

#### **Edina Girls Tennis Honored With Minnesota Milestone Award**

The Edina High School Girls Tennis Program in Edina, Minn., was honored with the Minnesota Milestone Award as Minnesota's most inspiring and influential student-athletes, coaches and athletic leaders were recognized at an award ceremony on Wednesday, Feb. 4, at the Minnesota History Center in St. Paul, in conjunction with the 29th Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Day – a nationwide celebration recognizing the accomplishments of individuals in the promotion and advancement of girls' and women's sports. Some amazing facts about the Edina Girls Tennis Program:

- They won their 18th consecutive and 33rd overall title (including the three Edina East won when there were two Edina high schools) in 2014.
- Edina's 18 straight titles, under the leadership of Steve Paulson, are a national record.
- None of the members of the team were alive in 1996, the last season Edina failed to win the Minnesota state girls team title.
- Edina's 18 consecutive state championships is the nation's longest streak for girls' tennis in history, and among all U.S. high school sports, it ranks 24th.

- Althea Gibson Leadership Grant: This grant is for competitive junior tennis players who have a top 100 national
  ranking and are aspiring to achieve a national and/or international ranking. The player must be training and
  competing in tournaments year-round and have a history of strong national tournament results. You must be
  ranked in the top 300 nationally and in the Top 50 of the Section. Two grants awarded nationwide for \$2,500 each.
- Okechi Womeodu Scholar Athlete Grant: Rewards players who work to excel as much in the classroom as in sports. Must be training and competing in tournaments year-round, have a history of strong national tournament results and a minimum GPA of 3.0. You must be ranked in the top 300 nationally and the top 50 of the Section. Two grants awarded nationwide for \$5,000 each
- Pancho Gonzalez Scholar-Athlete Grant: Must be on Latino or Hispanic heritage, but be a United States Citizen. Based on a number of factors including the success of the player in the previous year (e.g., end-of-the-year USTA rankings, performance in national and international tournaments, etc.) and recommendations/commentary about the individual's team spirit and leadership qualities. The grant funding is intended to be awarded to junior player(s) aspiring to achieve a national and/or international ranking. The recipient(s) should have a history of strong national tournament results. You must be ranked in the top 300 nationally and the top 50 in the Section.
- Asian-American Scholar-Athlete Leadership Grants: In honor of the achievements of Asian-American tennis pioneers who paved the way for millions who followed, we look to reward a player (s) who work to excel in leading

- others both on and off the court. The recipients (s) must be training and competing in tournaments year-round. You must be ranked in the top 300 nationally and in the top 50 of the Section.
- Lesbian, Gay. Bi-Sexual, Trangender (LGBT) Scholar-Athlete Leadership Grant: In honor of the achievements of LGBT tennis pioneers who paved the way for millions who followed, we look to reward a players (s) who work to excel in leading others both on and off the court. The recipients (s) must be training and competing in tournaments year-round. You must be ranked in the top 300 nationally and the top 50 of the Section.
- Native American Scholar Athlete Leadership Grant: In honor of the achievements of Native American tennis pioneers who paved the way for millions who followed, we look to reward a player (s) who work to excel in leading others both on and off the court.
