake:

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

11/2 cups granulated sugar

4 large eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

3½ cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon cinnamon

1 cup low fat buttermilk



2 teaspoons baking powder ½ teaspoon baking soda ½ teaspoon nutmeg

1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted, for brushing

#### **INGREDIENTS** For the Glaze

1½ cups powdered sugar3 tablespoons

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 12 cup Bundt pan generously baking spray. Set aside. In a large bowl beat softened butter and granulated sugar on medium high speed until smooth, pale and fluffy, about 2 minutes. Scrape down the sides of the bowl, then beat in eggs, one at a time. Beat in vanilla extract. In a separate large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, salt, baking soda, cinnamon and nutmeg until combined. Stir into butter mixture in three additions, alternating with buttermilk and beginning and ending with flour, until a smooth, thick batter forms. Pour and spread batter into prepared Bundt pan; tap a few times on the counter to release any air bubbles. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes or until the edges of the cake are golden-brown and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool the cake in the pan for 15 minutes, then carefully invert onto a cooling rack. Use a pastry brush to brush the melted butter over the cake. Cool completely.

#### **DIRECTIONS For the Glaze:**

In a medium bowl, whisk together the powdered sugar and milk until a smooth, drippy glaze forms. Use a pasty brush to brush icing all over the cake. Allow to cool completely before slicing, about 15 minutes.
