Italian Spanish German Dutch Germany's largest retail chains are also some of the largest retail chains in the world. That is according to the annual Global Powers of Retailing report prepared by consultancy Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu. This is not taking into account the report's overview: The German retail industry has 17 companies on the Deloitte list of the world's top 250 retailers. The 17 German retailers account for 9.6% of the revenue of the world's top 250 retailers. Germany is part of the Big Three of the European economy along with the United Kingdom and France. Below are the top five German-based retail chains that were ranked as among the top 250 retail chains in the world, in terms of revenue. It is worth noting that the 2018 Global Powers report is based on the revenue figures for fiscal year 2016. It also includes income growth from the previous five years. The German company Schwarz Group ranks as the fourth largest retailer in the world based on revenue in 2016. Retail operator revenue grew at an annualized rate of 7.3% between 2011 and 2016. Next up is the Aldi Group, which ranks eighth out of 250. The chain's revenue grew by 7.7% in the five years leading up to 2016. The third is Metro Ag, which occupies the sixteenth of 250 and operates in 30 countries. Fourth is Edeka Group, with the ranking of nineteenth supermarkets and income growth at an annual rate of 2.5% in the five years after 2011. Quinto is the German supermarket Rewe Group, ranks twenty-second in the 2016. The chain's revenue grew by 7.7% in the five years leading up to 2016. Despite the strong presence of German retailers on the global list, there are few German retail brands that is recognizable to the average American, with one notable exception. Supermarket chain Aldi has taken the American food retail industry for assault. As there are few German retail brands in the United States, there are relatively few U.S. retail brands doing business in Germany. Examples of U.S. retail chains in Germany include: NikeMichael Kors Tommy HilfigerAbercrombie & Fitch As is the case in most global markets, the largest retail presence in the United States comes from American restaurant chains. The largest restaurant chains operating in Germany are: Burger KingSubwayMcDonald'sPizza HutStarbucksSubway One American retail brand that is notably absent from the German retail scene is Walmart, which tried to set up a store in Germany, but ended up closing all its stores there. Germany is one of the few markets where Walmart has shown that there is not too big to fail. The German retail industry is undergoing drastic changes in the retail sale of brick and mortar due to changes in consumers. Entire chains and retail segments are disappearing in part due to declining consumer demand and partly due to consumer preferences for buying goods in different ways. As in the United States, music stores, bookstores, and consumer electronics stores are fighting and de-spreading the business. In addition, in line with the U.S. retail industry, department stores in Germany are struggling to remain relevant and profitable. Profitable. Great retail disruptor for all these bankruptcy retail segments is the Internet. And while a shift to online shopping doesn't have to mean the death of a retail company, unfortunately for many German retail companies it does. Still, the industry experienced record growth in 2017 thanks to high employment and rising wages. A big trend driving the industry is the fact that many young people are moving from the countryside to urban areas. Internet and mail order companies boosted growth last year. Year.
