THE MATCHUP

- The Wake Forest Demon Deacons are set to open the regular season at home Thursday night, hosting the UIC Flames in a non-conference matchup. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. at Spry Stadium.

LAST TIME OUT

- Wake Forest closed its preseason exhibition schedule with a 2-0 loss to the No. 17 South Carolina Gamecocks Thursday night at Spry Stadium.
 - The Deacs out-shot the Gamecocks by a 18-9 margin, but South Carolina was able to find the back of the net twice.
 - 11 different Deacs put shots on the board, but South Carolina keeper Heather Hinz saved all 11 shots she faced to preserve the clean sheet.
 - Graduate student Jenna Menta led Wake Forest's offensive attack with three shots, including one on target. Malaika Meena and Sophie Faircloth followed that up with two shots apiece.

SCOUTING THE FLAMES

- Grace Haines was named to the 2020-21 All-Horizon League Second Team. Brielle Gomez was an All-Freshman Team selection. Both defenders played every minute of the 2020-21 season. Gomez was second on the team with three assists. Haines had one assist.

- UIC had the fourth stingiest defense in the Horizon League in the 2020-21 regular season. They allowed only six goals last season. League leaders IUPUI and Milwaukee allowed three. The Flames' overall save percentage, .824, ranked fourth in the conference.

SERIES HISTORY

- It is the first-ever meeting between the programs, as well as UIC's first-ever match against an ACC squad.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Wake Forest's home stand continues Sunday, Aug. 22 as the High Point Panthers travel to Winston-Salem. Kickoff for that matchup is scheduled for 7 p.m. at Spry Stadium on ACC Network.

- A total of four Deacons have some form of National Team experience entering the 2021 season.
- RYANNE BROWN was a member of the U.S. U-17 National Team where she attended four camps and earned two caps.
- GIOVANNA DEMARCO participated in the U.S. U-19 National Team Training Camp in February 2018. She then traveled to Spain with the U-18 Women's National Team to play in the La Manga 12 Nations Tournament. She was later called to the May U-19 Camp.
- SHAYLA SMART has spent time with both the Jamaica U-17 and U-20 National Teams and was a 2016 and 2018 CONCACAF World Cup Qualifier. She then made her debut with the senior Jamaican National Team at the 2019 Pan-American Games.
- NIKAYLA SMALL selected for U17 Candian Youth Team against Mexico in 2019

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Since its opening in 1996, the Wake Forest women's soccer program has held a 163-71-21 advantage over opponents in W. Dennie Spry Stadium.
- Under da Luz, the program has a 146-56-18 record at home, including an 8-3-0 mark in 2017, an 8-2-1 record in 2018, and a 5-3-3 mark last year.

2020 -21 IN REVIEW

- The Demon Deacons finished the 2020 spring season with a 3-5-1 overall record. Wake Forest ended the first half of the schedule with a stong win over Pitt Panthers but However, Virginia Tech defeated Boston College to clinch the No. 8 seed to get into the ACC Championship, eliminating Wake Forest from postseason contention.

#PRODEACS

- Wake Forest currently has six Demon Deacons in the NWSL ranks,
- Aubrey Bledsoe is the reigning NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year and is with the Washington Spirit, and was also called up to the U.S. Soccer WNT training camp. She's joined in Washington by Bayley Feist.
- Katie Stengel made the move in the offseason to join the Houston Dash.
- Madison Hammond signed with the OL Reign before the summer season.
- Ally Haran (Orlando Pride) and Peyton Perea (NC Courage) have inked contracts for the fall campaign.
- Additionally, Sarah Teegarden (France), Vicky Krug (Germany) and Estelle Laurier (Germany) are competing overseas.

As head coach of the Wake Forest women's soccer team for 24 of the program's 25 seasons, Tony da Luz has built the Demon Deacons into an ACC and national powerhouse. Through 2018, he holds a 267-180-49 record at Wake Forest, with his 267 wins ranking fourth among current coaches at their respective ACC programs.

Da Luz is one of only 11 coaches in Wake Forest history across all sports to win 200 games at the helm of the Demon Deacons. Under da Luz's guidance, Wake Forest has earned a bid to the NCAA

Tournament in 20 seasons and to the ACC Tournament 20 times. In 2011 he achieved his greatest success to date, leading the Demon Deacons to their first-ever College Cup appearance.

Recent years have seen Wake Forest reach a new level of women's soccer prominence. The Deacons captured the 2010 ACC Championship, the first in the history of the program, and made a return trip to the ACC Tournament final in 2011. The 2012 Wake Forest squad finished in a tie for second place in the ACC standings, equaling the program's best-ever finish.

Wake Forest's success under da Luz has not only been limited to the conference level. In addition to their 18 straight NCAA Tournament appearances through 2015, the Deacons also advanced to at least the second round in eight straight seasons and have reached the NCAA Quarterfinals twice - culminating in the program's first College Cup in 2011.

Prior to Wake Forest, da Luz spent five seasons at San Diego, where he finished with a 45-41-3 record. Da Luz was entrusted with starting the San Diego program from the ground up in 1992 and in his final two seasons he guided his teams to a 25-13-2 mark.

Da Luz achieved success as a player as a midfielder and defender while at San Diego. He was an All-WCC honorable mention selection in both 1981 and 1982. As team captain in 1982, he led the Toreros in assists and earned the team MVP award. Da Luz earned his bachelor's degree in Business Administration from San Diego in 1985.
