HEALTH & WELLNESS EVENT GEARED AT 1 OCTOBER SURVIVORS

LAS VEGAS – On Tuesday, October 1, the VegasStrong Resiliency Center will support survivors in their healing process by bringing various organizations together to offer physical and mental health resources, legal and financial information, and more to help survivors.

This free event provides anyone impacted by 1 October, including victims' family members, first responders, law enforcement and community members, an opportunity to learn valuable information. Topics include legal information as it relates to issues arising from 1 October (employment, housing, disability and more), financial wellness (budgeting and money management basics), behavioral health techniques, finding the right therapy, journaling, Victims of Crime program questions and more.

Participating partners include Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada, America First Credit Union, UNLV's The Practice and School of Medicine, Center for Mind, Body Medicine and will also feature acoustic music from Thrillbilly Delux.

With the growing number of mass shooting tragedies, the Resiliency Center continues to see an increase in people impacted by 1 October seeking help. Since opening on October 23, 2017, the Resiliency Center has served more than 10,000 people.
