Online Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) MSN Program

To qualify for our online MSN program, you must:

- Hold a current, unencumbered RN license
- · Hold a BSN from an accredited college or university with a 3.0 GPA or higher
- Have completed an undergraduate-level statistics course with a "C" or higher

Note: Must have at least one year of full-time work experience as an RN prior to registration in the clinical or specialty courses.

Admission Requirements:

- A completed graduate application
- · Resume or curriculum vitae
- Goal statement (2-3 pages)
 - Clearly articulate why you are pursuing the Psychiatric-Mental Health NP
 - · Your professional plans and career goals
 - · Why you wish to study at Duquesne
 - Past experiences as they relate to the Psychiatric-Mental Health NP and advancing your career
 - Accomplishments you have had in nursing (professional organization membership or positions, awards, scholarships, nominations, certifications, committee/project work, scholarly publications, other accomplishments or abilities)
 - Any special circumstances applicable to your background and professional history
- Two professional references (one academic and one professional in a supervisory role)
- Official transcript(s)

Expand on your graduate-level nursing education and earn a Post-Master's Certificate (PMC) in Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. Help to meet the demand for nurse practitioners to care for patients with mental health disorders and those dealing with substance abuse.

To qualify for our online post-master's certificate program, you must:

- Hold a BSN and MSN from an accredited college or university with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Hold a current, unencumbered RN license
- Complete an undergraduate-level statistics course with a "C" or higher
