*How can we learn to hold on and live one day at a time?
You can begin by forgetting all shortcuts and magic cures.*

Faith should not be a burden or a puzzle. The more childlike it is, the better it works.

Happiness does not mean living without pain or hurt—not at all. True happiness is learning how to live one day at a time, in spite of sorrow and pain. It is learning how to rejoice in the Lord, no matter what has happened in the past.

Worshippers are not made during revivals, in the good, sunny times, or periods of victory and health. Worshippers of God are made during dark stormy nights. And how we respond to our storms determines just what kind of worshippers we are.

Faith is a gift, not a diploma.

Maybe you're in a storm right now. The wind is blowing hard, shaking you violently, and you think you're going down. Beloved, don't panic! You've got to know that in the midst of the tempest, you are putting down deep spiritual roots. God is developing in you a deepening humility, a greater mourning and sorrow for sin, a heightened hunger for His righteousness.

I will no longer worry or fret about issues that do not worry my Savior. By calling the Holy Spirit the Comforter, Jesus made an infallible prediction. He was predicting His people would be suffering discomfort, and would be in need of comfort—that there would be a lot of pain and suffering among His people in the last days.

God didn't promise you a painless way of life. He promised you "a way of escape." He promised to help you bear your pain. Strength to put you back on your feet when weakness makes you stagger.

The Christian life is not a life of clear sailing. Every believer is going to have bad days, no matter how holy he may be. Most Christians know Jesus isn't just a "good times only" savior. He is with us not only when things are going well, but during our bad days also. When hard times hit us, He doesn't disappear, saying, "I'll be back when you've got it all worked out." No, He's faithful and caring through every season.

God does not come down and do our living for us.

Being separate from this world is the greatest witness in this world today.

If you hunger and thirst for the fullness of Christ, Satan will declare outright war on you. It doesn't matter if our lives are spinning out of control—we are to walk in total confidence in the Lord. Even if things look hopeless, we are not to act in fear. Rather, we are to wait patiently on Him to deliver us, as His Word promises.

God is able to so invigorate you that you will have all you need, at all times.

What God asks of you may sound unreasonable. He asks that we trust Him when He gives no evidence of answering our prayer, when the situation seems hopeless and we are sure it is all over. “Trust me”—the Lord says. Illogical? Yes. But for centuries the Lord has proven He is always on time and He never allows Satan to have the last word. God always comes through—in perfect Holy Ghost timing.


Your heavenly Father watches over you with an unwavering eye. Every move is monitored. Every tear is bottled. He identifies with your every pain. He feels every hurt. He will never allow you to drown in your tears. He will not permit your hurt to deteriorate your mind. He promises to come, right on time, to wipe away your tears and give you joy for mourning.

Don’t worry about whether God is saying “Yes” or “No” to your request. Don’t be downcast when the answer is not in sight and, please, quit concentrating on faith formulas and methods. Just commit every prayer to Jesus and go about your business with confidence. He will not be one moment early or late in answering, and if the answer you seek is not forthcoming, say to your heart, “He is all I need. If I need more, He will not withhold it. He will answer in His time and in His way. And if He does not fulfill my request, He must have a perfect reason for not doing so. No matter what happens, I will always have faith in His faithfulness.”

Christians, you dare not stay up late at night and fret over conditions. Be aware and take all God’s warnings to heart. But after you have done all you can, then sit back, go to sleep, and trust God.

Nowhere in the Bible does God promise to keep us from problems. Never does He promise us a smooth ride in our job or career. Nor does He promise us exemption from affliction. In fact, He says: “Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the Lord delivereth him out of them all” (Psalm 34:19). This verse does not say God delivers us from afflictions, but out of them.

THE POWER OF PRAYER




Hope is the Christians security blanket. Wrap your self in hope and the cold blast of anxiety cannot chill your rest.

Prayer is not finished—it is not “completed prayer”—until it sees you through to the other side of your trial. We have not “prayed it through” until we have “lived it through” our trials by the strength we received in God’s presence.


Multitudes of Christians crisscross the country attending seminars and conventions with a “go to Egypt” mentality. They are networking, strategizing, borrowing worldly methods, and getting flesh-inspired counsel. In short, they are looking for any new thing that might excite them. But the praying servant who trusts God wholly knows he has no time for Egyptian concepts. The only place he runs is to his secret closet—where he gets His counsel on his knees.

All hell quakes at the effectual, fervent prayer of a single believer. The powerful praying of just one intercessor sounds like raging thunder in the caverns of the damned. Not one inch of space in hell remains unaffected by a believer who denies himself, takes up his cross, and follows Christ with his whole heart.

ABOUT DAVID WILKERSON

The whole strange adventure got its start one night as I sat in my study reading Life magazine. I merely turned a page, and at first glance it seemed there was nothing to interest me. The page showed a pen drawing of a trial taking place in New York City, 350 miles away from my home in rural Pennsylvania. I'd never been to New York, and I'd never wanted to go, except perhaps to see the Statue of Liberty.

I started to flip the page over. But as I did, something caught my eye. It was the eyes of a figure in the drawing - a boy. He was one of seven boys on trial for murder. I held the magazine closer to get a better look. The artist had captured a look of bewilderment, hatred and despair in the young boy's features. Suddenly, I began to cry.

The story revolted me. It literally turned my stomach. In our little mountain town, such things seemed mercifully unbelievable. Yet I was dumbfounded by the next thought that sprang into my head. It came to me full-blown, as if from somewhere else: Go to New York and help those boys.

The thought startled me. "I'd be a fool to do that," I reasoned. "I know nothing about kids like these. And I don't want to know anything."

It was no use. The idea wouldn't go away. I was to go to New York. And I was to do it at once, while the trial was still in progress.

As told from the best-selling book, *The Cross and the Switchblade*, this trip to New York in 1958 changed David Wilkerson's life forever. David Wilkerson's burden for the lost of the city increased and gave birth to the ministry of Teen Challenge — a nationwide ministry to reach out to people with life controlling habits. Later, to continue to minister the love of God, David Wilkerson would start World Challenge, Inc. and become the founding pastor of Times Square Church in New York City.
