Team Highlights

- With the loss, head coach Steve Forbes remains just one win away from career victory No. 300.
 - During his six seasons as a Division-I head coach, he has compiled an impressive mark of 133-44 (.751)
 - Forbes is now 1-1 against Georgia Tech
 - The last time a Steve Forbes led team traveled to Georgia Tech on Nov. 22, 2015 East Tennessee State walked out with a 69-68 victory over the Yellow Jackets.
- Wake Forest is now 16-11 in games played on Jan. 3.
- The 70 points scored for Georgia Tech were the second lowest it scored this season.
 - Wake Forest limited the Yellow Jackets to just 2-of-11 shooting from behind the arc in the second half.
- Wake Forest boasted the No. 8 scoring defense in the country heading into Sunday, allowing just an average of 57.7 points per game.
 - Through four games Wake Forest has allowed its opponents to score a combined 243 points:
 - vs. Delaware State (51)
 - vs. Longwood (60)
 - vs. Catawba (62)
 - at Georgia Tech (70)
- The Deacs ranked No. 3 in the nation with 12.3 steals per game coming into Sunday:
 - vs. Delaware State (20)
 - vs. Longwood (10)
 - vs. Catawba (7)
 - at Georgia Tech (9)
- Wake Forest ranked No. 3 in the nation with 21.3 turnovers forced per game coming into Sunday:
 - vs. Delaware State (25)

- vs. Longwood (24)
- vs. Catawba (15)
- at Georgia Tech (14)

Individual Highlights

- There are only six qualifying players in the country with a 100 percent free throw percentage. Jahcobi Neath is one of the six knocking down 12-of-12 free throws this season.
- Isaiah Mucius finished in double figures for the second-consecutive game, finishing the night with a career-high 21 points.
 - Sunday marked the 20th time in his career he has scored double-digit points.
 - His previous career-high was 19 points against Pittsburgh in the opening round of the 2020 ACC Tournament (March 10, 2020).
- Ody Oguama ended the night in double figures, posting his third double-digit scoring game of his collegiate career.
 - His 12 points are the second most in his career, four shy of his career-high 16 against Boston College (Jan. 19, 2020).
- Rookie Carter Whitt had a Wake Forest high-tying five rebounds, four points and two assists in his league-play debut.
