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WAKE FOREST AT TULANE

THE MATCH UP

- Wake Forest begins the 2018 season on Thursday, August 30, as the Demon Deacons hit the road to take on Tulane.
- Kickoff is set for 8:00 p.m. Eastern (7:00 p.m. Central) and will be broadcast on the CBS Sports Network. Ben Holden and Jay Feely will have the call.
- Thursday's game can also be heard on the Wake Forest Sports Network. Stan Cotten and Lary Sorenson have the call with Dave Goren reporting from the sidelines.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- The Demon Deacons are coming off back-to-back bowl victories for just the second time in school history following a 55-52 victory over Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl to close the 2017 season.
- Redshirt senior offensive lineman Phil Haynes and redshirt sophomore wide receiver Greg Dortch were each named to the preseason All-ACC team.
- The Deacs are expected to start true freshman quarterback Sam Hartman against the Green Wave. He will be just the second true freshman quarterback in program history to start the season opener.

THE OPPOSITION & SERIES HISTORY

- Tulane enters the 2018 season following a 5-7 record a year ago.
- Willie Fritz has amassed a 9-15 record over his first two seasons.
- Charles Jones II and Terren Encalade were named to the preseason watch lists for the Mackey and Biletnikoff awards, respectively.
- Tulane leads the all-time series, 2-1, with the Deacs taking a 7-3 decision the last time the two teams met to kick off the 2016 season.

LOOKING AHEAD

- The Deacs return to Winston-Salem for their home opener against Towson on Saturday, Sept. 8. Kickoff is set for noon on ACC Network Extra.

Weekly Press Conference

Wake Forest's weekly press conference, sponsored by Carrabba's, begins each Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Rovere Room in the Miller Center on campus, beginning with selected players. Lunch will then be served and Dave Clawson will meet with the media at 12:00 p.m. in the Rovere Room followed by lunch with the print media in the Rovere Room. Any specific player requests must be made before noon on Monday. Quotes and video of the press conference will be posted on WakeForestSports.com.

ACC Weekly Teleconference

Dave Clawson participates in the ACC's weekly teleconference. The teleconference takes place each Wednesday, with Coach Clawson set to speak at 12:00 p.m. For the media access number, contact the ACC Media Relations Office or the Wake Forest Athletic Communications Office. The teleconference is archived online at theACC.com.

Covering Practice

Wake Forest typically conducts its practices on campus at the Doc Martin Practice Complex adjacent to the Pruitt Football Center. Please contact the Athletic Communications Office if you'd like to interview a coach or player at the conclusion of practice. Coach Clawson is available in person most days of the week and players are available Tuesday and Wednesday after practice.

The Dave Clawson Show

Coach Clawson's weekly radio show with the Voice of the Deacons, Stan Cotten, airs on the Wake Forest IMG Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com. The show will be held live on location at Bib's Downtown through Oct. 3 and held at the IMG College studios in downtown Winston-Salem for all remaining episodes.

SEASON OPENERS

- Wake Forest will open its 117th season of intercollegiate football on Aug. 30 at Tulane.
- Wake Forest is 56-57-3 all-time in the first game of the season.
- The Demon Deacons are 15-34-3 in 52 previous season-openers on the road.
- Wake Forest has lost its last two road season-openers: 17-10 at ULM in 2014 and 36-29 in OT at Syracuse in 2011.

DEACON FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER

- Wake Forest is expected to start true freshman Sam Hartman at quarterback in the season-opener at Tulane on August 30. Hartman will be just the second true freshman quarterback in school history to start a season-opener. Recently-graduated John Wolford, a second-team All-ACC pick in 2017, started his first game on campus at ULM on Aug. 28, 2014.
- While Hartman will be the second true freshman quarterback to start a season-opener at Wake Forest, he's not the only true frosh signal-caller to become a starter.
- John Wolford started all 12 games in 2014, leading the Deacons to a 3-9 record. Tanner Price started nine games as a freshman in 2010, earning his first start in Week 3 at Stanford.
- In 2000, Anthony Young started five games for the Demon Deacons, earning his first start in Week 4. David Webber started seven games as a rookie in 1978, starting in Week 5.
- During the 1974 season, Wake Forest started a pair of true freshmen in Mike McGlamry (Weeks 3-6) and Solomon Everett (Weeks 7-9). Bill Armstrong, who would become an All-American at safety, started the final two games of his freshman season in 1973 at quarterback. Andy Carlton was the first Deacon true frosh to earn a start in 1972, starting Weeks 5-8.

2018 TRUE FRESHMAN QB'S

- Wake Forest's Sam Hartman will start at QB when the Demon Deacons open at Tulane on Thursday, Aug. 30.
- Four other FBS schools have announced true freshmen starting quarterbacks. Rutgers will go with Artur Sitkowski, Minnesota named Zack Annexstad, Nebraska named Adrian Martinez and USC announced JT Daniels.
- Hartman, Sitkowski and Annexstad all enrolled at their respective schools in January.
- Sitkowski and Annexstad both played at Florida's IMG Academy last fall.

FIRST PASS SUCCESS

- Plenty of eyes will be on Sam Hartman when he takes the field against Tulane and particularly on his first pass attempt.
- Three Wake Forest quarterbacks have thrown a touchdown pass on their first collegiate pass attempt.

- In 1972, Andy Carlton tossed a 49-yard TD pass to Richard Carter vs. NC State. In 1974, Mike McGlamry hit Tom Fehring with a 67-yard strike on his first collegiate attempt. Most recently, Ben Mauk connected with Jason Anderson on an 85-yard touchdown against Clemson in 2004.

QUARTERBACK LONGEVITY

- Since 2010, only one school in the nation has had fewer starting quarterbacks in the season-opener than Wake Forest. With freshman Sam Hartman slated to start against Tulane on Thursday in the season-opener, Hartman will become just the fourth opening day starter over the past nine seasons.
- Ted Stachitas started the opener in 2010 for the Demon Deacons before yielding to Tanner Price who started in 2011, 2012 and 2013.
- John Wolford started the season-opener for four straight years from 2014-17.
- Only Troy, with three different opening day starters, has fewer than Wake Forest.
- Wake Forest is tied with Duke, Missouri, Nebraska, Penn State, Syracuse and Western Kentucky for the second-fewest.

COLBURN LEADS THE PACK

- Senior RB Matt Colburn enters the season with 1,769 career rushing yards, ranking 15th in school history.
- Colburn needs 231 yards rushing to become the 12th Deacon to hit the 2,000-yard mark.
- The senior has led Wake Forest in rushing in each of the past two years.
- In 2017, he became the first Deacon with four 100-yard rushing games in a season since Chris Barclay in 2005.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

■ Colburn has a string of 340 consecutive carries without a fumble. The school record is 368 by Chris Barclay from Sept. 4, 2004 until Oct. 22, 2005.

DORTCH THE TORCH

■ Wake Forest's offense will be buoyed in 2018 by the return of WR/return specialist Greg Dortch. Dortch, a redshirt sophomore, was on a record-breaking pace in 2017 through the first eight games before missing the final five games due to an abdominal injury.

■ Dortch became the first Deacon in school history to catch a touchdown pass in each of his first four games.

■ He set a school record with four touchdown catches in a 42-32 win over Louisville, his final game of the season.

■ At the time of his injury, Dortch led all freshmen in the nation in touchdown receptions (9), receiving yards (722) and receiving yards per game (90.2) and was the national leader in receptions among freshmen at 53.

■ Dortch was named a Freshman All-American and earned two spots on the All-ACC team. He was second team All-ACC as the all-purpose back and third team as the return specialist.

ARBYS, WE HAVE THE BEEF (BOYS)

■ Wake Forest is one of 18 schools in FBS to return all five offensive line starters from 2017. Boston College is the only other ACC school with all five starters returning.

■ Wake Forest has 131 career starts returning this fall and ranks third nationally behind Wisconsin (150 career O-line starts) and Boston College (139).

■ The Deacons are led by LT Justin Herron (37 career starts), LG Phil Haynes (34), C Ryan Anderson (30), RT Jake Benzinger (14) and RG Patrick Osterhage (13).

■ Nate Gilliam (3 career starts) has also seen extensive action on the offensive line.

■ In 2017, the Beef Boys cut their sacks allowed by 49 percent, having allowed just 20 after yielding 39 in 2016.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

■ One of the indicators of the vast improvement of the Wake Forest offense under head coach Dave Clawson and offensive coordinator Warren Ruggiero has been the increase in explosive plays.

■ In 2014, Clawson's first season, Wake Forest had 44 explosive plays of 20 yards or longer with just 27 of them originating from the line of scrimmage.

■ In 2015, that number grew to 64 (54 from LOS) and in 2016, to 68 (43 from LOS).

■ In 2017, the Deacons had 122 explosive plays of 20 yards or longer with 81 on rushing and passing plays.

RETURNING RECEIVERS

■ Wake Forest returns 60 percent of its pass recipients from the 2017 team.

■ That club became the first in school history with four players to have 40 or more catches.

■ The major loss from 2017 was TE Cam Serigne who had 44 receptions.

■ The Deacons return Greg Dortch (53 catches) and Scotty Washington (45 catches).

HIT 'EM FOR A LOSS

■ Wake Forest finished the 2017 season with a school record 106 tackles for loss. The Deacon defense broke the previous record of 94 set in 2016.

■ The 106 tackles for loss resulted in a loss of 366 yards for opponents.

■ Wake Forest lost its top three TFL leaders to graduation following the 2017 season. The top TFL returners are LB Justin Strnad and DT Zeek Rodney who each had 8.5 tackles for loss last year.

BREAK IT UP, BASSEY

■ Wake Forest corner Essang Bassey had quite the sophomore campaign in 2017. Bassey tied the school record with 19 passes defended, including three interceptions and 16 pass break-ups.

■ An honorable mention All-ACC pick last year, Bassey was second in the league in passes defended.

■ After starting all 13 games, Bassey had three PBUs in the Belk Bowl and was named to ESPN's All-ACC Bowl team.

■ He has been named a third team preseason All-ACC pick by Athlon in 2018.

REPLACING THE DUKE

■ DE Duke Ejiofor graduated from Wake Forest following the 2017 season and was taken by his hometown Houston Texans in the 2018 NFL Draft.

■ During his career, Ejiofor accumulated 23.5 sacks and 43 tackles for loss.

■ Moving in to replace Ejiofor in 2018 is redshirt sophomore Carlos "Boogie" Basham. Basham had 24 total tackles and two tackles for loss in 2017.

STRNAD GETS THE NOD

■ The Deacons are replacing their two starting inside linebackers from 2017 in Jaboree Williams and Grant Dawson. The two seniors combined for 23.5 tackles for loss last year.

■ Justin Strnad, Wake Forest's leader in special teams tackles in 2017, has been tabbed as one of the starters inside in 2018.

■ Strnad tied for the team lead with three interceptions as a redshirt sophomore in 2017.

■ D.J. Taylor, a second-year sophomore who saw limited action in 2017, is expected to start alongside Strnad against Tulane.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE

- Grad transfer Eric Osteen graduated from West Point in 2013 and fulfilled his five-year commitment to the Army.
- Osteen filled a variety of roles including serving as a platoon leader, company executive officer and company logistics officer.
- Because he only played two years of football for the Black Knights, Osteen has a year of eligibility remaining. His last game was the 2012 Army-Navy game.
- At age 28, Osteen is the fourth-oldest player in the FBS this season. Colorado sophomore PK James Stefanou is 31; Maryland junior punter Wade Lees is 30, Houston junior punter Dane Roy is 29 and Osteen is fourth at 28.
- Osteen and his wife, Erin, live in Winston-Salem where she is an anesthesiology resident at Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center.

SPECIAL TEAMS ROUND-UP

- The only real question surrounding Wake Forest's special teams in preseason camp was the starting kicker. Heading into the opener at Tulane, the Deacons are listing freshman Nick Sciba ahead of redshirt freshman Zach Murphy for PAT and field goal duties.
- Wake Forest must replace four-year starter Mike Weaver who concluded his career second all-time in career points with 327. Weaver became the first Deacon to ever lead the ACC in kick scoring in 2017 when he accumulated 115 points. His 115 points eclipsed the school season scoring record of 111 set by the legendary Brian Piccolo in 1964.
- Junior Dom Maggio returns after earning honorable mention All-ACC honors in each of his first two seasons. Maggio has a 43.0 career average and has had the longest punt in the ACC in each of his first two seasons.
- Greg Dortch will likely fill both the kickoff and punt return slots in 2018. The redshirt junior averaged 8.1 yards on 20 punt returns last year to go with his 22.1 kickoff return average.
- Dayton Diemel is entrenched as the long snapper since taking over the starting role midway through the 2016 season.

BB&T FIELD 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- Wake Forest's BB&T Field will celebrate its 50th birthday in 2018. Opened in 1968 as Groves Stadium, the Demon Deacons have played 286 games and compiled a record of 127-155-4.
- BB&T Field has hosted two ACC Championship teams in the 1970 squad and the 2006 team.
- The first game was against NC State on Sept. 14, 1968. Wake Forest's first win at the stadium came on Oct. 26, 1968 with a 48-31 win over North Carolina.
- Wake Forest has gone undefeated at BB&T Field on two occasions, posting a 5-0 mark in 1979 and a 4-0 record in 1970. Three times Wake Forest has won five home games in a season: 1979, 2007 and 2008.
- Head coach Dave Clawson, with 12 wins in his first four seasons, needs three victories in 2018 to become the second-winningest coach at BB&T Field.

DEACS IN AUGUST

- The Demon Deacons are 5-4 all-time in games played in the month of August.
- Wake Forest is 2-2 all-time on the road in August, last losing 17-10 at ULM in 2014.
- The Deacs are 3-2 at home in August, last beating Presbyterian 51-7 in 2017.

CLAWSON YEAR 5

- Dave Clawson has assembled a remarkable record in his fourth year in his four head coaching positions.

- In Year 4, Clawson has posted a 36-16 record and a 23-9 conference mark and has led his team to a postseason victory in each of those years.
- Clawson is entering just his third Year 5 in 2018. In his two previous Year 5's, his teams have won at least nine games.
- Fordham, in 2003, went 9-3 while Bowling Green, in 2013, was 10-3 overall, 7-1 in the Mid-American Conference, won the MAC title and earned a bowl bid.

THREE TIMES ON THURSDAY

- Wake Forest will play three Thursday night games in 2018. The Deacons open at Tulane on Aug. 30, host Boston College on ESPN on Sept. 13 and visit NC State on Nov. 8, also on ESPN.
- This is a modern era record for non-Saturday games for the Deacons. In 1946, Wake Forest played three Friday games and a Thursday contest.

HOME COOKIN'

- Wake Forest will be at home for five straight weeks in September and early October.
- The Deacons open at BB&T Field on Sept. 8 against Towson. The next four weeks, Wake Forest hosts Boston College (Sept. 13), Notre Dame (Sept. 22), Rice (Sept. 29) and Clemson (Oct. 6).
- After an open date on Oct. 13, Wake Forest will play four of its final six games on the road.
- Wake Forest has played as many as four consecutive home games, most recently in 2004.
- Wake Forest's seven home games are the most since also playing seven in 2016.

- That streak also equates to the Deacons' only three-year stretch of consecutive bowl appearances.

DEACS "KICKING" IT OFF

- Wake Forest enters the 2018 season after having kicked off in 12 of 13 games in 2017.
- The Deacons won the toss eight times last year and opted to kick each time.
- In the five games that Wake Forest lost the coin toss, the opponent chose to receive four times and elected to have the Deacons receive once.

WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL

NAME GAME

- Two Deacons made name changes during the off-season. Redshirt freshman RB Christian Beal is now Christian Beal-Smith. Redshirt freshman OL Loic Nya is now Loic Ngassam Nya.
- Wake Forest has had a player with the last name Williams on every team since 2006. This year, the Deacs feature LB Ja'Cquez Williams and DL Tyler Williams.

2017 YEAR IN REVIEW

- In 2017, Wake Forest posted an 8-5 record, finished fourth in the ACC with a 4-4 record, and defeated Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl. The Demon Deacons have won back-to-back bowl games for just the second time in school history after having defeated Temple in the 2016 Military Bowl.
- Wake Forest set 105 school records with the majority of those on offense.
- On offense, the Deacons set school marks for the most points scored (459; 35.6 PPG), most total offense yards (6,055; 465.8 YPG), most touchdowns scored (57), most touchdown passes (33) and most bowl-eligible teams defeated (6).
- On defense, the most notable mark was a school record 106 tackles for loss.
- Key losses for the offense include QB John Wolford (2nd team All-ACC) and TE Cam Serigne (1st team All-ACC); PK Mike Weaver (2nd-all-time leading scorer with 327 points).
- On the defensive side of the ball, Jessie Bates III was drafted in the second round of the NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals while Duke Ejiofor was drafted by the Houston Texans in the sixth round.

DEACS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Seven of Wake Forest's 2018 opponents are receiving votes in the Amway Coaches Poll. They include Clemson (No. 2), Notre Dame (No. 11) and Florida State (No. 19), while Boston College, Louisville, NC State and Duke are all receiving votes.
- In the AP poll, Clemson is ranked second, Notre Dame is No. 12, Florida State is No. 19 and Boston College and NC State are receiving votes.
- The Deacs have won as many as three games vs. ranked opponents in a single season. In 1979, Wake Forest posted wins over No. 12 Georgia, No. 13 Auburn, and No. 14 North Carolina.
- The Deacons also won two games vs. ranked opponents in 1999 (No. 14 Georgia Tech, No. 25 NC State) and in 2006 (No. 16 Boston College, No. 22 Georgia Tech).

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

- Wake Forest's 12 opponents in 2017 compiled a composite record of 80-70 in 2017.
- The Deacs will face seven teams that went to a bowl game following the 2017 season, with NC State Florida State, Duke and Notre Dame all winning their respective bowl games.

- The Deacons edged Appalachian State before the Mountaineers shut out Toledo 34-0.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Wake Forest defeated Tulane 7-3 in the 2016 season opener at BB&T Field.

Quarterback Kendall Hinton rushed for the only touchdown of the night while fellow quarterback John Wolford finished 9-for-17 for 79 yards. Running back Matt Colburn finished the night with 29 yards receiving and 23 rushing yards.

The Deacons recorded four sacks on the night and seven tackles for a loss. Wake Forest blocked a Tulane field goal in the fourth quarter to hold Tulane to just three points for the game. Jessie Bates led Wake Forest with eight tackles including seven solo stops. The Demon Deacons had one turnover in the game with a forced fumble in the fourth quarter. Julian Jackson tallied five tackles including one solo sack and two half sacks and the forced fumble.

Tulane kicked a 41-yard field goal on its first possession of the game to take a 3-0 lead. The Deacons got on the board for the first time in the 2016 season with 14:16 left in the second quarter. Hinton converted a 4th-and-one as he scampered into the end zone. The drive was aided by a 13-yard run from Hinton down to the Tulane 11-yard line.

Wake Forest led 7-3 heading into the locker room at half-time. Tulane threatened early in the fourth quarter but was halted by a sack from Jackson and Duke Ejiofor. Chris Stewart blocked a Tulane 43-yard field goal attempt to keep it a 7-3 advantage for the Demon Deacons.

Tulane had a late possession in the red zone in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter. Glen Cuiellette attempted a rush on fourth down and was marked short. On the final possession of the game, Jackson forced a fumble which was recovered by Sheldon Lewinson.

Four may not be Dave Clawson's lucky number but perhaps it should be. Having recently completed his fourth season at Wake Forest, his fourth head coaching stop, Clawson seems to always strike gold in Year Four.

Clawson, who started his head coaching career at Fordham in 1999, took the Rams to a 10-3 record in his fourth year in The Bronx and a berth in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. Clawson started at Richmond in 2004 and had the Spiders at 11-3 and in the FCS semifinals in Year Four. At Bowling Green, Clawson's fourth season produced an 8-5 record and a berth in the Military Bowl. Year Four at Wake Forest as no less magical with the Deacons sitting at 8-5 following a thrilling 55-52 win over Texas A&M in the Belk Bowl in December.

For four seasons with the Demon Deacons, Clawson has preached strong defense and patience on offense. Year Four brought an avalanche of offense as his group of attackers, thrown into the fire in 2014 as youngsters, matured into a tenacious group that set school records for scoring and total offense.

The Demon Deacons set 105 records in 2017, tied another 15 marks, and became one of the nation's most efficient and productive offenses. Wake Forest set major records for points scored in a season, obliterating the record by 97 points. The offense set new marks for total offense yards in a game and in a season, yards per carry, most touchdowns scored and most touchdown passes in a season. The defense set a record with 106 tackles for loss.

But two records stand out: Wake Forest had 11 players selected for 12 All-ACC positions, and as a team, the Deacons beat six bowl teams in 2017.

The 2016 season marked year three in a career that has steadily shown vast improvement in year three. During his time at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, Clawson's year three teams averaged six wins. He exceeded that mark with seven victories in 2016.

With the 2016 addition of McCreary Field House, Wake Forest's state-of-the-art indoor practice facility, and the construction of the Sutton Sports Performance Center, which will mark yet another technologically advanced facility, Clawson and the Deacons are clearly on a roll.

On December 10, 2013, Clawson became the 32nd head football coach in Wake Forest University history. The head coach at Bowling Green State University from 2009 through 2013, Clawson led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

Clawson joined the Demon Deacons after five seasons as the head coach at BGSU in Bowling Green, Ohio. He built the Falcons to be explosive both offensively and defensively. The 2013 Bowling Green team ranked 29th in the nation in total offense and tenth in total defense. In 2012, BGSU was ranked sixth in the nation in total defense and 10th nationally in scoring defense, yielding just 16.8 points per game. The Falcons were one of only two non-power conference teams to rank in the top 30 statistically in both total offense and total defense in 2013.

Bowling Green's 2013 team went 10-3 overall under Clawson and won the MAC East title with a 7-1 record. The Falcons received a bid to the Little Caesar's Bowl in Detroit. It marked the third bowl appearance in five seasons for Clawson's team.

In his 18 years as a head coach, Clawson delivered a conference championship at each of his first three stops. Prior to the 2013 Mid-American Conference title at Bowling Green, Clawson helped Richmond to a pair of Colonial Athletic Association titles in 2005 and 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year awards.

He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. The 2007 CAA Coach of the Year award marked his fourth conference Coach of the Year honor in his first nine years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy. A native of Youngstown, N.Y., Clawson was a defensive back for Williams and went on to serve as a graduate assistant coach at Albany in 1989 and 1990. He moved to Buffalo for the 1991 and 1992 seasons, tutoring the secondary his first year and the quarterbacks and running backs his second.

In 1993, Clawson was named the running backs coach at Lehigh and helped the Mountain Hawks to a 7-4 record and the Patriot League championship. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1994 and spent two years in that role, adding another Patriot League title in 1995. Lehigh won a pair of Patriot League titles in his three years and his offense led the league in scoring, total offense and pass offense in each of his final two seasons.

Villanova hired Clawson as offensive coordinator in 1996 and his offense helped the Wildcats to NCAA FCS appearances in 1996 and 1997. During his tenure at Villanova, Clawson's offense established 70 program records, held the No. 1 ranking in the nation for six weeks in 1997 and won the 1997 Atlantic 10 championship. He tutored Brian Westbrook who became the first player in college football history to gain 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving.

Following the 1998 season, Clawson became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was named head coach at Fordham. Inheriting a team that had won just 22 games in the previous 10 years, Clawson turned the Rams into the Patriot League champions in his fourth season. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Clawson helped the Rams 2002 FCS Playoffs where they defeated fourth seed Northeastern in the opening round before falling to Villanova.

Clawson was named the head coach at Richmond prior to the 2004 season. He guided the Spiders to the biggest two-year turnaround in school history, improving from 3-8 in 2004 to 9-4 in 2005. In 2007, his final year with the Spiders, Clawson guided Richmond to an 11-3 record, the Colonial South title and the FCS national semifinals.

He left Richmond in 2008 to replace David Cutcliffe as the offensive coordinator under Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee. Following that season, Clawson was named the head coach at Bowling Green in time for the 2009 season.

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.

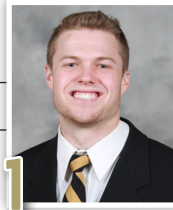

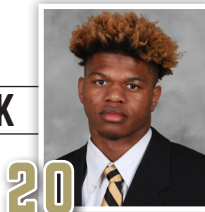

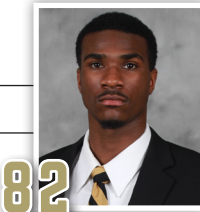
