February 2016 - Safety Tip of The Month

Bicycle riders must obey all traffic laws (including stopping at stop signs) when riding on our roads. Bicycle riders must yield to pedestrians on sidewalks. When approaching a pedestrian, please give them plenty of audio notice and slow down before passing. Due to our narrow streets and no center striping, when vehicle drivers are approaching a bicyclist and another vehicle is coming from the other direction, drivers must stay in their lane since the other vehicle has the right of way. Once the other car has passed, then carefully pass the bicyclist giving at least 3' leeway. It's the law and common courtesy.

VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association Inc. Late Payment Policy

DEFINITIONS

- A "delinquent account" is one which is more than 30 days overdue.
- Late payment fees for delinquent accounts are assessed quarterly at \$25 or 5% of the delinquent assessment, whichever is larger
- Interest on delinquent accounts will be computed using an interest rate not to exceed the highest rate allowed by Florida law as computed from the date the delinquency first occurs (currently 18% per annum)
- Suspension of the use of common areas and facilities (including automatic gate access) will be applied to accounts which are more than 90 days past due
- An "account in collection" is one which is in the hands of the Association's attorney. An account in collection will incur legal fees as well as late payment fees and interest

VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association may, as a courtesy, remind owners that their account is delinquent. However, VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association reserves the right to turn over delinquent accounts to the VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association attorney at any time.

VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association will suspend the use of common areas and facilities (including automatic gate access, the use of the Town Center, sports and fitness facilities) when an account is more than 90 days past due.

Owners who are unable to pay their assessments should promptly speak with the Town Manager to explore establishing an informal payment plan. The Town Manager, with the consent of the Treasurer, may agree to spread the payment of delinquent accounts over several months. If the terms of an informal payment plan are not honored, the delinquent account will be turned over to the VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association attorney. An account in collection cannot negotiate a payment plan with the Town Manager.

VillageWalk of Bonita Springs Home Owners' Association reserves the right to take action other than set out above should the Association, in its sole discretion, deem such action necessary.

New Gatehouse System

In the next few weeks the HOA will be mailing out a one-time PIN code that the residents will use to activate their address on the new software at the gatehouse. Along with the PIN code, detailed information and instructions will be provided on how to use the new system. When the date of the conversion is determined the HOA will do an email blast and post the details in the Post Office.

Registering Guests for Community Access
