The release was Ora's first album since Ora in 2012. Ora announced the album on September 18, 2018 and was available for pre-booking on the same day. The album spawned three in ten UK singles including Your Song, Anywhere and Let You Love Me, as well as the top forty single Girls. Phoenix also includes two types of collaboration from other projects, including Lonely Together from Avicii's last release Of The Newspaper (01) (2017) and For You (Fifty Shades Freed) by Liam Payne, taken from Fifty Shades Released: Original Motion Picture Soundtrack (2018). The album received generally favorable reviews from music critics. Phoenix charted the top twenty in the UK, Ireland, Australia and New Zealand among other countries. Ora supported the album with two concert tours – The Girls Tour (2018) and the Phoenix World Tour (2019-2020). In December 2015, Ora initiated legal action against Roc Nation in an effort to release the label from the registration label and stating that the contract signed in 2008 was unenforceable because of california's seven-year rule. The complaint says that she was only allowed to release one album despite the creation of several additional recordings for release and that her relationship with Roc Nation was irrevocably damaged. [4] [5] In January 2016, Roc Nation filed a counterclaim against Ora for breach of the registration agreement. [6] They reached an agreement in May 2016. [7] In June 2016, it was confirmed that Ora had signed a global record agreement with the Atlantic Record in the UK. Soon after, she started working on her second studio album. In an interview with Billboard Radio China, Ora said about the process: I had a bit of an issue in public, with the exit of the music that got me really, really, kind of ruined, and I was really down, and then I was really angry, and then I was really frustrated, and then I was really happy, and then I was really happy that it was happening. [9] Framing up on what fans would expect from the album, Ora said: everything was these emotions, so my album is definitely a rollercoaster of emotions. [...] [...] still crazy – like I still love to go and party. Anyone who knows me knows that I like to have a good time, but I wanted this album too [something] you could put on and a vibe with friends. There are many dunes and tosses, but I am very, very proud of it. [9] Music and Lyrics Anywhere was produced by Swedish DJ Alesso (left) and goes on to reach number two on the UK Singles Chart, while Ora featured on Avicii's single Lonely Together, DJ's last release before his death in 2018. Phoenix is an uptempo dance pops[2] and pop record, which was recorded from 2016 to 2018. [1] It contains a mixture of genres, including R&A B-inspired vocals,[1] EDM-lite beats[2] as well as electronic anthems such as Lonely Together, Ora's joint collaboration with Avicii, Anywhere and Rudimental Collaboration, Summer Love. [1] It also contains cylinder and bass musical elements. [11] Ora vocals of The Guardian's Tara Joshi were described as both wispy and mighty,[2] and NME Hannah Mylrea as distinctive. [11] Anywhere produced Alesso and Sir Nolan, which the Independent described as a smoky EDM banger[12] and Mylrea (NME) as a piece of electropop. Critics noted that it has several bridges and gritty drops. [12] Meanwhile, on the mid-tempo song Let You Love Me, Ora explores the emotional barrier with lyrics that include I wish I could make you love me/ Say what's the issue with me?. [12] Your song is a minimalist production that consists largely of drum pads. [12] The song New Look takes a different direction; this is a Scandi-pop and tropical song produced by Swedish outfit Jack & Coke. [13] [11] Its production sounds like it is playing on a radio with an irregular signal. [12] The album features a number of collaborative activities, including Keep Talking, which features Julia Mihaita, and Joshi described it as both intriguing and euphoric. [2] Another collaboration, Girls, features rapper Cardi B and American artists Bebe Rexha and Charli XCX. It was described as AllMusic's Neil Yeung as a bold statement and a shameless, sex-positive anthem for the 21st century. [1] Critics like Joshi (Guardian) noted that it was an ode to bisexuality. [2] The album's themes include love and especially struggling or heat relationships, as seen in songs Falling to Pieces, First Time High and Only Want You.[13][14] with the latter also being released as a one and spawning remix by American rapper 6lack. Falling to Pieces features a trumpet interlude after each chorus and closes out the track with a trumpet outro. [14] Padin Malvika of Clash noted that First Time High has a windy sound that leaves you feeling happier and lighter, while Only Want You was noted for its electro production. [11] On the end of the album Velvet Rope and there are ballads that combine the effects of jazz and R&A B [10] Velvet Rope is a smooth, slowed-down R&A B A b edi for the scorned ex-lover left wondering how her relationship collapsed. The song features a stripped-back piano melody with a chorus backing singers. [15] With little contrast, Billboard's Sophie Ding said the song features soaring, multilayered melodies over deep reverbs as Ora sings about exploring new relationships. [16] The album also includes Ora's joint single with Liam Payne, For You, released in Fifty Shades Freed (2018), the third and final film popularizing the erotic romantic drama film fifty shades. Promoting and releasing Ora said that the album will be released sometime after March 2018. [9] [17] Then, during an interview with Glamour (Germany), she announced that it would now be released in autumn 2018. [18] On September 18, 2018, Ora revealed the title of her second studio album and its release date, on 23 November. The same day the album was available for pre-order. [quote required] In the eight days before the album was released, several songs were released, including: Velvet Rope on November 15, 2018,[15] Kashmir on November 19, 2018[16] and Falling to Pieces on November 21, 2018. [14] The single Your song was released on May 26, 2017 as the album's lead single. [20] [21] The song reached 7th place in the UK single chart, becoming Ora's ninth single to reach the top ten in the UK. Anywhere was released on October 20, 2017 as the second single on the album. The song reached number two in the UK. The girls, who include Cardi B, Bebe Rexha and Charli XCX, were released on May 11, 2018. [22] Ora performed the song live for the first time on the big weekend of BBC Radio 1 2017, one year before the official release. [23] On September 21, 2018, the album's fourth single ... Reaching peak number four, it made Ora the first British female solo artist with thirteen ten songs in the UK. [24] The fifth and final single, Only Want You, was released on March 1, 2019 with American rapper 6lack. [25] Other songs Lonely together were released on August 11, 2017 as a joint single by Avicĭe EP Newspaper (01). The song reached number four on the UK Singles Chart. For You was released by Liam Payne on January 5, 2018 as the lead single from Fifty Shades released. The song reached eight places in the UK. [26] On November 14, 2018, Ora released the song Velvet Rope as the first promotional single from the album. This is the official lyric video was released the next day. On November 19, 2018, Kashmir was released as the album's second ad single. On November 21, 2018, the third and final ad single Falling to Pieces was released. According to a review by aggregator, Metacritic, which awards a normalized rating of 100 reviews from major critics, the album received a weighted score of 76 based on seven reviews, giving an overall favorable review.
