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WAKE FOREST VS. SYRACUSE

THE MATCHUP

- The Wake Forest Demon Deacons return home to face No. 22/24 Syracuse for Homecoming on Saturday, November 3.
- Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. and will be broadcast on RSN, which includes Fox Sports South. Wes Durham, James Bates and Rebecca Kaple will call the action.
- Saturday's game can also be heard on the Wake Forest Sports Network. Stan Cotten and Lary Sorensen have the call with Dave Goren reporting from the sidelines.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- The Demon Deacons improved to 4-4 and picked up their first ACC win of the year with a 56-35 victory at Louisville on Saturday, October 27.
- Matt Colburn II rushed for a career-high 243 yards and three scores in the victory while Carlos Basham, Jr. recovered a fumble and returned it 23 yards to pace the defense.
- The offense accounted for 591 yards of total offense, a season high, while the 56-point effort was the third 50+ showing by the Deacs this year.
- Colburn was named the league's Co-Running Back of the Week while Basham (Defensive Lineman) and Cameron Glenn (Defensive Back) were also named as ACC Players of the Week.

THE OPPOSITION & SERIES HISTORY

- Syracuse enters the game 6-2 overall and ranked 22nd in the AP poll and 24th in the Coaches Poll.
- Dino Babers is in his 3rd season at the helm of the Orange program.
- Syracuse is the second-most productive offense in the ACC while Wake Forest is fourth.
- Over the last two years, Wake Forest leads the ACC with six 50-point games while Syracuse is second with five, including a league-best four this year.
- Syracuse leads the all-time series, 4-3, with the Deacs having won the last two contests.

LOOKING AHEAD

- The Demon Deacons remain in the state to face NC State on Thursday, Nov. 8 in Raleigh.
- Kickoff for the primetime matchup is set for 7:30 on ESPN.

Weekly Press Conference

Wake Forest's weekly press conference, sponsored by Carrabba's, begins each Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Rovere Room in the Miller Center on campus, beginning with selected players. Lunch will then be served and Dave Clawson will meet with the media at 12:00 p.m. in the Rovere Room followed by lunch with the print media in the Rovere Room. Any specific player requests must be made before noon on Monday. Quotes and video of the press conference will be posted on WakeForestSports.com.

ACC Weekly Teleconference

Dave Clawson participates in the ACC's weekly teleconference. The teleconference takes place each Wednesday, with Coach Clawson set to speak at 12:00 p.m. For the media access number, contact the ACC Media Relations Office or the Wake Forest Athletic Communications Office. The teleconference is archived online at theACC.com.

Covering Practice

Wake Forest typically conducts its practices on campus at the Doc Martin Practice Complex adjacent to the Pruitt Football Center. Please contact the Athletic Communications Office if you'd like to interview a coach or player at the conclusion of practice. Coach Clawson is available in person most days of the week and players are available Tuesday and Wednesday after practice.

The Dave Clawson Show

The show will be held live on location at Bib's Downtown through Oct. 3 and held at the IMG College studios in downtown Winston-Salem for all remaining episodes.

BB&T FIELD 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- Wake Forest will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of BB&T Field throughout the game on Nov. 3. All season ticket holders who have held tickets for all 50 seasons at BB&T Field will be recognized during the game.
- Opened in 1968 as Groves Stadium, the Demon Deacons have played 287 games and compiled a record of 129-158-4. The first game was against NC State on Sept. 14, 1968. Wake Forest's first win at the stadium came on Oct. 26, 1968 with a 48-31 win over North Carolina.
- BB&T Field has hosted two ACC Championship teams in the 1970 squad and the 2006 team.
- Wake Forest has gone undefeated at BB&T Field on two occasions, posting a 5-0 mark in 1979 and a 4-0 record in 1970. Three times Wake Forest has won five home games in a season: 1979, 2007 and 2008.
- Head coach Dave Clawson, with 14 wins in his first four seasons, needs one more victory in 2018 to become the second-winningest coach at BB&T Field.

DEACS SET FOR HOMECOMING VS. CUSE

- Wake Forest will celebrate its 87th Homecoming game against Syracuse on Nov. 3.
- The Demon Deacons are 39-45-2 all-time on Homecoming.
- Wake Forest won last year's Homecoming tilt with a 46-10 victory over Utah State.

WAKE FOREST VS. RANKED FOES

- Wake Forest enters Saturday's game against No. 22/24 Syracuse with an all-time record of 23-136-1 in games against ranked opponents.
- Syracuse represents the third ranked opponent the Deacons have faced this season after games against No. 2 Clemson on Oct. 6 and No. 8 Notre Dame on Sept. 22. Wake Forest's last win against a ranked team was a 30-24 home victory over No. 22 NC State on Nov. 18, 2017.
- The Deacons are 2-5 in their last seven games against ranked foes, having defeated No. 23 Temple in the 2016 Military Bowl.
- The Deacons have played 61 home games against ranked teams and posted a record of 11-50.
- The Demon Deacons have twice beaten the No. 13 team in the nation at BB&T Field. In 1996, Wake Forest beat No. 13 Northwestern 28-27. In 1979, Wake Forest tripped No. 13 Auburn 42-38.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Wake Forest enters Saturday's game with Syracuse averaging 455.9 yards of total offense per game. Syracuse is averaging 485.4 yards of total offense per game.
- The most points ever scored at BB&T Field by Wake Forest was the 56 put up in a 56-24 win over Rice on Sept. 29.
- Wake Forest's highest total offense output at home was 632 against North Carolina in 1968, a 48-31 win over the Tar Heels.
- Wake Forest set both a school record and a BB&T Field record by running 105 offensive plays against Boston College on Sept. 13, 2018.

COLBURN'S CAREER DAY

- Senior RB Matt Colburn II carried 20 times for a career-high 243 yards and three touchdowns in Wake Forest's 56-35 win over Louisville on Oct. 27. Colburn's 243 yards tie for the fifth-most in a game by a Deacon rusher and ranks seventh in the nation this year. Eno Benjamin of Arizona State has the nation's highest total with 312 rushing yards against Oregon State. Colburn's mark is the most by an ACC player in 2018 and the most in the nation by a senior running back.
- Colburn had touchdown runs of 74 and 56 and 12 yards, with his 74-yard touchdown run falling two yards shy of his career-long of 76 (Syracuse, 2017). The game was Colburn's eighth career 100-yard rushing game and his second of the season following 117 yards against Boston College.
- Colburn entered the game in 12th place in school history with 2,129 career rushing yards. He ended the day with 2,372 career yards and in seventh place in career rushing, just seven yards shy of sixth place. On the day, Colburn passed Anthony Williams (1988-91), Larry Hopkins (1970-71), Josh Adams (2007-10), Josh Harris (2010-13) and John Leach (1990-93).
- Colburn's 12.3 yards per carry average vs. Louisville was the sixth-best in a game by a Deacon rusher and the highest yards per carry by a rusher with 20 or more carries in a game. Against Louisville in 2017, Colburn rushed for 134 yards on 24 carries. Over the last two seasons vs. the Cardinals, Colburn has 44 carries for 377 yards, an 8.6 yards per carry average.
- Colburn received a helmet sticker from College Football Final for his efforts against the Cardinals.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

NOTING THE LOUISVILLE GAME

- Wake Forest scored a 56-35 win over Louisville at Cardinal Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 27.
- It marked Wake Forest's first win in Louisville after losing the first two games in 2014 and 2016.
- Matt Colburn II rushed for a career-high 243 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Deacon offense.
- Wake Forest posted a season-high 368 yards rushing and a season-best 591 yards of total offense.
- It was Wake Forest's fourth game this year of 500 or more total offense yards. The 2017 team holds the school record with five 500-yard total offense games.

50-POINT OUTBURST

- Wake Forest posted its third 50-point scoring game of the season in a 56-35 win at Louisville on Oct. 27.
- It marked the third time this year the Deacons have surpassed the half-century mark following a 51-20 win over Towson (Sept. 8) and a 56-24 victory over Rice (Sept. 29).
- Wake Forest had never had more than two 50-point games in a season until the 2017 season. Last year, the Deacons won 55-52 over Texas A&M, 51-7 over Presbyterian and 64-43 at Syracuse.
- Wake Forest has never posted four 50-point games in a season.
- Over the last two years, Wake Forest leads the ACC with six 50-point scoring games.

DORTCH THE TORTCH

- Through the first eight games of the season, Greg Dortch continues to lead the ACC in all-purpose yards with an average of 159.1 yards per game. He ranks fourth nationally in all-purpose yards.
- Dortch recorded his fourth game of 190 or more all-purpose yards this season with 192 yards vs. Louisville on Oct. 27. He raised his season total for all-purpose yards to 1,273, which ranks as the 15th-most in a season by a

Demon Deacon. His 2,563 career all-purpose yards rank 26th in school history.

- He is first in the ACC in receptions per game (7.5), second in receiving yards per game (93.9) and third in punt return average (13.5). Nationally, Dortch ranks sixth, 15th and eighth, respectively.
- Dortch is the only ACC player to have scored four touchdowns in a game this year having achieved that against Rice on Sept. 29. His 310 all-purpose yards against Towson on Sept. 8 are the most by an individual in the ACC in 2018.
- Dortch is just the second player in school history with 500 or more receiving yards, 150 or more punt return yards and 200 or more kickoff return yards. The only other Deacon to have accomplished this feat is Fabian Davis in 2002 when he finished the season with 575 receiving yards, 363 punt return yards and 363 kickoff return yards.

HARTMAN AT THE HELM

- Freshman QB Sam Hartman this week ranks fifth in the nation among freshmen with 213.6 passing yards per game, fifth in completions per game with 17.5, third with 14 touchdown passes and tied for second in points responsible for (points scored and passed for) with 96.
- Hartman is ranked No. 2 in the nation among freshmen with 1,709 passing yards. Texas Tech's Alan Bowman is freshman leader with 2,411. The signal caller is just one-of-five FBS freshman quarterbacks averaging better than 240 total offense yards per game (241.6 YPG).
- He has set the school record for total offense yards in a season by a true freshman. Hartman has 1,933 total offense yards this season with 224 rushing yards and 1,709 passing yards. The previous Wake Forest true freshman record was 1,886 yards by John Wolford in 2014.
- His 212.3 passing yards per game and 237.7 yards of total offense per game both lead all ACC freshmen QBs.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

- The Demon Deacons are 29th in the nation and fourth in the ACC in total offense at 455.9 yards per game.
- Wake Forest leads the ACC and ranks 17th nationally with 25.1 first downs per game. The Deacons are on a pace to break last year's school record of 296 first downs in 13 games, a 22.8 average.
- Cade Carney scored his 13th career rushing touchdown against Louisville. Eight of those have been on one-yard runs including all five this season and his last six career touchdowns.
- Quarterback Sam Hartman has six multi-TD pass games this season.
- Scotty Washington caught his first TD pass of the season against Louisville.

NON-OFFENSIVE SCORES

- Wake Forest recorded its sixth non-offensive touchdown of the season against Louisville on Oct. 27.
- Carlos "Boogie" Basham, Jr. returned a fumble 23 yards for a Deacon touchdown vs. Louisville that put Wake Forest ahead 35-14. It marked the sixth non-offensive touchdown of the season. Greg Dortch had two punt returns for touchdowns vs. Towson, Malik Grate recovered a blocked punt for a score vs. Boston College, Essang Bassey returned a fumble 51 yards vs. Rice while Chuck Wade added a 60-yard interception return vs. the Owls.
- Wake Forest leads the ACC and is sixth in the nation with three defensive touchdowns, counting only the scores by Bassey, Basham and Wade.
- The school record for non-offensive touchdowns in a season is 10 set in 2007. In 2007, the Deacons returned six interceptions, two fumbles, a punt return and a kickoff return for touchdowns.

FAST-PACED ATTACK

- Twice this season, Wake Forest has run more than 100 plays from scrimmage. The Deacons ran 104 plays against Florida State after having run a school record 105 plays against Boston College on Sept. 13.
- It marked just the fourth time in school history that Wake Forest has run over 100 plays. The Deacons rank 103 plays against Western Carolina in 1982 and 101 plays vs. Tulsa in 1971.
- The ACC record for total offense plays in a game is 106 by Syracuse in 2016.

DORTCH TOPS 100 CAREER RECEPTIONS

- Redshirt sophomore WR Greg Dortch became the fastest Demon Deacon to record 100 career catches in a career.
- Against Clemson, Dortch had three catches for 37 yards, enough to push him over the century mark in just his 14th career game. He now has 101 career catches for 1,314 yards and 14 touchdowns in 14 career contests.
- John Henry Mills (1989-92) had been the previous record-holder, hitting the 100-catch mark in his 22nd career game.
- Earlier this year against Boston College, Dortch became the quickest Deacon to ever reach 1,000 career receiving yards, surpassing the mark in his 11th game. The previous mark had been 19 games.

HOT HAND HARTMAN

- Freshman QB Sam Hartman has two of the top 10 total offense play games in school history. Hartman debuted with 442 yards of total offense on 64 plays on Aug. 30 against Tulane. He added 64 total offense plays against Boston College on Sept. 13. The 64 total offense plays in a game are tied for the ninth-most in a single game.
- In addition, Hartman has become the first Wake Forest freshman with two games of 300 or more total offense yards. Along with his 442 yards vs. Tulane, Hartman had 306 yards vs. Towson.
- The 442 yards of total offense against Tulane are the most by an ACC player this year. His 88.2 completion percentage against Rice on Sept. 29 also stands atop the ACC this season.

SURRATT SCORES

- Redshirt freshman WR Sage Suratt snagged his second touchdown catch of the year on a nine-yard pass from Sam Hartman at Florida State.
- It was Suratt's first TD catch since catching a five-yard scoring pass from Hartman vs. Boston College (9/13).
- Suratt on the year is second on the club with 22 receptions for 313 yards.

THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS

- Freshman PK Nick Sciba ranks tied for fifth in the nation in field goal percentage among freshmen at .769. He has made 10-of-13 field goal attempts.
- Sciba is tied for fifth in the nation among freshmen with 10 field goals made.
- Sciba increased his point total to 62 points, breaking the school mark for most points by a true freshman which was 60 by James McDougald in 1976.
- Sciba already owns the school mark for field goals made by a true freshman having surpassed the previous mark of four set by Danny Nolan in 1983.

MAGGIO WITH THE BOOT

- Junior punter Dom Maggio has averaged 40 or more yards per punt in each of his last seven games, setting a career-long streak of 40+ averages in his three years. Against Louisville on Oct. 27, Maggio posted his best game

average of the season with a 47.0 average vs. Louisville.

- For his career, Maggio has averaged better than 40 yards per punt in 25 of 32 games.
- While Maggio ranks seventh in the ACC with a 42.3 season average, he is second in the league with 16 punts inside the 20-yard line and fourth with eight punts of 50 or more yards.
- Maggio this year has eight punts inside the 10-yard line.

DEACS EARN ACC, NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Greg Dortch and Sam Hartman each earned a pair of accolades on Oct. 1 following the Deacs' game against Rice.
- Dortch was named the ACC Receiver of the Week as well as being named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch list. Hartman was the ACC's Rookie of the Week as well as being a CFPA Honorable Mention for National Player of the Week.
- Following Wake Forest's victory over Louisville on Oct. 27, Matt Colburn II (Co-Running Back), Cameron Glenn (Defensive Back) and Carlos Basham, Jr. (Defensive Line) were all named ACC Players of the Week.

COLBURN CLEARS 2,000

- On his first carry of Wake Forest's game against Rice on Sept. 29, Matt Colburn II hit the 2,000-yard mark in career rushing yards.
- Colburn carried eight times for 34 yards against the Owls and finished the day with 2,031 career rushing yards.
- Colburn became the 12th player in Wake Forest history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards. The last Deacon to go over 2,000 yards was Josh Harris in 2013 who finished his career with 2,230 career yards.

HARTMAN'S QUICK START VS. OWLS

- Freshman QB Sam Hartman completed 15 of 17 pass attempts for 241 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions in the Sept. 29 win over Rice. Hartman was named the ACC Rookie of the Week for his performance against the Owls.
- After going 3-for-5 for 23 yards on Wake Forest's first drive of the game, Hartman completed each of his last 12 pass attempts vs. Rice and totaled 218 yards on those 12 attempts.
- Hartman's 12 consecutive completions ties the school record set by Riley Skinner (last 11 attempts of 2008 season, first attempt of 2009 season) and John Wolford vs. Gardner-Webb in 2014.
- Hartman posted a school record QB efficiency rating of 284.96 on Saturday. That is the highest rating ever by a Demon Deacon QB who completed 11 or more passes in a game. Hartman's 284.96 efficiency rating is the third-best turned in by an FBS quarterback this season.
- Hartman completed 88.2 percent of his passes, going 15 for 17. That is the highest percentage ever for a Wake Forest QB with 12 or more pass attempts in a game. Riley Skinner went 11 for 11 in the 2008 EagleBank Bowl win over Navy.
- Hartman has now led the Deacons to three victories, tying the school mark for wins by a true freshman quarterback. John Wolford won three games in 2014.

DEFENSE EQUALS OFFENSE

- Wake Forest scored two defensive touchdowns in the same game for the first time since 2008.
- Against Rice on Sept. 29, Essang Bassey returned a fumble 51 yards for a score in the second quarter. In the third quarter, Chuck Wade, Jr. returned an interception 60 yards for a score.
- Against Boston College in 2008, Kyle Wilber had a 2-yard fumble return and Kevin Patterson had a 15-yard fumble return.
- Bassey's fumble return marked his second career defensive touchdown after scoring at Boston College on an interception return in 2017.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

WADE ACHIEVES RARE DOUBLE

- Wake Forest senior safety Chuck Wade, Jr. had an interception and 60-yard return for a touchdown against Rice on Sept. 29. It was Wade's first career interception after spending his first three seasons as a wide receiver.
- Wade joined an elite list of Demon Deacons who have caught a touchdown pass during their career and returned an interception for a touchdown.
- Wade caught three touchdown passes as a WR from 2015-17. He is just the third Demon Deacon with a touchdown reception and an interception return for a touchdown in a career in 59 years. Bobby Robinson (1958-60) completed the rare double in 1959 while Jack Ladner (1954-56) did it in 1955.
- Wade is one of two active FBS players with a TD catch and a pick-six (Mack Wilson, Alabama).

DEFENSE DIALS IT UP VS. OWLS

- Wake Forest's defense forced a season-high six three-and-outs against Rice.
- Wake Forest's 103 yards in interception returns vs. Rice was the most since notching 104 yards in interception return yards at Utah State in 2014.
- Wake Forest ended a streak where it had allowed 280 or more passing yards in 10 straight games. Rice passed for 103 yards.
- The Deacon defense had allowed 410 or more yards of total offense in each of its last 12 games. Rice had 370 total offense yards, the fewest since Wake Forest held Florida State to 270 yards last Sept. 30.

BB&T FIELD RECORDS FALL

- Wake Forest's 56 points against Rice on Sept. 29 set a BB&T Field record for points scored by the Deacons. The previous mark had been 54 in a 54-48 win over Duke in 2010.
- The 42 first half points were the most points Wake Forest had ever scored in a half at BB&T Field.

GROUND GAME

- Wake Forest rushed for 259 yards vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 22, the most the Deacons had gained on the ground in five games with the Fighting Irish and the most rushing yards Notre Dame has allowed this year.
- The game marked the third-straight game the Deacons have pounded out 250 or more yards rushing. The last time Wake Forest had three straight 250-yard games occurred in the final three games of the 1971 season. That year, the Deacons closed the season with 307 yards vs. William & Mary, 345 vs. Duke and 298 vs. South Carolina.
- Wake Forest has rushed for 200 or more yards in eight of its 20 games since the start of the 2017 campaign.

CARNEY TIMES TWO

- Cade Carney posted his second career multi-touchdown game with two scores vs. Rice.
- Carney scored on a pair of 1-yard runs in the first half.
- In 2016, Carney rushed for three touchdowns at Duke as a true freshman, scoring on runs of seven, one, and 55 yards.

BREAK IT UP, BASSEY

- Wake Forest corner Essang Bassey had quite the sophomore campaign in 2017. Bassey tied the school record with 19 passes defended, including three interceptions and 16 pass break-ups.
- An honorable mention All-ACC pick last year, Bassey was second in the league in passes defended. After starting all 13 games, Bassey had three PBUs in the Belk Bowl and was named to ESPN's All-ACC Bowl team.
- He has been named a third team preseason All-ACC pick by Athlon in 2018.
- On the year, Bassey has seven breakups and one interception.
- Bassey also added his second defensive score of his career against Rice on Sept. 29, returning a fumble 51 yards for a score. Last season, against Boston College, Bassey had an interception returned for a touchdown.

SUSTAINED DRIVES

- Wake Forest is tied for sixth in the nation in scoring drives of 10 or more plays.
- The Deacons have 14 sustained scoring drives (nine touchdowns, three field goals) that took 10 or more plays.
- Wake Forest had a pair of long drives at Florida State on Oct. 20. The first drive of the game, resulting in a 32-yard Nick Sciba field goal, took 15 plays and covered 61 yards. Sam Hartman's nine-yard touchdown pass to Sage Surratt was the result of a 12-play, 75-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

2012: Michael Campanaro tied an ACC record with 16 receptions, three for touchdowns, and Wake Forest posted a 28-14 win over Boston College at BB&T Field. Quarterback Tanner Price completed 39 of 57 passes for 293 yards while Campanaro finished the day with 123 receiving yards.

2001: Jason Anderson took a short pass from James MacPherson and sprinted 64 yards with 1:42 to play in the game as the Deacons defeated Virginia 34-30 in Charlottesville. The win snapped Wake Forest's 17-game losing streak to the Cavaliers.

1956: Billy Ray Barnes rushed for 118 yards but it was his presence as a decoy that led the Deacons to a 13-0 Homecoming win over NC State. Quarterback Charlie Carpenter faked an off tackle handoff to Barnes then threw a 55-yard scoring pass to Ralph Brewster. In the second quarter, Carpenter again faked to Barnes then pitched to Dick Daniels who raced 32 yards for the score.

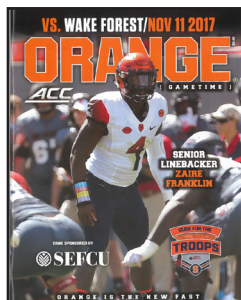

WAKE FOREST - SYRACUSE SERIES



WAKE FOREST 64, SYRACUSE 43
NOVEMBER 11, 2017
CARRIER DOME (38,539)

SYRACUSE, N.Y. -- Wake Forest clinched bowl eligibility with a 64-43 victory at Syracuse Nov. 11. The Demon Deacons (6-4, 3-3 ACC) recorded their sixth win with another explosive day by the offense, which scored the most points by an opponent in the Carrier Dome, while shattering a school-record with 734 yards of total offense.

John Wolford tied his school-record with six touchdowns responsible for by running for three and passing for three. He threw for 363 yards, his third consecutive 300-yard game, while posting his first career 100-yard rushing game, with a career-high 136 yards on the ground.

Matt Colburn ran for a career-high 237 yards, the most by a Demon Deacon since Josh Harris had 241 yards at Virginia Tech in 2010. Cam Serigne set a school record for touchdown catches by a tight end with three, highlighting a 7-catch, 119-yard day. He was joined in the 100-yard receiving club by Tabari Hines (9 catches for 124 yards) and Scotty Washington (7 catches for 113 yards) as the Deacs had three 100-yard receivers for the first time since 1981 (Phil Denfield, Kenny Duckett and Tommy Gregg vs. Maryland).

The 734 yards of total offense broke the school record by over 100 yards, previously set in 1968 with 632 yards against North Carolina. It is fifth-highest single-game total in FBS this season. The Demon Deacons' attack against the Orange was balanced with 371 yards on the ground and 363 yards through the air.

The Demon Deacons' 64 points are tied for ninth-most in school history and are the second most against an ACC foe, trailing only a 66-21 win over Virginia in 1975. The game also marked the first time in the ACC era (since 1953) that Wake Forest has scored at least 37 points in three consecutive games of the same season. The 107 combined points Saturday set a record for a Wake Forest game, surpassing an 82-24 loss at Clemson in 1981.

The Wake Forest offense jumped out to a quick start, scoring on its first three possessions. Wolford and Colburn each ran for a 3-yard touchdown and Wolford found Serigne for a 31-yard touchdown pass as the Demon Deacons posted 21 first-quarter points. However, in between the Wake Forest touchdowns, the Orange scored twice on a 43-yard run by Dontae Strickland and a 19-yard pass from Zack Mahoney to Ravian Pierce, as the Deacs held a 21-14 lead after the opening 15 minutes.

Syracuse responded with a strong second quarter. Early in the period, the Orange drew even on a 1-yard run by Chris Elmore and took its first lead, 28-21, on a 30-yard pass from Mahoney to Steve Ishmael. A 30-yard field goal pushed the Syracuse advantage to 31-21. Late in the half, an 18-yard pass from Mahoney to Pierce pushed the advantage to 38-21. After a touchback, the Deacs got the ball back with 16 seconds, and a 44-yard pass from Wolford to Hines and an 8-yard run from Colburn set up a 41-yard field goal from Mike Weaver cut the deficit to 38-24 at the half.

The opening drives of the second half produced matching field goals, a 43-yarder from Weaver and a 47-yarder from Cole Murphy of Syracuse to keep the margin at two scores, 41-27. The Demon Deacons cut the lead in half as Wolford's second touchdown run, this one from nine yards out, made the score 41-34. With just over a minute left in the quarter, Wolford threw his second touchdown pass to Serigne, but the extra point was blocked and returned for a 2-point conversion by Syracuse, who led 43-40 after three quarters.

After Syracuse missed a long field goal on the opening series of the final quarter, the Deacs took advantage of the good field position. On a 4th-and-1, Wolford kept the ball and ran 29 yards for his third rushing touchdown of the game to give Wake Forest a 47-43 lead. With Syracuse driving for a potential go-ahead score, Jaboree Williams grabbed his first career interception and returned it 52 yards to the Orange 20-yard-line. Wake Forest capitalized with a 6-yard pass from Wolford to Serigne to extend the lead to 54-43. After the Deacs forced a 4-and-out to take over on the Orange 30-yard line, they used the short field to add a 30-yard Weaver field goal to extend the lead to 57-43 with 4:58 to play. As Syracuse drove the ball into the red zone, Justin Strnad intercepted a Mahoney throw to stop the threat. As Wake Forest looked to run out the clock, Colburn broke a 76-yard touchdown run on a 3rd-and-12 for the final touchdown of the day for the Deacs.

Rallying from down 17 points marked the fifth-largest comeback in school history and the largest since 2007 when the Deacs rallied from a 21-point deficit to beat Maryland in overtime.

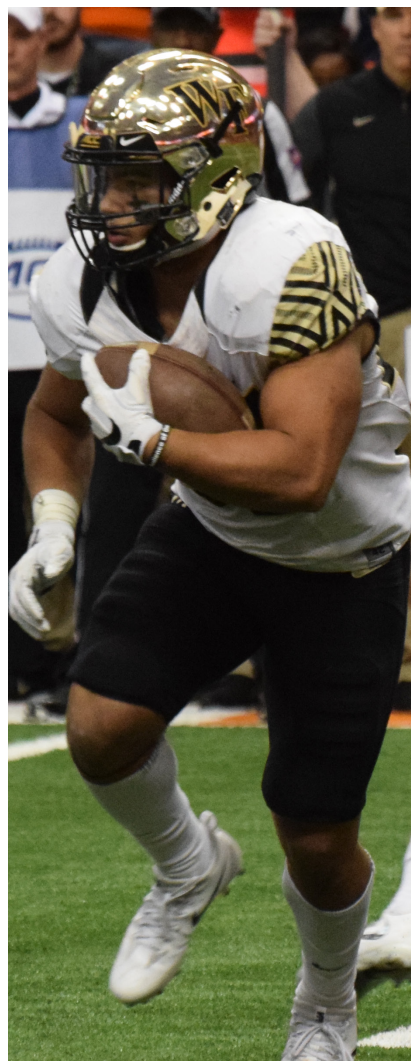

Four may not be Dave Clawson's lucky number but perhaps it should be. Having recently completed his fourth season at Wake Forest, his fourth head coaching stop, Clawson seems to always strike gold in Year Four.

Clawson, who started his head coaching career at Fordham in 1999, took the Rams to a 10-3 record in his fourth year in The Bronx and a berth in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. Clawson started at Richmond in 2004 and had the Spiders at 11-3 and in the FCS semifinals in Year Four. At Bowling Green, Clawson's fourth season produced an 8-5 record and a berth in the Military Bowl. Year Four at Wake Forest as no less magical with the Deacons sitting at 8-5 following a thrilling 55-52 win over Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl in December.

For four seasons with the Demon Deacons, Clawson has preached strong defense and patience on offense. Year Four brought an avalanche of offense as his group of attackers, thrown into the fire in 2014 as youngsters, matured into a tenacious group that set school records for scoring and total offense.

The Demon Deacons set 105 records in 2017, tied another 15 marks, and became one of the nation's most efficient and productive offenses. Wake Forest set major records for points scored in a season, obliterating the record by 97 points. The offense set new marks for total offense yards in a game and in a season, yards per carry, most touchdowns scored and most touchdown passes in a season. The defense set a record with 106 tackles for loss.

But two records stand out: Wake Forest had 11 players selected for 12 All-ACC positions, and as a team, the Deacons beat six bowl teams in 2017.

The 2016 season marked year three in a career that has steadily shown vast improvement in year three. During his time at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, Clawson's year three teams averaged six wins. He exceeded that mark with seven victories in 2016.

With the 2016 addition of McCreary Field House, Wake Forest's state-of-the-art indoor practice facility, and the construction of the Sutton Sports Performance Center, which will mark yet another technologically advanced facility, Clawson and the Deacons are clearly on a roll.

On December 10, 2013, Clawson became the 32nd head football coach in Wake Forest University history. The head coach at Bowling Green State University from 2009 through 2013, Clawson led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

Clawson joined the Demon Deacons after five seasons as the head coach at BGSU in Bowling Green, Ohio. He built the Falcons to be explosive both offensively and defensively. The 2013 Bowling Green team ranked 29th in the nation in total offense and tenth in total defense. In 2012, BGSU was ranked sixth in the nation in total defense and 10th nationally in scoring defense, yielding just 16.8 points per game. The Falcons were one of only two non-power conference teams to rank in the top 30 statistically in both total offense and total defense in 2013.

Bowling Green's 2013 team went 10-3 overall under Clawson and won the MAC East title with a 7-1 record. The Falcons received a bid to the Little Caesar's Bowl in Detroit. It marked the third bowl appearance in five seasons for Clawson's team.

In his 18 years as a head coach, Clawson delivered a conference championship at each of his first three stops. Prior to the 2013 Mid-American Conference title at Bowling Green, Clawson helped Richmond to a pair of Colonial Athletic Association titles in 2005 and 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year awards.

He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. The 2007 CAA Coach of the Year award marked his fourth conference Coach of the Year honor in his first nine years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy. A native of Youngstown, N.Y., Clawson was a defensive back for Williams and went on to serve as a graduate assistant coach at Albany in 1989 and 1990. He moved to Buffalo for the 1991 and 1992 seasons, tutoring the secondary his first year and the quarterbacks and running backs his second.

In 1993, Clawson was named the running backs coach at Lehigh and helped the Mountain Hawks to a 7-4 record and the Patriot League championship. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1994 and spent two years in that role, adding another Patriot League title in 1995. Lehigh won a pair of Patriot League titles in his three years and his offense led the league in scoring, total offense and pass offense in each of his final two seasons.

Villanova hired Clawson as offensive coordinator in 1996 and his offense helped the Wildcats to NCAA FCS appearances in 1996 and 1997. During his tenure at Villanova, Clawson's offense established 70 program records, held the No. 1 ranking in the nation for six weeks in 1997 and won the 1997 Atlantic 10 championship. He tutored Brian Westbrook who became the first player in college football history to gain 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving.

Following the 1998 season, Clawson became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was named head coach at Fordham. Inheriting a team that had won just 22 games in the previous 10 years, Clawson turned the Rams into the Patriot League champions in his fourth season. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Clawson helped the Rams 2002 FCS Playoffs where they defeated fourth seed Northeastern in the opening round before falling to Villanova.

Clawson was named the head coach at Richmond prior to the 2004 season. He guided the Spiders to the biggest two-year turnaround in school history, improving from 3-8 in 2004 to 9-4 in 2005. In 2007, his final year with the Spiders, Clawson guided Richmond to an 11-3 record, the Colonial South title and the FCS national semifinals.

He left Richmond in 2008 to replace David Cutcliffe as the offensive coordinator under Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee. Following that season, Clawson was named the head coach at Bowling Green in time for the 2009 season.

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.

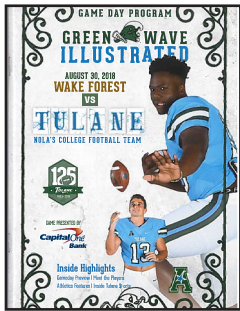

NEW ORLEANS, La. – Wake Forest opened the 2018 season with a 23-17 overtime victory at Tulane August 30th at Yulman Stadium. Cade Carney's 1-yard touchdown run in overtime gave the Demon Deacons (1-0) a season-opening victory for the fourth straight season.

Freshmen headlined the win for Wake Forest, who saw several memorable debuts. Sam Hartman became the first Demon Deacon true freshman quarterback to win his first start, throwing for a school freshman record 378 yards, the 10th most passing yards in program history overall. His 31 completions, 51 attempts and two touchdowns were all school records for a true freshman in his first start. Hartman also had a team-high 64 yards rushing.

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Sage Surratt had 11 catches for 150 yards, both school records for a freshman in his first career game.

Greg Dortch grabbed a career-high 12 receptions for 149 yards, his fourth career 100-yard game. He ended with 200 all-purpose yards, the seventh time in nine career games he has been over 100 all-purpose yards.

Defensively, Chris Calhoun led the team with a career-high 12 tackles. Essang Bassey tied a career high with three pass break-ups, in addition to seven tackles.

GAME 2 WAKE FOREST 51, TOWSON 20 SEPTEMBER 8, 2018 BB&T FIELD (23,619)

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – Wide receiver Greg Dortch had three touchdowns, including two from punt returns, and 310 total yards of offense on Saturday as Wake Forest defeated Towson 51-20.

Wake Forest (2-0) used a balanced attack behind Dortch, freshman quarterback Sam Hartman, and running back Cade Carney in the win over Towson (1-1).

Dortch became just the fourth player in ACC history with two punt return touchdowns in a game and totaled the

third most all-purpose yards in a single game in school history. He also added an acrobatic touchdown grab in the first quarter.

The Deacons jumped on the board early with a quick drive that resulted in a highlight-reel catch from Alex Bachman. Wake Forest then made it 14-7 with a 7-yard touchdown pass from Hartman to Dortch. The drive spanned 62 yards in just 1:01 and three plays.

At the start of the second quarter, Hartman rushed for his first career touchdown, scoring on a 14-yard run to break the stalemate. Essang Bassey intercepted Tom Flacco on the next drive, putting the Deacons back on offense. Nick Sciba drilled a 35-yard field goal as Wake Forest led 24-14 early in the second frame.

Minutes later, Dortch torched the special teams of Towson with a 70-yard punt return touchdown. The touchdown put Dortch over 200 all-purpose yards for the fourth-straight game, the first Wake Forest player ever to hit that mark.

Dortch returned a 60-yard punt for a touchdown in the waning minutes of the first half to continue his historic pace. Towson scored a touchdown shortly before halftime and missed the two-point conversion as Wake Forest took a 38-20 lead into the locker room.

Sciba added a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter followed by a 1-yard touchdown run by Carney in the fourth quarter as Wake Forest led 48-20. Sciba tacked on another 27-yarder in the fourth quarter.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Boston College outlasted a Wake Forest rally as the Demon Deacons fell 41-34 on September 13 at BB&T Field.

Wake Forest (2-1, 0-1 ACC) and Boston College (3-0, 1-0 ACC) each had over 500 yards of offense in a back-and-forth contest that saw the Eagles pull away in the fourth quarter.

Quarterback Sam Hartman was 20-for-45 with 214 yards and two touchdowns. Cade Carney and Matt Colburn

each rushed for over 100 yards while Colburn recorded a first-half touchdown. Cameron Glenn led the Deacons with 10 total tackles, three solo stops and one pass breakup.

Later in the frame, Demetrius Kemp blocked a Boston College punt which was recovered in the end zone by Malik Grate as the Deacons tied the game up at 14-14.

Tied at 21-all at the break, the Deacons scored on their first drive of the third quarter with a 27-yard field goal from Nick Sciba making it 24-21. BC responded with a 29-yard touchdown pass to Tommy Sweeney as the Eagles took a 28-24 lead.

Boston College extended its lead to 34-24 in the fourth quarter after a 71-yard touchdown pass to Smith.

Sciba kicked a 23-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter as Wake Forest pulled within seven however a BC 40-yard touchdown pass to Ben Glines soon gave the Eagles a 41-27 lead.

Wake Forest rallied late with a 5-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jack Freudenthal as the Deacs came within a touchdown with 1:33 left in the contest. Boston College recovered the onside kick from Wake Forest to seal the victory.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Wake Forest dropped a 56-27 decision to No. 8 Notre Dame on Sept. 22 in front of 31,092 fans at BB&T Field.

Sam Hartman completed 12 passes for 110 yards for the Demon Deacons (2-2, 0-1 ACC) before leaving the game due to cramping. Jamie Newman replaced Hartman and scored his first career rushing touchdown.

Newman, Matt Colburn II, and Kendall Hinton each recorded a rushing touchdown while the Demon Deacons tallied 259 total rushing yards. Chuck Wade, Jr. led the defense with eight tackles with six solo tackles. Carlos Basham, Jr. earned a sack and five total tackles.

Wake Forest's Nasir Greer forced a fumble midway through the first quarter which was recovered by Ryan Smenda, Jr. as the Deacs took over deep in Notre Dame territory. Nick Sciba kicked a 30-yard field goal putting the Demon Deacons up early 3-0.

On the next drive, Notre Dame's (3-0) Jafar Armstrong ran for a 30-yard touchdown as the Fighting Irish took a 7-3 lead. Sciba converted a 39-yard field goal at the start of the second quarter to bring the Deacons within one. Notre Dame extended the lead to 21-6 before Wake Forest responded with a touchdown drive of its own as Colburn rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The Deacs went 75 yards over 10 plays en route to the end zone. Book called his own number for Notre Dame on a 2-yard touchdown run as the Fighting Irish made it 28-13.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — The Wake Forest offense scored early and scored often Saturday (Sept. 29), as the Demon Deacons cruised past Rice, 56-24, on Family Weekend.

The Demon Deacon (3-2, 0-1 ACC) offense exploded in the opening 30 minutes of play, taking a 42-3 lead into the half-time break. The 42 points are a single-half record under head coach Dave Clawson while the 21 points in the first quarter are tied for the second-most in a single quarter in the Clawson era.

Cade Carney had his first multi-touchdown day since September 10, 2016, while Matt Colburn II became the 12th player in program history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards to pace the offense. Quarterback Sam Hartman finished the day 15-of-17 for 241 yards and four touchdown passes.

Wake Forest recorded a pair of defensive touchdowns against Rice (1-4, 0-1 C-USA), returning two interceptions to the end zone.

The Deacs stormed out to a 28-0 lead as Dortch and Carney traded touchdowns through the first 17 minutes. After punting on their first drive, the Deacs scored touchdowns on their next six, sparked by a 54-yard pass from Hartman to Dortch less than five minutes into the game to make it 7-0 in favor of the Deacs. Carney rushed on six of Wake Forest's seven plays on the next drive for 31 yards, capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run as the lead grew to 14-0.

Hartman was the featured Deacon on the next drive, completing all four pass attempts on a seven-play, 61-yard drive, connecting with Dortch for a 10-yard touchdown to push the lead to 21-0. Masterson had the first interception of his career and returned it 43 yards, setting up a short field and an eventual 1-yard TD plunge from Carney.

Following a Rice field goal, Hartman and Dortch again connected, this time for a 38-yard touchdown to push the lead to 35-3 with 8:10 left in the second quarter. Zeek Rodney forced a fumble and Essang Bassey returned it 51 yards for a touchdown, extending the advantage to 42-3 at the break.

Hartman found Dortch for a gain of 25 before hitting Jack Freudenthal down the sideline for 42 yards on the very next play. Two plays later, Hartman connected with Dortch for the fourth time of the afternoon to extend the lead to 49-10.

The defense stepped up for its second score of the afternoon with Chuck Wade, Jr. intercepting Stankavage and returning it 60 yards to the end zone midway through the third quarter before Rice added a pair of touchdowns to close out play.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Wake Forest couldn't keep up with No. 4 Clemson on Saturday as the Tigers defeated the Demon Deacons 63-3 in front of 31,608 fans at BB&T Field.

Wake Forest (3-3, 0-2 ACC) held Clemson (6-0, 3-0 ACC) to just a touchdown in the first quarter but the Tigers scored 21 in the second quarter and held the Deacons from gaining any ground.

Clemson struck first with a 59-yard rushing touchdown from Travis Etienne midway through the first quarter. Etienne added a 3-yard rushing touchdown early in the second quarter as Clemson extended its lead to 14-0.

Clemson quarterback Trevor Lawrence added two touchdown passes in the first half with the Tigers leading 28-0 at halftime. Etienne had another big run of 70-yards to start the second half.

A promising drive for Wake Forest resulted in a field goal during the third quarter. Quarterback Kendall Hinton replaced Sam Hartman and rushed for 53-yards but was tripped up at the Clemson 9-yard line.

Leading 35-3, Adam Choice and Lyn-J Dixon for the Tigers had rushing touchdowns over 60-yards. Chase Brice passed for a Clemson touchdown and Dixon rushed for another score in the fourth as Clemson won 63-3.

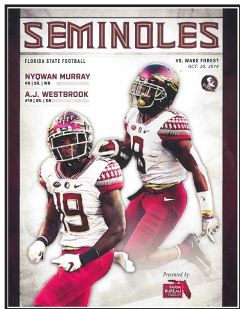

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — The Wake Forest football team returned to action Saturday and suffered a 38-17 loss at Florida State. The Demon Deacons fall to 3-4 overall and 0-3 in the ACC with the loss, while the Seminoles improved to 4-3 and 2-3 in the conference.

Wake Forest started the game strong, taking an early 10-0 lead before Florida State answered with 38 straight points. Sam Hartman and Jamie Newman combined to throw for 273

yards as eight different Demon Deacon receivers made multiple receptions. Matt Colburn II ran for a team-high 71 yards.

Cameron Glenn and Justin Strnad each had 12 tackles to lead the Wake Forest defense.

The Demon Deacons took the opening kickoff and drove down the field with a 15-play, 61-yard drive to set up a 32-yard field goal from Nick Sciba to take an early lead. Later in the quarter, the Demon Deacons scored their first touchdown in Tallahassee in six games with a 9-yard pass from Hartman to Freudenthal to extend the score to 10-0. In the final minute of the first quarter, the Seminoles got on the board with a 3-yard run from Cam Akers to cut the lead to 10-7.

After the teams traded turnovers early in the second quarter, the Seminoles took advantage of a short field to take a 14-10 lead on a 2-yard touchdown run from Jacques Patrick. Florida State pushed the lead to 21-10 on a 33-yard touchdown pass to Nyqwan Murray late in the second quarter and took that advantage into halftime.

On the second play of the third quarter Akers ran 58 yards for a touchdown to make the Florida State lead 28-10. A field goal extended the lead to 31-10 at the end of three quarters. The teams traded touchdowns in the fourth quarter. After Florida State's Tre'Shaun Harrison had a touchdown catch, the Deacs answered with a touchdown pass from Hartman to Sage Surratt.

GAME 8 WAKE FOREST 56, LOUISVILLE 35 OCTOBER 27, 2018 CARDINAL STADIUM (49,603)

LOUISVILLE, KY. — The Wake Forest offense erupted for a season-high 591 total yards and seven touchdowns as the Demon Deacons routed Louisville 56-35 at Cardinal Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 27. The Deacs (4-4, 1-3 ACC) picked up their first ACC win of the season as they evened their overall record.

The 591 yards of total offense are tied for the sixth most in Wake Forest history. Of the 11 highest total offense performances in program history, six have come over the last two seasons.

Senior running back Matt Colburn II registered a career day with three touchdowns behind 243 rushing yards on 20 carries. It was the first three rushing touchdown game for a Deacon since Cade Carney completed the feat at Duke in 2016. Colburn's 12.2 yards-per-carry average is the highest in school history for a running back on at least 20 carries and sixth-best overall.

Freshman quarterback Sam Hartman threw two touchdown passes and went 16-of-24 through the air. On the ground, the Deacs posted 368 yards and five touchdowns. Greg Dortch led the receiving corps with eight carries for 135 yards. Jack Freudenthal, Scotty Washington, Carney and Hartman all also found the end zone in the win for the Deacons.

Cameron Glenn and Justin Strnad led the Deacon defense with 13 tackles, including nine solo stops each. Strnad's 13 stops and nine solo tackles are both career highs, while Glenn tied his career mark. The defense also collected two sacks and seven TFL's, paced by Willie Yarbary and Carlos Basham, Jr. with 1.5 a piece.

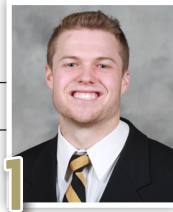

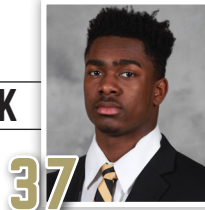

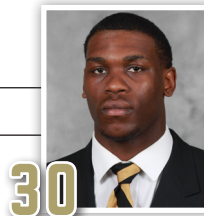
