Amenities include portable restrooms at all sites and wi-fi at select sites. RV's allowed at some sites. Must be in City of LA with operational vehicle, valid driver's license, and name not listed on National Sex Offender Registry.

Population served varies by site (women, veterans, youth, etc.).
