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WAKE FOREST VS. CLEMSON

THE MATCHUP

- Wake Forest concludes its five-game homestand on Saturday, October 6, as the Deacs play host to No. 4 Clemson.
- Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. and will be broadcast on ESPN. Beth Mowins, Anthony Becht and Rocky Boiman will call the action.
- Saturday's game can also be heard on the Wake Forest Sports Network. Stan Cotten and Lary Sorensen have the call with Dave Goren reporting from the sidelines.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- The Demon Deacons improved to 3-2 on the year following a 56-24 victory over Rice to close out nonconference play.
- Saturday's game will mark just the second time in BB&T Field history, and first since 1990, that Wake Forest has hosted two top-10 opponents in the same season.
- Greg Dortch was named ACC Receiver of the Week while Sam Hartman was tabbed as the league's Rookie of the Week. Dortch tied his school record with four touchdown receptions, all thrown by Hartman.
- The Demon Deacons had a pair of defensive scores as Essang Bassey had a 51-yard fumble recovery and Chuck Wade, Jr. had a 60-yard interception return for a score.

THE OPPOSITION & SERIES HISTORY

- Clemson enters the game ranked fourth in the country and 5-0 overall following a 27-23 victory over Syracuse last time out.
- Dabo Swinney is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Tigers, and has compiled a 106-30 record at the helm.
- Clemson leads the all-time series, 65-17-1, and have won the last nine meetings in the series.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Following five consecutive games at home, the Demon Deacons will have next Saturday off before returning to action.
- The Deacs will hit the road to take on Florida State on Saturday, October 20, nearly two months after the Demon Deacon's last road game.

Weekly Press Conference

Wake Forest's weekly press conference, sponsored by Carrabba's, begins each Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Rovere Room in the Miller Center on campus, beginning with selected players. Lunch will then be served and Dave Clawson will meet with the media at 12:00 p.m. in the Rovere Room followed by lunch with the print media in the Rovere Room. Any specific player requests must be made before noon on Monday. Quotes and video of the press conference will be posted on WakeForestSports.com.

ACC Weekly Teleconference

Dave Clawson participates in the ACC's weekly teleconference. The teleconference takes place each Wednesday, with Coach Clawson set to speak at 12:00 p.m. For the media access number, contact the ACC Media Relations Office or the Wake Forest Athletic Communications Office. The teleconference is archived online at theACC.com.

Covering Practice

Wake Forest typically conducts its practices on campus at the Doc Martin Practice Complex adjacent to the Pruitt Football Center. Please contact the Athletic Communications Office if you'd like to interview a coach or player at the conclusion of practice. Coach Clawson is available in person most days of the week and players are available Tuesday and Wednesday after practice.

The Dave Clawson Show

Coach Clawson's weekly radio show with the Voice of the Deacons, Stan Cotten, airs on the Wake Forest IMG Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com. The show will be held live on location at Bib's Downtown through Oct. 3 and held at the IMG College studios in downtown Winston-Salem for all remaining episodes.

BB&T FIELD 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- Wake Forest's BB&T Field will celebrate its 50th birthday in 2018. Opened in 1968 as Groves Stadium, the Demon Deacons have played 287 games and compiled a record of 129-157-4.
- BB&T Field has hosted two ACC Championship teams in the 1970 squad and the 2006 team.
- The first game was against NC State on Sept. 14, 1968. Wake Forest's first win at the stadium came on Oct. 26, 1968 with a 48-31 win over North Carolina.
- Wake Forest has gone undefeated at BB&T Field on two occasions, posting a 5-0 mark in 1979 and a 4-0 record in 1970. Three times Wake Forest has won five home games in a season: 1979, 2007 and 2008.
- Head coach Dave Clawson, with 14 home wins in his first four seasons, needs two victories in 2018 to become the second-winningest coach at BB&T Field.

DEACS EARN ACC, NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Greg Dortch and Sam Hartman each earned a pair of accolades on Oct. 1 following the Deacs' game against Rice.
- Dortch was named the ACC Receiver of the Week as well as being named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch list. Hartman was the ACC's Rookie of the Week as well as being a CFPA Honorable Mention for National Player of the Week.

HARTMAN'S HOT HAND

- Freshman QB Sam Hartman completed 15 of 17 pass attempts for 241 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions in the Sept. 29 win over Rice. Hartman was named the ACC Rookie of the Week for his performance against the Owls.
- After going 3-for-5 for 23 yards on Wake Forest's first drive of the game, Hartman completed each of his last 12 pass attempts vs. Rice and totaled 218 yards on those 12 attempts.
- Hartman's 12 consecutive completions ties the school record set by Riley Skinner (last 11 attempts of 2008 season, first attempt of 2009 season) and John Wolford vs. Gardner-Webb in 2014.
- Hartman posted a school record QB efficiency rating of 284.96 on Saturday. That is the highest rating ever by a Demon Deacon QB who completed 11 or more passes in a game. Hartman's 284.96 efficiency rating is the third-best turned in by an FBS quarterback this season.
- Hartman completed 88.2 percent of his passes, going 15 for 17. That is the highest percentage ever for a Wake Forest QB with 12 or more pass attempts in a game. Riley Skinner went 11 for 11 in the 2008 EagleBank Bowl win over Navy.
- Hartman has now led the Deacons to three victories, tying the school mark for wins by a true freshman quarterback. John Wolford won three games in 2014.

DORTCH TIES A RECORD, HIS OWN RECORD

- WR Greg Dortch tied his own school record by catching four touchdown passes against Rice. His scores came on receptions of 54, 10, 38 and 4 yards.
- Dortch set the school record initially with four TD catches against Louisville in 2017.
- The redshirt sophomore finished the game with 11 receptions for 163 yards. It marks his fourth career game with 10 or more receptions and his fifth career 100-yard receiving game. Dortch finished the game with 198 all-purpose yards.
- Dortch has played 13 career games and has 14 touchdown catches and 16 total touchdowns.
- Since 2000, Dortch is the only ACC player and just the eighth FBS player with two games with four or more touchdown catches.

BB&T FIELD RECORDS FALL

- Wake Forest's 56 points set a BB&T Field record for points scored by the Deacons. The previous mark had been 54 in a 54-48 win over Duke in 2010.
- The 42 first half points were the most points Wake Forest had ever scored in a half at BB&T Field.

COLBURN CLEARS 2,000

- On his first carry of Saturday's game against Rice, Matt Colburn II hit the 2,000-yard mark in career rushing yards.
- Colburn carried eight times for 34 yards against the Owls and finished the day with 2,031 career rushing yards.
- Colburn became the 12th player in Wake Forest history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards. The last Deacon to go over 2,000 yards was Josh Harris in 2013 who finished his career with 2,230 career yards.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

DEFENSE EQUALS OFFENSE

- Wake Forest scored two defensive touchdowns in the same game for the first time since 2008.
- Against Rice, Essang Bassey returned a fumble 51 yards for a score in the second quarter. In the third quarter, Chuck Wade, Jr. returned an interception 60 yards for a score.
- Against Boston College in 2008, Kyle Wilber had a 2-yard fumble return and Kevin Patterson had a 15-yard fumble return.
- Bassey's fumble return marked his second career defensive touchdown after scoring at Boston College on an interception return in 2017.

WADE ACHIEVES RARE DOUBLE

- Wake Forest senior safety Chuck Wade, Jr. had an interception and 60-yard return for a touchdown against Rice on Sept. 29. It was Wade's first career interception after spending his first three seasons as a wide receiver.
- Wade joined an elite list of Demon Deacons who have caught a touchdown pass during their career and returned an interception for a touchdown.
- Wade caught three touchdown passes as a WR from 2015-17. He is just the third Demon Deacon with a touchdown reception and an interception return for a touchdown in a career in 59 years. Bobby Robinson (1958-60) completed the rare double in 1959 while Jack Ladner (1954-56) did it in 1955.
- Wade is one of two active FBS players with a TD catch and a pick-six (Mack Wilson, Alabama).

DEFENSE DIALS IT UP VS. OWLS

- Wake Forest's defense forced a season-high six three-and-outs against Rice.
- The Deacs now have five non-offensive touchdowns on the season (3 PR, 1 fumble return, 1 interception return). It marks the most non-offensive touchdowns by the Deacons

since collecting a school record 10 in 2007. It is the third-highest total in a season ever behind the six non-offensive touchdowns in 2003. Wake Forest zoomed into 10th place nationally in defensive touchdowns following the Rice game.

- Wake Forest's 103 yards in interception returns vs. Rice was the most since notching 104 yards in interception return yards at Utah State in 2014.
- Wake Forest ended a streak where it had allowed 280 or more passing yards in 10 straight games. Rice passed for 103 yards.
- The Deacon defense had allowed 410 or more yards of total offense in each of its last 12 games. Rice had 370 total offense yards, the fewest since Wake Forest held Florida State to 270 yards last Sept. 30.

CARNEY TIMES TWO

- Cade Carney posted his second career multi-touchdown game with two scores vs. Rice.
- Carney scored on a pair of 1-yard runs in the first half.
- In 2016, Carney rushed for three touchdowns at Duke as a true freshman, scoring on runs of seven, one, and 55 yards.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

- Wake Forest converted 6-of-12 third down attempts against Rice. The Deacons are 25th nationally and fourth in the ACC in third down conversion percentage at .467.
- The Deacons have converted at better than 50 percent in four of five games this season. In 2017, Wake Forest converted better than 50 percent just four times in 13 games.
- Wake Forest remains third in the country in fewest penalties with just 15 through five games. Since 1980, Wake Forest's best average for penalties came in 1983 with an average of 4.5 per game.
- The Deacons are ahead of last year's school record scoring average of 35.3 points per game. Wake Forest is 29th in the nation at 38.2 points per game.
- With a 51-20 win over Towson on Sept. 8 and Saturday's 56-24 victory over Rice, the Deacons have two 50-point games this year. The school record is three set last year with a 51-7 win over Presbyterian, a 64-43 victory at Syracuse and the 55-52 Belk Bowl win over Texas A&M.

HIGH MARKS AGAINST RICE

- Punter Dom Maggio averaged a season-best 45.2 yards on four punts.
- Wake Forest won the turnover margin for the first time this season.
- Sam Hartman threw a career-high four touchdown passes while Greg Dortch tied his career-high with four touchdown catches. Dortch's 54-yard touchdown catch was a career-long.
- TE Jack Freudenthal had a career-long 42-yard reception and WR Jaquarii Roberson had his first two career receptions.
- Sulaiman Kamara matched his career-high with four tackles while Manny Walker matched his career-high with three.
- PK Nick Sciba had a career-best seven PATs.

LIGHT THE DORTCH

- WR Greg Dortch is third in the nation and first in the ACC in all-purpose yards this week after gaining 198 yards vs. Rice. Dortch is averaging 196.2 yards per game in 2018, up from his 2017 season average of 161.2 YPG.
- Dortch also leads the ACC in receptions per game (9.0) and punt return average (16.7) and receiving yards (111.0) per game. He is fifth in the ACC in kickoff return average (23.2). His 9.0 receptions per game rank second nationally while also ranking in the top-10 in the country in receiving

yards per game (fifth), total receiving yards (sixth) and punt return average (eighth).

- Dorch has now had nine straight games of 100 or more all-purpose yards.
- The redshirt sophomore remains the only player in FBS with two punt return touchdowns.
- Dorch is just the second player in school history with 500 or more receiving yards, 150 or more punt return yards and 200 or more kickoff return yards. The only other Deacon to have accomplished this feat is Fabian Davis in 2002 when he finished the season with 575 receiving yards, 363 punt return yards and 363 kickoff return yards.

STREAKIN' DEACONS

- Wake Forest is currently riding a streak of 12-straight games in which it has scored 20 or more points.
- The longest such stretch in school history occurred during the 1986 and 1987 seasons. From the start of 1986 through the second game of '87, the Deacons scored 20 or more points in 13 consecutive games.
- The current streak started following a 28-14 loss at Clemson in Week 6 of 2017.

DEACS VS. RANKED FOES

- Wake Forest has played 159 games against ranked opponents since the first meeting with No. 15 Duke in 1936. The Deacs have an all-time record of 23-135-1 against ranked opponents.
- Against top-10 foes, the Demon Deacons are 1-61 all-time with the lone win being a 19-6 victory over No. 4 Tennessee in Knoxville on Oct. 26, 1946. Since that game, the Demon Deacons have lost 59 straight to top-10 opponents.
- Head coach Dave Clawson is 2-12 against ranked opponents while at Wake Forest, having posted wins over No. 23 Temple in the 2016 Military Bowl and No. 25 NC State in November, 2017.
- Wake Forest is playing two top-10 opponents in the same season for the 16th time in school history including each of the past three seasons. This is the second time in BB&T Field history and the first time since 1990 that the Deacons have hosted a pair of top-10 opponents in the same season. In 1990, the Deacons hosted No. 1 Virginia and No. 4 Georgia Tech.
- This season, the Deacons hosted No. 8 Notre Dame on Sept. 22 while Clemson comes in this week ranked No. 4. In 2017, Wake Forest played at No. 2 Clemson and at No. 5 Notre Dame. In 2016, the Deacons hosted No. 5 Clemson and played at No. 5 Louisville. In 2015, Wake Forest played at No. 1 Clemson and at No. 6 Notre Dame.

GROUND GAME

- Wake Forest rushed for 259 yards vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 22, the most the Deacons had gained on the ground in five games with the Fighting Irish.
- The game marked the third-straight game the Deacons have pounded out 250 or more yards rushing. The last time Wake Forest had three straight 250-yard games occurred in the final three games of the 1971 season. That year, the Deacons closed the season with 307 yards vs. William & Mary, 345 vs. Duke and 298 vs. South Carolina.
- Wake Forest has rushed for 200 or more yards in eight of its 18 games since the start of the 2017 campaign.

NEWS & NOTES

- Wake Forest is the least-penalized team in the FBS this week, averaging just 3.0 penalties per game. The Deacons are sixth in the nation in fewest penalty yards with 153.
- Wake Forest's offense leads the ACC and is fifth nationally in first downs with 138. The Deacons had at least 27 first downs in the first four games to start the season.

- Wake Forest is 17th in the nation in rushing yards with an average of 244.4 per game. The school record is 304 yards rushing per game by the 1971 team. Wake Forest last ranked among the top 20 rushing teams in the nation in 2004 with a No. 17 ranking.
- PK Nick Sciba ranks 23rd in the nation with 1.6 field goals made per game.

SUSTAINED DRIVES

- Wake Forest is tied for second in the nation in scoring drives of 10 or more plays.
- The Deacons have 11 sustained scoring drives (seven touchdowns, 4 field goals) that took 10 or more plays.

DO IT ALL DORTCH

- Greg Dorch ranks fifth in the nation in combined kick returns with 184 punt return yards and 232 kickoff return yards.
- Dorch is the only player in the country with more than 150 yards in receiving, punt return yards and kickoff return yards. Last year, only one player, Christian Kirk of Texas A&M, finished the season with greater than 150 yards in all three categories.

BREAK IT UP, BASSEY

- Wake Forest corner Essang Bassey had quite the sophomore campaign in 2017. Bassey tied the school record with 19 passes defended, including three interceptions and 16 pass break-ups.
- An honorable mention All-ACC pick last year, Bassey was second in the league in passes defended. After starting all 13 games, Bassey had three PBUs in the Belk Bowl and was named to ESPN's All-ACC Bowl team.
- He has been named a third team preseason All-ACC pick by Athlon in 2018.
- On the year, Bassey has five breakups and one interception. His 1.4 passes defended per game ranks 20th in all of FBS and second in the ACC.
- Bassey also added his second defensive score of his career against Rice on Sept. 29, returning a fumble 51 yards for a score. Last season, against Boston College, Bassey had an interception returned for a touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS SPOTLIGHT

- Wake Forest is the only school with three punt return touchdowns on the season.
- Greg Dorch returned two punts for touchdowns against Towson on Sept. 8.
- The Deacons' Demetrius Kemp blocked a punt against Boston College on Sept. 13 that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown by Malik Grate. The blocked punt counts statistically as a punt return for a touchdown.
- The three punt returns for touchdowns ties the school record set in 1945.

FAST-PACED ATTACK

- Wake Forest set a school record by running 105 offensive plays against Boston College.
- The Demon Deacons rushed the ball 60 times for 298 yards and attempted 45 passes for 214 yards.
- The previous high for offensive plays in a game was 103 set against Western Carolina in 1982.
- With 94 plays vs. Tulane, the 2018 Deacons have run two of the top six play totals in school history this year.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

DORTCH TOPS 1,000 YARDS

- Greg Dortch went over 1,000 yards in career receiving in just his 11th career game against Boston College on Sept. 13. He became the fastest Wake Forest player to surpass 1,000 career yards.
- Dortch moved past Chris Givens (2009-11), Jason Anderson (2001-04), Todd Dixon (1990-93), and Wayne Baumgardner (1978-81), who all needed 19 games to collect 1,000 career receiving yards.

DORTCH TWICE AS NICE ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- Redshirt sophomore WR Greg Dortch continues to put the flame to the Wake Forest record book. Dortch had two punt returns for touchdowns against Towson on Sept. 8, scoring on returns of 70 and 60 yards.
- The last and only other Deacon with two punt returns for scores in a game was Johnny Cox who turned the feat against Davidson in 1927.
- Dortch became just the fourth player in ACC history with two punt return touchdowns in a game: Devin Hester (Miami) vs. Louisiana Tech in 2004; Ryan Switzer (UNC) vs. Pitt in 2013; Andre Purvis (UNC) vs. Tulane in 1993.
- His 43.7 yards per punt return in a game set an ACC record for PR average (min. 3 returns), breaking the mark of 41.8 by Don Kelly of Clemson vs. Maryland in 1970.

FOURTH DOWN PROFICIENCY

- Wake Forest was a remarkable 6 of 7 on fourth down conversions against Boston College, which is believed to be a modern school record for both attempts and conversions.
- The previous high for fourth-down attempts in game had been six against Rutgers in 1997 while the previous high for conversions had been four against Stanford in 2010.

HARTMAN IN THE RANKINGS

- Freshman QB Sam Hartman is the fourth-rated freshman quarterback in the nation this week with an efficiency rating of 132.6. Clemson's Trevor Lawrence is the highest-rated freshman QB at 177.2.
- Hartman also ranks second in the nation in total offense among freshmen with 287.0 yards per game. Texas Tech's Alan Bowman is tops at 387.3 YPG.
- Among all freshmen QBs in the FBS, Hartman is third with 19.0 completions per game, second with 10 touchdown passes, third in passing yards, second in points responsible for and second in total offense at 278.6 yards per game.

PENALTY FREE

- For the first time in over 50 years, Wake Forest was not called for a penalty against Towson on Sept. 8.
- The last time that happened was in 1964 when the Deacons played at Memphis.
- The only other recorded instance happened in 1960 at South Carolina.

ARBY'S, WE HAVE THE BEEF (BOYS)

- Wake Forest is one of 18 schools in FBS to return all five offensive line starters from 2017. Boston College is the only other ACC school with all five starters returning.
- Wake Forest had 131 career starts entering the start of the season, ranking third nationally behind Wisconsin (150 career O-line starts) and Boston College (139).
- The Deacons are led by LG Phil Haynes (39 career starts), C Ryan Anderson (35), RT Jake Benzinger (19) and RG Patrick Osterhage (16).
- Nate Gilliam (8 career starts) has also seen extensive action on the offensive line.
- Justin Herron started his 38th game against Tulane on Aug. 30 but suffered a season-ending knee injury.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE

- Grad transfer Eric Osteen graduated from West Point in 2013 and fulfilled his five-year commitment to the Army.
- Osteen filled a variety of roles including serving as a platoon leader, company executive officer and company logistics officer. Because he only played two years of football for the Black Knights, Osteen has a year of eligibility remaining. His last game was the 2012 Army-Navy game.
- At age 28, Osteen is the fourth-oldest player in the FBS this season. Colorado sophomore PK James Stefanou is 31; Maryland junior punter Wade Lees is 30, Houston junior punter Dane Roy is 29 and Osteen is fourth at 28.
- Osteen and his wife, Erin, live in Winston-Salem where she is an anesthesiology resident at Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center.
- Osteen registered two touchbacks against Tulane and added three more against Towson for four on the year.

THREE TIMES ON THURSDAY

- Wake Forest will play three Thursday night games in 2018. The Deacons opened at Tulane on Aug. 30, hosted Boston College on ESPN on Sept. 13 and visit NC State on Nov. 8, also on ESPN.
- This is a modern era record for non-Saturday games for the Deacons. In 1946, Wake Forest played three Friday games and a Thursday contest.

ON THIS DATE IN DEACON FOOTBALL HISTORY - OCTOBER 6 - RECORD: 7-10

2007: Wake Forest fell behind 9-0 less than four minutes into the game then scored 34 unanswered points in rallying for a 41-36 win at Duke. WR Kenny Moore caught 11 passes for 100 yards and rushed four times for 84 yards including touchdown runs of 21 and 53 yards. Alphonso Smith added a 30-yard interception return for a score.

1984: For the first time since 1971, two Wake Forest running backs exceeded the 100-yard mark in the same game as the Deacons traveled to Richmond and posted a 29-16 win over the Spiders. Topper Clemons gained a career-high 182 yards on 20 carries while Michael Ramseur added 116 yards on 21 attempts.

1979: Wake Forest improved to 4-1 on the season with a 19-14 over Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium. The Deacons trailed 14-7 entering the fourth quarter before rallying for 12 points in the final 15 minutes for the win. QB Jay Venuto started the rally with a 4-yard touchdown pass to TE Michael Mullen before Robert "Ronchie" Johnson scored the winning touchdown on a 3-yard run. WR Wayne Baumgardner set a school record with 151 receiving yards on five catches. James McDougald carried 28 times for 125 yards.

CLEMSON, S.C. -- Wake Forest suffered a 28-14 loss to No. 2 Clemson Oct. 7 at Memorial Stadium. A fourth-quarter rally by Wake Forest came up short as the Deacs fell to 4-2 overall and 1-2 in the ACC, while Clemson (6-0, 4-0 ACC) won its 11th consecutive game.

Kendall Hinton, making his first start of the season, led the Demon Deacon offense with 92 yards rushing and 203 yards passing, including a pair of touchdown passes. Greg Dortch led the team in receiving with five catches for 78 yards.

Clemson opened the game strong, scoring on its first two drives to take an early 14-0 lead on a 28-yard pass from Kelly Bryant to Deon Cain and a four-yard run by Adam Choice.

The Tigers added a 1-yard rush by Travis Etienne and a 13-yard pass from back-up quarterback Hunter Johnson to Cannon Smith to extend the advantage to 28-0 early in the fourth quarter.

Wake Forest rallied with a pair of touchdown drives to cut the lead in half. A 9-play, 78-yard drive was capped by a 16-yard touchdown pass from Hinton to Scotty Washington. On the next drive, the Deacs went for it on 4th-and-Goal from the 11-yard line and Hinton found Cam Serigne in the end zone to complete a 10-play, 60-yard touchdown drive.

The Wake Forest defense forced two turnovers, a fumble recovered by Carlos Basham, Jr., and an interception by Amari Henderson. The Demon Deacons were led by Cameron Glenn and Jessie Bates III, who recorded 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

Four may not be Dave Clawson's lucky number but perhaps it should be. Having recently completed his fourth season at Wake Forest, his fourth head coaching stop, Clawson seems to always strike gold in Year Four.

Clawson, who started his head coaching career at Fordham in 1999, took the Rams to a 10-3 record in his fourth year in The Bronx and a berth in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. Clawson started at Richmond in 2004 and had the Spiders at 11-3 and in the FCS semifinals in Year Four. At Bowling Green, Clawson's fourth season produced an 8-5 record and a berth in the Military Bowl. And Year Four at Wake Forest as no less magical with the Deacons sitting at 8-5 following a thrilling 55-52 win over Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl in December.

For four seasons with the Demon Deacons, Clawson has preached strong defense and patience on offense. Year Four brought an avalanche of offense as his group of attackers, thrown into the fire in 2014 as youngsters, matured into a tenacious group that set school records for scoring and total offense.

The Demon Deacons set 105 records in 2017, tied another 15 marks, and became one of the nation's most efficient and productive offenses. Wake Forest set major records for points scored in a season, obliterating the record by 97 points. The offense set new marks for total offense yards in a game and in a season, yards per carry, most touchdowns scored and most touchdown passes in a season. The defense set a record with 106 tackles for loss.

But two records stand out: Wake Forest had 11 players selected for 12 All-ACC positions, and as a team, the Deacons beat six bowl teams in 2017.

The 2016 season marked year three in a career that has steadily shown vast improvement in year three. During his time at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, Clawson's year three teams averaged six wins. He exceeded that mark with seven victories in 2016.

With the 2016 addition of McCreary Field House, Wake Forest's state-of-the-art indoor practice facility, and the construction of the Sutton Sports Performance Center, which will mark yet another technologically advanced facility, Clawson and the Deacons are clearly on a roll.

On December 10, 2013, Clawson became the 32nd head football coach in Wake Forest University history. The head coach at Bowling Green State University from 2009 through 2013, Clawson led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

Clawson joined the Demon Deacons after five seasons as the head coach at BGSU in Bowling Green, Ohio. He built the Falcons to be explosive both offensively and defensively. The 2013 Bowling Green team ranked 29th in the nation in total offense and tenth in total defense. In 2012, BGSU was ranked sixth in the nation in total defense and 10th nationally in scoring defense, yielding just 16.8 points per game. The Falcons were one of only two non-power conference teams to rank in the top 30 statistically in both total offense and total defense in 2013.

Bowling Green's 2013 team went 10-3 overall under Clawson and won the MAC East title with a 7-1 record. The Falcons received a bid to the Little Caesar's Bowl in Detroit. It marked the third bowl appearance in five seasons for Clawson's team.

In his 18 years as a head coach, Clawson delivered a conference championship at each of his first three stops. Prior to the 2013 Mid-American Conference title at Bowling Green, Clawson helped Richmond to a pair of Colonial Athletic Association titles in 2005 and 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year awards.

He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. The 2007 CAA Coach of the Year award marked his fourth conference Coach of the Year honor in his first nine years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy. A native of Youngstown, N.Y., Clawson was a defensive back for Williams and went on to serve as a graduate assistant coach at Albany in 1989 and 1990. He moved to Buffalo for the 1991 and 1992 seasons, tutoring the secondary his first year and the quarterbacks and running backs his second.

In 1993, Clawson was named the running backs coach at Lehigh and helped the Mountain Hawks to a 7-4 record and the Patriot League championship. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1994 and spent two years in that role, adding another Patriot League title in 1995. Lehigh won a pair of Patriot League titles in his three years and his offense led the league in scoring, total offense and pass offense in each of his final two seasons.

Villanova hired Clawson as offensive coordinator in 1996 and his offense helped the Wildcats to NCAA FCS appearances in 1996 and 1997. During his tenure at Villanova, Clawson's offense established 70 program records, held the No. 1 ranking in the nation for six weeks in 1997 and won the 1997 Atlantic 10 championship. He tutored Brian Westbrook who became the first player in college football history to gain 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving.

Following the 1998 season, Clawson became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was named head coach at Fordham. Inheriting a team that had won just 22 games in the previous 10 years, Clawson turned the Rams into the Patriot League champions in his fourth season. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Clawson helped the Rams 2002 FCS Playoffs where they defeated fourth seed Northeastern in the opening round before falling to Villanova.

Clawson was named the head coach at Richmond prior to the 2004 season. He guided the Spiders to the biggest two-year turnaround in school history, improving from 3-8 in 2004 to 9-4 in 2005. In 2007, his final year with the Spiders, Clawson guided Richmond to an 11-3 record, the Colonial South title and the FCS national semifinals.

He left Richmond in 2008 to replace David Cutcliffe as the offensive coordinator under Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee. Following that season, Clawson was named the head coach at Bowling Green in time for the 2009 season.

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.

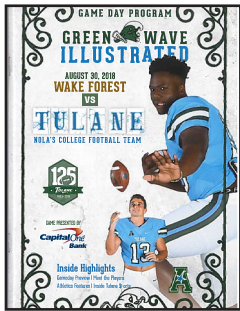

NEW ORLEANS, La. – Wake Forest opened the 2018 season with a 23-17 overtime victory at Tulane August 30th at Yulman Stadium. Cade Carney's 1-yard touchdown run in overtime gave the Demon Deacons (1-0) a season-opening victory for the fourth straight season.

Freshmen headlined the win for Wake Forest, who saw several memorable debuts. Sam Hartman became the first Demon Deacon true freshman quarterback to win his first start, throwing for a school freshman record 378 yards, the 10th most passing yards in program history overall. His 31 completions, 51 attempts and two touchdowns were all school records for a true freshman in his first start. Hartman also had a team-high 64 yards rushing.

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Sage Surratt had 11 catches for 150 yards, both school records for a freshman in his first career game.

Greg Dortch grabbed a career-high 12 receptions for 149 yards, his fourth career 100-yard game. He ended with 200 all-purpose yards, the seventh time in nine career games he has been over 100 all-purpose yards.

Defensively, Chris Calhoun led the team with a career-high 12 tackles. Essang Bassey tied a career high with three pass break-ups, in addition to seven tackles.

GAME 2 WAKE FOREST 51, TOWSON 20 SEPTEMBER 8, 2018 BB&T FIELD (23,619)

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – Wide receiver Greg Dortch had three touchdowns, including two from punt returns, and 310 total yards of offense on Saturday as Wake Forest defeated Towson 51-20.

Wake Forest (2-0) used a balanced attack behind Dortch, freshman quarterback Sam Hartman, and running back Cade Carney in the win over Towson (1-1).

Dortch became just the fourth player in ACC history with two punt return touchdowns in a game and totaled the

third most all-purpose yards in a single game in school history. He also added an acrobatic touchdown grab in the first quarter.

The Deacons jumped on the board early with a quick drive that resulted in a highlight-reel catch from Alex Bachman. Wake Forest then made it 14-7 with a 7-yard touchdown pass from Hartman to Dortch. The drive spanned 62 yards in just 1:01 and three plays.

At the start of the second quarter, Hartman rushed for his first career touchdown, scoring on a 14-yard run to break the stalemate. Essang Bassey intercepted Tom Flacco on the next drive, putting the Deacons back on offense. Nick Sciba drilled a 35-yard field goal as Wake Forest led 24-14 early in the second frame.

Minutes later, Dortch torched the special teams of Towson with a 70-yard punt return touchdown. The touchdown put Dortch over 200 all-purpose yards for the fourth-straight game, the first Wake Forest player ever to hit that mark.

Dortch returned a 60-yard punt for a touchdown in the waning minutes of the first half to continue his historic pace. Towson scored a touchdown shortly before halftime and missed the two-point conversion as Wake Forest took a 38-20 lead into the locker room.

Sciba added a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter followed by a 1-yard touchdown run by Carney in the fourth quarter as Wake Forest led 48-20. Sciba tacked on another 27-yarder in the fourth quarter.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Boston College outlasted a Wake Forest rally as the Demon Deacons fell 41-34 on September 13 at BB&T Field.

Wake Forest (2-1, 0-1 ACC) and Boston College (3-0, 1-0 ACC) each had over 500 yards of offense in a back-and-forth contest that saw the Eagles pull away in the fourth quarter.

Quarterback Sam Hartman was 20-for-45 with 214 yards and two touchdowns. Cade Carney and Matt Colburn

each rushed for over 100 yards while Colburn recorded a first-half touchdown. Cameron Glenn led the Deacons with 10 total tackles, three solo stops and one pass breakup.

With under five minutes left in the first quarter, Colburn punched in a 2-yard touchdown to tie the game up. Prior to the score, Wake Forest benefitted from a fumble recovery by Cade Carney on a punt, putting the Deacons on the BC 13-yard line. After an 11-yard rush from Hartman, Colburn powered his way into the end zone.

Later in the frame, Demetrius Kemp blocked a Boston College punt which was recovered in the end zone by Malik Grate as the Deacons tied the game up at 14-14.

Tied at 21-all at the break, the Deacons scored on their first drive of the third quarter with a 27-yard field goal from Nick Sciba making it 24-21. BC responded with a 29-yard touchdown pass to Tommy Sweeney as the Eagles took a 28-24 lead.

Boston College extended its lead to 34-24 in the fourth quarter after a 71-yard touchdown pass to Smith.

Sciba kicked a 23-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter as Wake Forest pulled within seven however a BC 40-yard touchdown pass to Ben Glines soon gave the Eagles a 41-27 lead.

Wake Forest rallied late with a 5-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jack Freudenthal as the Deacs came within a touchdown with 1:33 left in the contest. Boston College recovered the onside kick from Wake Forest to seal the victory.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Wake Forest dropped a 56-27 decision to No. 8 Notre Dame on Sept. 22 in front of 31,092 fans at BB&T Field.

Sam Hartman completed 12 passes for 110 yards for the Demon Deacons (2-2, 0-1 ACC) before leaving the game due to cramping. Jamie Newman replaced Hartman and scored his first career rushing touchdown.

Newman, Matt Colburn II, and Kendall Hinton each recorded a rushing touchdown while the Demon Deacons tallied 259 total rushing yards. Chuck Wade, Jr. led the defense with eight tackles with six solo tackles. Carlos Basham, Jr. earned a sack and five total tackles.

Wake Forest's Nasir Greer forced a fumble midway through the first quarter which was recovered by Ryan Smenda, Jr. as the Deacs took over deep in Notre Dame territory. Nick Sciba kicked a 30-yard field goal putting the Demon Deacons up early 3-0.

On the next drive, Notre Dame's (3-0) Jafar Armstrong ran for a 30-yard touchdown as the Fighting Irish took a 7-3 lead. Sciba converted a 39-yard field goal at the start of the second quarter to bring the Deacons within one. Notre Dame extended the lead to 21-6 before Wake Forest responded with a touchdown drive of its own as Colburn rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The Deacs went 75 yards over 10 plays en route to the end zone. Book called his own number for Notre Dame on a 2-yard touchdown run as the Fighting Irish made it 28-13.

Notre Dame scored three times in the third before Wake Forest scored a touchdown courtesy of Hinton. The score stood 49-20 in favor of Notre Dame heading into the fourth quarter. Wake Forest closed the scoring with a touchdown from Newman who ran for a 15-yard score.

GAME 5 WAKE FOREST 56, RICE 24 SEPTEMBER 29, 2018 BB&T FIELD (24,519)

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — The Wake Forest offense scored early and scored often Saturday (Sept. 29), as the Demon Deacons cruised past Rice, 56-24, on Family Weekend.

The Demon Deacon (3-2, 0-1 ACC) offense exploded in the opening 30 minutes of play, taking a 42-3 lead into the half-time break. The 42 points are a single-half record under head coach Dave Clawson while the 21 points in the first quarter are tied for the second-most in a single quarter in the Clawson era.

Greg Dortch tied his own school record for touchdown receptions in a game (4) and finished the day with 163 receiving yards. Cade Carney had his first multi-touchdown day since September 10, 2016, while Matt Colburn II became the 12th player in program history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards to pace the offense. Quarterback Sam Hartman finished the day 15-of-17 for 241 yards and four touchdown passes.

Wake Forest recorded a pair of defensive touchdowns against Rice (1-4, 0-1 C-USA), returning two interceptions to the end zone.

The Deacs stormed out to a 28-0 lead as Dortch and Carney traded touchdowns through the first 17 minutes. After punting on their first drive, the Deacs scored touchdowns on their next six, sparked by a 54-yard pass from Hartman to Dortch less than five minutes into the game to make it 7-0 in favor of the Deacs. Carney rushed on six of Wake Forest's seven plays on the next drive for 31 yards, capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run as the lead grew to 14-0.

Hartman was the featured Deacon on the next drive, completing all four pass attempts on a seven-play, 61-yard drive, connecting with Dortch for a 10-yard touchdown to push the lead to 21-0. Masterson had the first interception of his career and returned it 43 yards, setting up a short field and an eventual 1-yard TD plunge from Carney.

Following a Rice field goal, Hartman and Dortch again connected, this time for a 38-yard touchdown to push the lead to 35-3 with 8:10 left in the second quarter. Zeek Rodney forced a fumble and Essang Bassey returned it 51 yards for a touchdown, extending the advantage to 42-3 at the break.

Hartman found Dortch for a gain of 25 before hitting Jack Freudenthal down the sideline for 42 yards on the very next play. Two plays later, Hartman connected with Dortch for the fourth time of the afternoon to extend the lead to 49-10.

The defense stepped up for its second score of the afternoon with Chuck Wade, Jr. intercepting Stankavage and returning it 60 yards to the end zone midway through the third quarter before Rice added a pair of touchdowns to close out play.

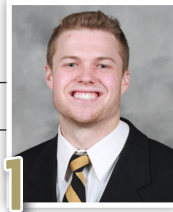
