Admiral Bruce DeMars passed away on 3 February in Falls Church, VA, at the age of 88 after a brief illness. DeMars was born in Chicago, IL, in 1935, and graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1957. After 44 years of service to his country, he retired in 1996. He was honored with many awards and decorations including the Distinguished Graduate Award in 2009.

The U.S. Naval Academy Computer Science Department hosted the 5th annual Jean Bartik Computing Symposium on 1-2 February. Named after Jean Bartik, one of the pioneering women who programmed the first generalpurpose electronic computer, the symposium highlighted the accomplishments of women and minorities in computing. The symposium was attended by 34 midshipmen, 14 cadets (U.S. Military Academy), 10 cadets (U.S. Air Force Academy), and 10 cadets (U.S. Coast Guard Academy).
