As Brisbane prepares to host its first AFL Grand Final outside Victoria, one of its favourite sons, Lions legend Michael Voss, will join Seven's star-studded football team for Saturday's blockbuster decider between competition heavyweights Richmond and Geelong. Only has a better football pedigree than Voss. Now a senior assistant coach with Port Adelaide, the 1996 Brownlow medallist is one of the greatest finals players of all time, captaining the Lions to their 2001-03 three-peat major. Seven's Grand Final weekend action begins on Thursday night at 8.30pm AEDT with The Front Bar Grand Final Edition, when Mick Molloy, Sam Pang and Andy Maher will welcome tamu khusus termasuk CEO AFL Gillon McLachlan, Leigh Leigh Carlton/Adelaide great Eddie Betts, master jaffle-maker Saverio and Anthony Rocca, along with event favourites Ryan 'Fitzy' Fitzgerald and Andy Lee. Then's focus shifts back to the AFL Grand Final when Adam Cooney and Cam Luke settle on The Armchair Experts sofa at 11.30pm AEDT on Friday to deliver a unique 2020 major decision, before the traditional AFL Finals Marathon revives some of the great finals of the past. The first bounce has been scheduled for 6.30pm AEST in Brisbane - i.e. 7.30pm AEDT in Melbourne and Sydney, 7.30pm ACDT in Adelaide and 4.30pm AWST on Perth broadcast. Channel 7 will begin after the Cox Plate, with preview performances from 4.30pm AEDT before pre-match entertainment. Line-ups across Australia will take the stage before the game, with DMA's, Wolfmother's Andrew Stockdale, Cub Sport and Electric Fields featuring Thelma Plum and Busby Marou taking the stage. Mike Brady will also perform Up There Cazaly from the MCG, accompanied by the Queensland Symphony Orchestra live at the Gabba. And in the first AFL, Sheppard will perform under lights during an extended half-time break. For the first time in history, the AFL grand final will alienate the traditional red Sherrin for the yellow variant. Slightly different balls will be familiar to players, however, with the majority of home-and-away matches and finals this year taking place at night. Richmond are currently listed as \$1.84 favourites to back-to-back, with Geelong out at \$2.05 to win their first flag since 2011. Tigers star Dustin Martin has backed it to \$4.50 to win what will be his third Norm Smith Medal as the best on the ground in the AFL grand final. Geelong Brownlow medallist Patrick Dangerfield is next in the \$6 rankings, with Richmond duo Bachar Houli and Dion Prestia (both \$13) trailing behind. Coleman medallist Tom Hawkins, Cats teammate Mitch Duncan and Tigers skipper Trent Cotchin are \$15 fans. The AFL may just escape heavy rain, with the Bureau of Meteorology predicting a slight (30 per cent) chance of showers in the afternoon and evening. There is a chance of thunderstorms at night but overall the chance of rainfall is only up to one millimetre. That's in stark contrast to the forecast of 10-15mm for Sunday, when thunderstorms are likely and the chance of rain is high. I'm afraid not. Only 30,000 are up for grabs and they don't last long, even with relatively high starting prices. The last batch of tickets was released for sale on Thursday afternoon.
