PROVIDING LUNCH AT A DAY SHELTER





On Monday, May 20th, staff of The Salvation Army of the Coastal Bend visited Petronila Elementary School to distribute emergency food boxes to those affected by the severe weather.

Many residents were left without power and faced property damage, making access to food and basic necessities a challenge. Each food box contained nonperishable staples such as canned goods, pasta, rice, peanut butter, and bottled water-providing immediate relief for families beginning the recovery process. Seventy food boxes were given on that day. "We understand that even a short storm can leave lasting challenges," said Jonathan Gonzalez, Public Relations Coordinator for The Salvation Army. "Our goal is to make sure no family feels forgotten during tough times."

Petronila Elementary staff helped coordinate the event, ensuring supplies reached those who needed them most. The collaboration between school staff and The Salvation Army staff demonstrated the power of community support.
