Asian American Scholar Athlete Leadership Grant

The objectives of the **Asian American Scholar Athlete Leadership Grant** are to:

1. Honor the achievements of Asian American tennis pioneers who paved the way for millions who followed.
2. Reward players who work to excel in leading others on and off the court.
3. Widen the net of opportunities to young Asian American players who aspire to excellence in competitive tennis.
4. Assure the careful nurturing of young players who may be candidates for USTA Player Development Programs, and may have the ability to achieve national or international rankings.
5. Demonstrate the USTA resolve and commitment to multicultural participation in tennis.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Asian American Scholar Athlete Leadership Grant

Grant funding is based on a number of factors including the success level of the player in the previous year (e.g., end of the year USTA ranking list/performance) and **recommendations/commentary about the individual's team spirit and leadership qualities**. The grant funding is intended to be granted to junior player(s) aspiring to achieve national and/or international rankings. The recipient(s) must be actively training and competing in tournaments in the award year. **TWO GRANTS ARE AWARDED per year, one male and one female, in the amount of \$1,000 each, for actual and necessary training expenses.***

GRANT REQUIREMENTS:

- For consideration the player must be:
 1. A United States Citizen
 2. Of Asian American decent*
 3. Ranked in the **Top 300** at the national (i.e., USTA) level, in his/her age category, or ranked in the **Top 50** on the Section level, or player must have an ITF, ATP / WTA Ranking.
- The **players' grade point average must be 3.0** or higher
- One copy of **official high school transcript** (or home school transcript) must be attached to the application.
- Input from members of the USTA Player Development Section staff will be sought.
- Two letters of recommendation about the player's leadership ability are required.
- Players must be in high school between the ages of 13-18 years old.
- Brief, type-written essay by the player, stating how they have been inspired by an Asian American tennis player.
- A recent photograph of the player must be attached to the application.
