**THE BOOK ON BACH**

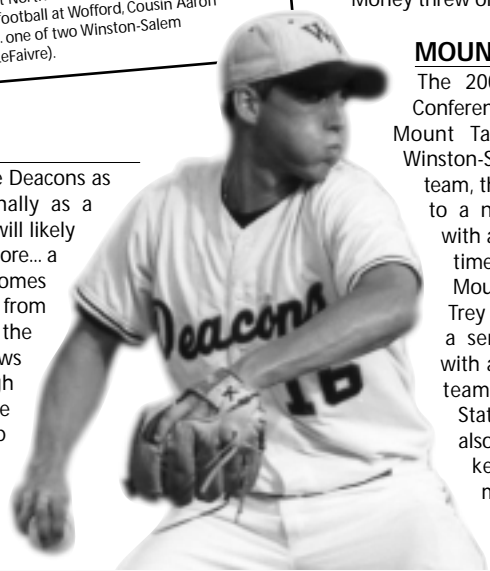
A solid middle reliever for the Deacons as a freshman... used occasionally as a starter in mid-week games... will likely stay in that role as a sophomore... a sinker-slider type pitcher... comes in on the righties and away from the lefties... touches 90 on the radar gun and regularly throws in the upper-80's... a tough competitor... came to Wake Forest one of the best prep players in North Carolina on the mound and with the bat... a smart student and a smart athlete.

**2002: FRESHMAN YEAR**

Posted a 6-1 record on a 5.86 ERA... appeared in 16 games with five starts... threw a total of 43 innings and struck out 29 hitters against 19 walks... pitched 2.1 scoreless innings of relief at the ACC Tournament... three of his six wins came against ACC teams (vs. Ga. Tech, at NC State, at Virginia)... defeated Georgia, Virginia Tech and West Virginia... struck out a career-high eight batters vs. Georgia on March 19 to get the win... tossed a complete game at Virginia Tech on April 24 with seven strikeouts and no walks... his complete game came one day after fellow freshman Tim Morley threw one at Charlotte.

**MOUNT TABOR HS**

The 2001 Central Piedmont Conference Player of the Year at Mount Tabor High School in Winston-Salem... led his USSSA team, the Carolina Hurricanes, to a national championship with a 1.00 ERA... was a two-time all-conference pick at Mount Tabor under coach Trey Massie... batted .486 as a senior for the Spartans with a 1.20 ERA... helped his team to a North Carolina State Games gold medal... also earned a letter in basketball and track... a member of the National Honor Society.

One of the team's three captains along with fellow seniors Seth Hill and Ryan Johnson... begins third season as the everyday second baseman... a slick fielder... always seems to be on base and a threat to steal... missed fall practices after shoulder surgery.

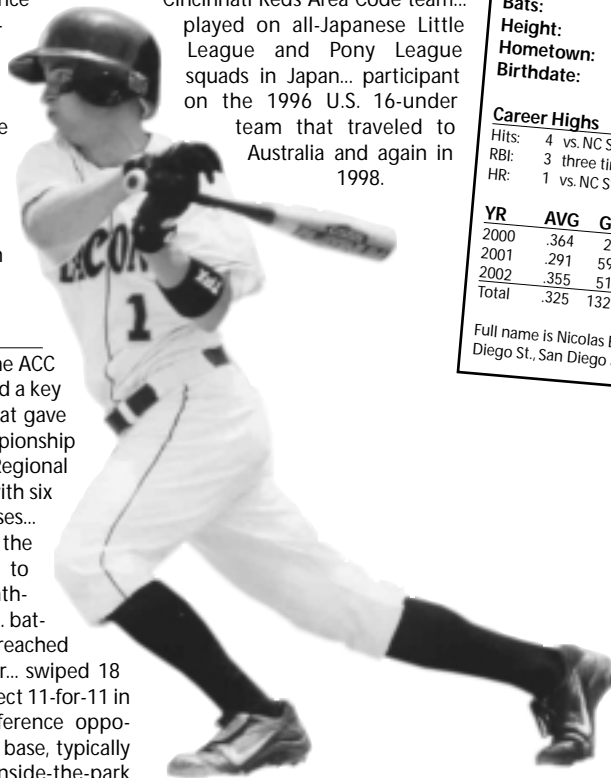
## 2002: JUNIOR YEAR

Finished the year with a .355 average, third best on the squad... his 21 stolen bases and .453 on-base percentage were second best on the team... batted .414 in ACC games (29-for-70) ... the ACC Player of the

Week on April 22... led the ACC with 1.53 runs per conference game, 29 runs total... reaches base at a .500 clip in conference games, sixth in the ACC... had four-hit games vs. Clemson, Virginia and Maryland (twice)... had 19 multi-hit games against highly-touted opponents such as Clemson, Rice, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Nebraska... batted .300 or better all but one day of the season... a standout defensive player who owned a .941 fielding percentage... stole four bases in a game against Maryland, the first Deacon to accomplish the feat since 1988... hit his first collegiate "outside-the-park" home run in that game vs. the Terps... had 13 multi-RBI games... led the team with eight sac bunts... batted .500 (6-for-12) with the bases loaded... hit .462 in the month of April before injuring his shoulder... missed 15 games from late-April through late-May with a dislocated shoulder... Wake was 31-8 when Blue started at second base.

## 2001: SOPHOMORE YEAR

Picked up a career-high four hits in the ACC Championship game with a walk... had a key two-run single in the sixth inning that gave Wake Forest a cushion in the championship game... selected to the NCAA All-Regional team in Knoxville after batting .353 with six hits, two walks and two stolen bases... turned a spectacular double play in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament to help the Deacons escape an eighth-inning jam and defeat Georgia Tech... batted .333 in 10 postseason games... reached base at a solid .400 clip on the year... swiped 18 bases in 21 attempts including a perfect 11-for-11 in ACC games... hit .314 against conference opponents... started 55 games at second base, typically batting second... hit a three-run inside-the-park



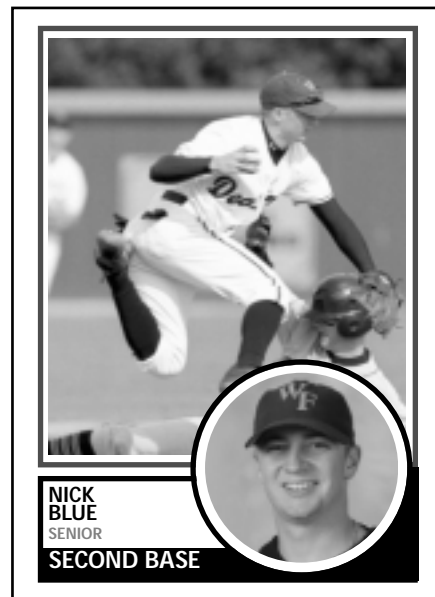
home run vs. NC State... went 5-for-10 at Florida State with three RBI... rode a seven-game hit streak from February 20 to March 4... went 3-for-10 with five RBI in two games vs. New Orleans... drove in three runs against the Privateers on March 2.

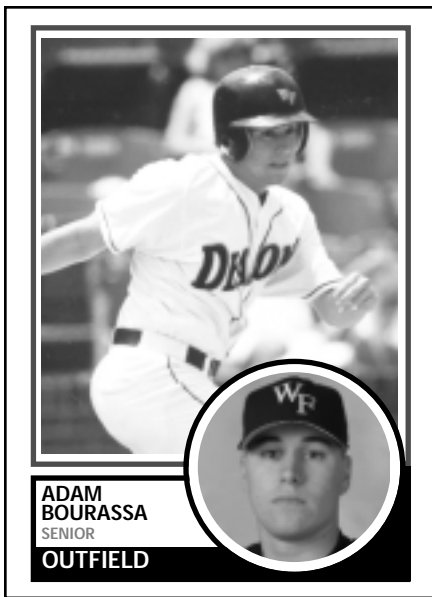

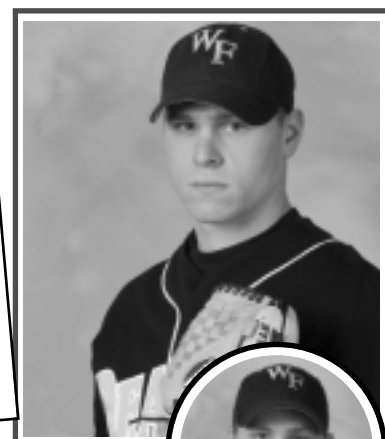

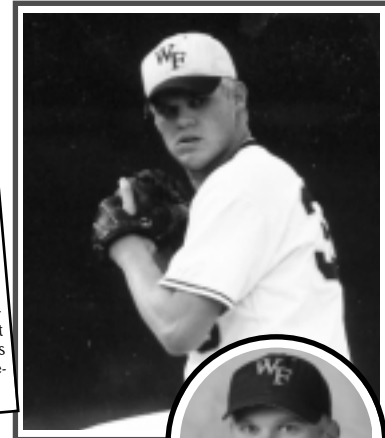

**THE BOOK ON CLAYTON**

A talented, tall lefty who has been bothered by various injuries over the last two seasons... received a medical hardship in 2002 and is a junior eligibility-wise... shown to be one of the team's best pitchers when fully healthy... a former Freshman All-American who threw a no-hitter against UNC Greensboro in 2000... has worked very hard in rehab during the off-season and has lost 25 pounds... could be a major contributor.

**2002: MEDICAL HARDSHIP**

Made just four starts before having his season cut short because of a shoulder injury... went 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA, picking up wins against Elon and High Point in February... logged 16 innings and fanned 11... rated by *Baseball America* as the nation's 74th best pro prospect prior to the season.

**2001: SOPHOMORE SEASON**

Owned a 4-1 record in limited action with just 10 starts... missed much of the second half with knee and shoulder problems but recovered in time to defeat Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament in Knoxville... struck out five Vols in five innings on his way to the win... pitched well at High Point on April 18, allowing one run on three hits in five innings but did not factor in the decision... allowed a season-high 10 hits which led to six runs in 4.2 innings pitched against Virginia... suffered his first loss in more than one year after getting touched

up for six earned runs in five innings at Florida State... allowed eight hits and three walks and took the loss... pitched 6.1

strong innings against Clemson allowing just one run on three hits with four K's but did not factor in the decision... picked up his third win of the year in the Friday game at UNC going 5.2 innings and giving up three runs... lasted 4.1 innings, his shortest outing of the season, against Duke, giving up six runs on nine hits... earned his second win of the year against New Orleans after yielding one run in five IP... threw seven innings against Virginia Tech giving up one run on five hits while striking out six... made his 2001 debut against Purdue and struck out six in five innings while allowing three runs.

**2000: FRESHMAN SEASON**

year with a minor back injury... started at short-stop in 56 of the remaining 57 games of the year.

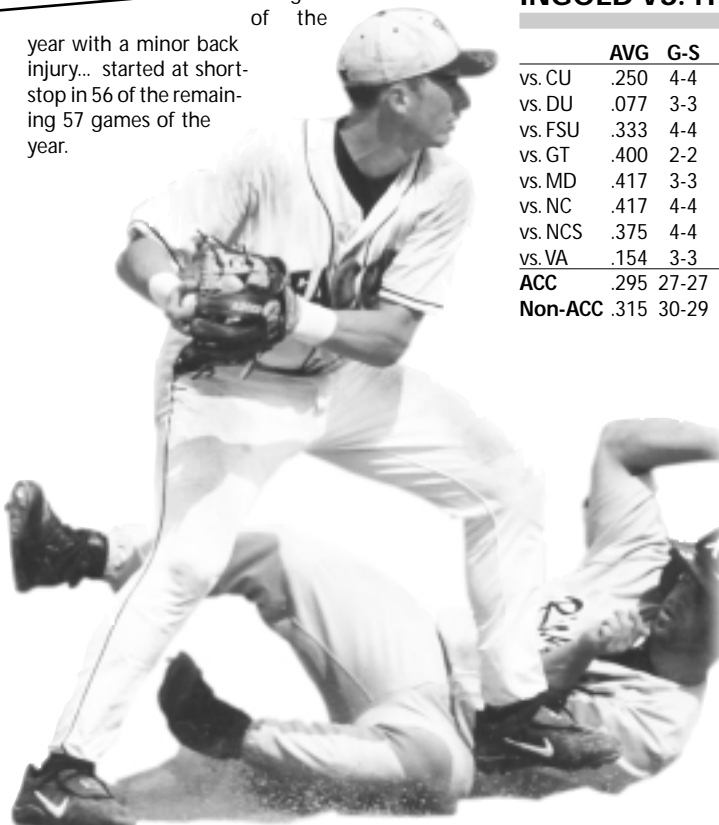


### RIVERSIDE HIGH SCHOOL

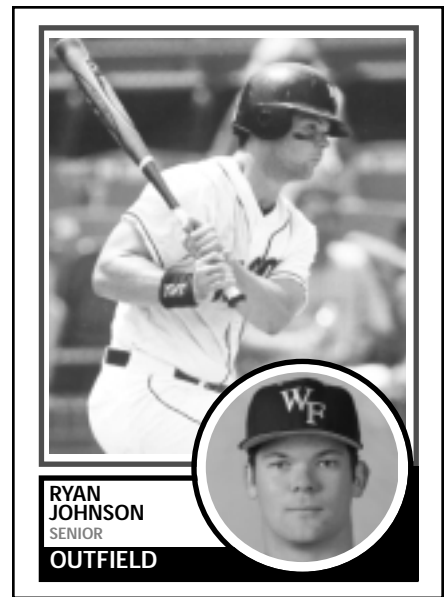

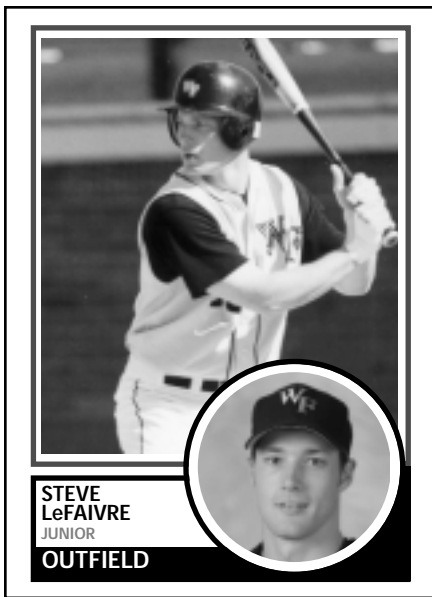

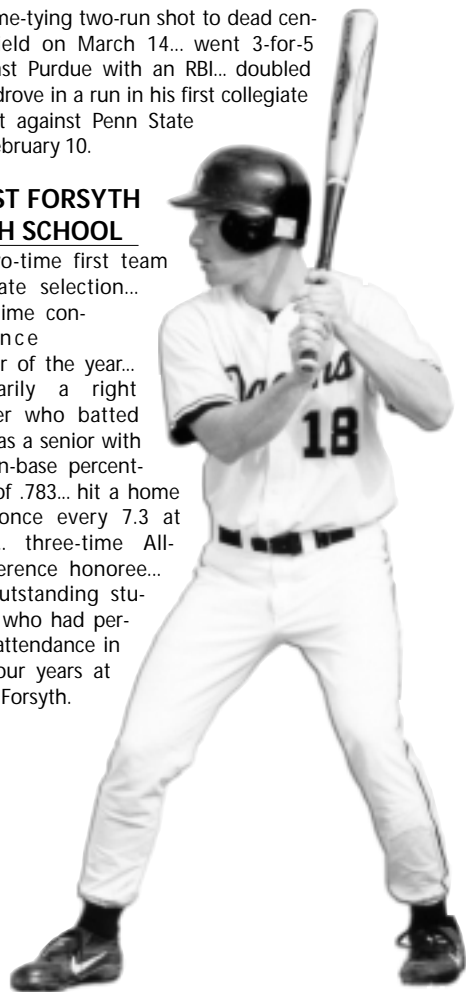
