### Team Highlights

- With the loss, head coach Steve Forbes remains just one win away from career victory No. 300 and will look to reach the milestone on Wednesday at home in Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum against Louisville.
  - During his six seasons as a Division-I head coach, he has compiled an impressive mark of 133-46 (.743)
  - This afternoon was Coach Forbes' first time facing the Blue Devils and coaching inside the historic Cameron Indoor.
- Wake Forest is now 14-13 in games played on Jan. 9.
- Wake Forest had its best day at the free throw line this season, going 18-of-21 (.857 pct.) from the charity stripe
  - First half: 9-of-10
  - Second half: 9-of-11
- The Deacs ranked seventh in the nation with 10.0 steals per game coming into Saturday:

### **Individual Highlights**

- There are only six qualifying players in the country with a 100 percent free throw percentage. Jahcobi Neath is one of the eight knocking down 12-of-12 free throws this season.
- Junior forward Ismael Massoud posted a new career-high with 17 points on 5-of-10 from the field while also getting to the free throw line a team-high seven times, knocking down five of those attempts.
  - The East Harlem, N.Y. native also pulled down a career-high and team-high eight rebounds. No other Wake Forest player had more than three boards on the afternoon.
- Davien Williamson had his best game from the field as a Demon Deacon posting a season-high 17 points against the Blue Devils. The junior went 6-of-9 from the field and went a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line.
