The TMI for Ten and Under tennis is really getting off to a good start. As Tucson is a new Market, we have really been in the exploration process for the first few months of the program. However, with that said, we have already had some great success.

Four new Kids Tennis Clubs have been started at Canyon View Elementary, Sunrise Elementary, Manzanita Elementary and Ventana Vista.

These are after school kids tennis clubs that are on site at the schools. Jared Isaacman and David Flores are the newly hired coaches for the Catalina Foothills schools. I am sure they will do a great job for them as they both have scads of experience!! And the good news is that the program is fully sustainable without any funding from the grant!! We are currently working with Jon Davis and Serena Quarelli with the Tucson Community Tennis Program in helping them to grow their projects into after school kids clubs as well. This is a very exciting project as the schools TCTP works with do not have many of the assets as some of the other more affluent schools. More details on which schools and what is happening with that to follow.

Thirdly, we are working on getting area clubs joining in to have a rotating Play Day for ten and under kids. For those of you not familiar with what a USTA Play Day looks like, it is an event designed to introduce kids to competition in a low-pressure setting where the results are not documented. It can be a great format for novice and experienced kids to play and work on skills but also experience fun and social aspects of tennis. Ten and Under is all about getting kids playing early so they can quickly experience how much fun tennis is!!! The new kids sized equipment and format is really making a difference!

Southwest Section Wheelchair Tennis

Summit: Sue Kroeger, SAZ Board Secretary, also chairs the USTA Southwest Section Wheelchair Tennis Committee. The Southwest Section has identified the growth of wheelchair tennis as one of its priorities. The biggest challenge is Phoenix. With a population over 3 million, there is virtually nothing happening relative to wheelchair tennis. Sue, with support from section staff is hosting a "Wheelchair Tennis Summit" in conjunction with the November annual meeting. Wheelchair Tennis players from Albuquerque, El Paso, Flagstaff, Tucson, and Phoenix along with key adaptive sports professionals in the Phoenix metro area and District TSR's will convene to develop an action plan that each district can replicate.

Fab-U-Life Desert Classic Moving Up:

Tucson's annual wheelchair tennis tournament, the Fab-U-Life Desert Classic is now an ITF 2. We hope that the more competitive ranking will draw even more players to Tucson. Now in mid-March, the Fab-U-Life Desert Classic will be in line with the spring wheelchair tennis circuit, increasing incentive for international players to attend!
