



2014 Har-Tru USTA Pro Circuit Wild Card Challenge

WOMEN'S FACT SHEET

Details:	<p>Through an arrangement with the French Tennis Federation, the USTA will be awarding one (1) women's singles main draw wild card to the 2014 Roland Garros. The wild card will be awarded to the American player with the highest total of cumulative singles main draw WTA ranking points from the events listed below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Players' best two (2) singles results from the three events will be used and combined to calculate the point total. • In the event of a tie, the player with the best WTA singles ranking in the published WTA rankings of Monday, May 5, 2014 will be awarded the wild card. • Players must compete in the singles event of at least one of the three events listed below to be considered for the wild card. • Should the player with the highest total of cumulative singles WTA points become a Direct Acceptance into Roland Garros, the American player with the next-highest cumulative total of singles WTA points will be awarded the wild card. • In the event that issues arise that are not covered by these rules, USTA Player Development will be the final arbiter. 		
Eligibility:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Players who are USA passport holders and are eligible to represent the United States in Fed Cup competition in 2014 are eligible to be considered for the singles main draw wild card. • The minimum age for eligibility is 14. There is no maximum age restriction.
