Bookmark the permalink. AMC 10 and AMC 12 are 25 questions, 75 minutes, multiple choice exams in high school mathematics designed to promote the development and improvement of problem solving skills. AMC 10 is designed for students in the 10th grade and below, and covers the high school curriculum for 10th graders and up to 10th grade. Students under 10 years of age and under 17.5 can take AMC 10 on the day of the contest. AMC 12 covers the entire high school curriculum, including trigonometry, advanced algebra, and advanced geometry, except calculation. Students under 12 years of age and under 19.5 can take AMC 12 on the day of the contest. These competitions will be held throughout Japan on Thursday, February 4, 2021 and Wednesday, February 10, 2021. AMC 10/12 provides opportunities for high school students to develop positive attitudes toward analytical thinking and mathematics that can support their future careers. AMC 10/12 is the first event in a series of competitions leading up to the International Mathematics Olympiad (see Invitational Competition). AMC 10/12 is also available in French, Spanish, large print and Braille. Both the A and B versions of AMC 10 and AMC 12 have the same number of questions, the same scoring, and the same rules for management. The only difference is the date of the competition, and each version has a clear set of questions, two exams are designed equally Distributing topics. Schools can order one or both versions of the test as long as they pay the appropriate registration fee for each competition day and purchase a competition bundle for each date. AMC 10/12 Student Preparation These resources will help students prepare for the types of questions that can be found in the AMC 10/12 exam. AMC 10/12 Q FAQs What materials are covered in AMC 10 and 12? A. AMC 10 usually covers mathematics related to grades 9 and 10. AMC 10 assumes knowledge of the number of first generations. Basic geometric knowledge including Pythagorean theorem, area and volume formula. Ethnology; Excluded are trigonometry, advanced algebra, and advanced geometry. AMC 12 covers the entire high school math curriculum, including the above, tri-triangular, advanced algebra, and advanced geometry, but calculation is excluded. Q. Who is eligible to receive AMC 10 and AMC 12? Students under 12 years of age and under 19.5 can take AMC 12 on the day of the contest. Q. Who causes the competition? A. The AMC 10/12 protocol should be done by a teacher (preferably a math teacher) or a school administrator. Responsible adults such as math college teachers, or math club coaches and librarians. Competition procedures must be carried out in public buildings (schools, libraries, universities, churches, etc.). The proctor should not be associated with any of the participants. Q. When will the official scores and reports for AMC 10 and 12 be released? A. It will take about three weeks from the date of the competition to win and report the AMC 10 and AMC 12 answer forms. The results are included in the AMC Toolkit: Electronically Sent Competition Manager Results and Resources links. The AMC office will email the result link as soon as the answer form is scored. If you have not received the results of the digital report by e-mail from the AMC program within 30 days of the competition schedule, please contact the AMC to confirm that the response form has actually been received. AMC Toolkit: Competition Manager results and resources are emailed to the Competition Manager. The e-mail can be viewed on the registration form that is used to order the competition. Q. How do I request a rescore for an answer form? A. Use the AMC 10/12 rescore request form to request a rescore. There will be a charge of USD 35 for each participant's answer form. The official answer is displayed in black in the answer form. All participant response forms returned for grading will be recycled 80 days after the date of the AMC 10/12 competition. Q. Can I order more bundles even if I already have a school registered on AMC 10/12? A. Yes, use the AMC 10/12 additional bundle form. Orders for additional bundles of AMC 10/12 A and AMC 10/12 B will be accepted until January 17, 2020. In addition, orders for additional bundles for agencies in Canada, Alaska, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands will be accepted until January 15, 2020. Q. Can students take both competitions? A. Yes, as long as the student is eligible to participate in the appropriate competition. That is, 10th grade or less, it is possible to take both AMC10A and AMC10B, such as AMC12A and AMC12B, 11th grade or 12th grade can take AMC12A and AMC12B. However, to do this, the school must register for both the date of each competition and the order bundle. Q. What happens if the school registers on one date and later wants to change the registration to the other date? A. You may be confused, so you may not want to change the date, but under certain circumstances you are allowed to change the date. If the competition materials have not been shipped and time is allowed according to the registration schedule, the school may pay a change in registration fee (with bundle changes) to reseed the contest. If you need to change the date to make changes quickly, you will need to pay an additional fee with your credit card. To process this change, amcinfo@maa an email to E-mail.org. Change.
